# **POVOROTNOYE LICENSE AND JAA UPDATE**

Aleator Energy Limited (ASX: **AWD**) ("**Aleator**" or "**the Company**") is pleased to advise that it has received correspondence from LLC Nadra Kryma confirming:

- that LLC Nadra Kryma has been nationalised in accordance with formal Resolution (№
  1926-6/14) of the State Council of the Republic of Crimea and now operates under the
  Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources of the Republic of Crimea;
- that interim special permits for subsoil use (licences), including the Povorotnoye licence have been issued and will remain valid until 1 January 2015 in accordance with Resolution (№ 205) of the Council of Ministers of the Republic of Crimea; and,
- that renewal of subsoil use permits (licences) will be made by the granting permission authority within 30 days from receiving documents requesting extension of the permit.

With the new regulatory authorities in place, Aleator is progressing the re-registration of its local subsidiary Pivdenspetsbud in the Republic of Crimea. Once this has been completed, the Company will work with its Joint Activity Agreement partner Nadra Kryma, to make an application for the extension of the Povorotnoye special permit for subsoil use (licence).
