Appendix 4C & Progress Update - 1st Qtr FY15

In lodging the Appendix 4C - quarterly (attached), Gage Roads Brewing Co Ltd (ASX: GRB) is pleased to report to the market on the ongoing progress of the Company.

Q1 FY15 Highlights

- Total sales volume up 16% on prior year comparative period to 416k carton equivalents*
- Sales to Woolworths and other contract brewing customers up 22% and 30% respectively
- New Gage Roads proprietary products launched and brand refresh complete
- Warehousing strategy executed

Sales Results

Sales across the portfolio have improved by 16% over the prior year comparative period ("PYCP"). The Company's production of Woolworth's exclusive brand increased by 22% over PYCP. Sales were particularly strong in our other contract brewing segment, recording an uplift of 30% over PYCP.

Draught sales for the guarter were below expectations as a result of significant price competition in the low-value mainstream draught beer market. This has impacted our historically largest selling draught product competing in that segment. The Company is adjusting its draught sales strategy to concentrate on growing draught craft beer sales, supporting our and our contract customer's craft brands and driving off-premise carton sales.

Sale of Gage Roads' proprietary brands declined 13% over the same period last year. The decline is partially due to depletion of existing products on shelves in anticipation of the release of the refreshed Gage Roads products (as further discussed below). The refresh is expected to reverse this trend and provide a significant contribution to the Company's growth expectations.

Marketing Update

The Company has just released its new line of products, Narrow Neck Session Ale, South Beach Summer Ale and Breakwater Pale Ale. The refreshed Atomic Pale Ale, Sleeping Giant IPA, Small Batch Lager and Wahoo Summer Ale have also been finalised and will be available on shelves in the coming weeks in time for summer. The refresh delivers on its goals to rediscover Gage Roads' craft brewing credentials and communicate them to consumers, to ground the brand in a sense-of-place, unify the products into a branded family and ultimately create a platform for future sales growth and

increased brand value. This provides Gage Roads the opportunity to strengthen its position as Australia's 4th largest craft brand and further take advantage of the growing craft beer market.

Operations update

During the first quarter FY15 the business has begun to execute its warehousing strategy with a view to move from a 100% just-in-time production system to holding an inventory of buffer stock and raw materials. A suitable site has been found and secured and is located less than 2km from the existing brewery plant. A lease over 2,200 m² has been signed for FY 2015 expanding to 4,400 m² for the following years. Tenure via options extends to 2024.

The benefits of this warehouse include a reduced likelihood of loss of sales resulting from forecasting errors, planned maintenance or breakdowns. Increased raw material compliance and larger packaging runs are also expected to provide greater production efficiencies. Larger pack runs and improved operational efficiencies allow for a change in shift structure, from 24/7 to 24/5, providing ongoing cost benefits. An additional benefit is the ability to undertake weekly scheduled preventative maintenance during the weekends to de-risk our production capabilities over the coming summer months.

Cash Flow and Balance Sheet

During the quarter the Company applied available free cash and debt capital towards improving our current account balance, resulting in the repayment of creditors. This, combined with an increase in accounts receivable caused a net negative operating cash flow for the quarter. The focus of the Company over the near future is to continue to improve its working capital balance sheet position.

Investing cash flows have been reduced to \$591k in current quarter. These cash outflows relate primarily to previously negotiated trailing payment plans for installed equipment and our continuous improvement program.

The Company has a \$9.7m debt facility which is drawn to \$8.1m and a \$2m overdraft facility which is currently undrawn.

Outlook for Q2 FY15

Q2 FY15 marks the one of the peak production periods for the year. The Company is expected to be producing at close to capacity during those months. Managing Director John Hoedemaker said:

"The upcoming summer demand will provide an exciting challenge for the business. With our warehousing strategy being put in place, I feel that the business is well-positioned to meet this challenge. Our strategic partnership with Woolworths remains strong, demand from our other contract brewing customers continues to grow and the Company's proprietary brands are now well-positioned. I am proud of the new products that the team has created and the way in which our existing products have been refreshed. Initial feedback has been very positive and I expect this response to translate into growing sales for our proprietary products and ultimately deliver FY15 earnings to shareholders in line with our long-term strategic plan."
