FTA DRILL PERMIT GRANTED FOR NE AREA - RIQUEZA

IN THIS ANNOUNCEMENT

A brief description of the granting of the FTA drill permit and next steps in terms of permitting

HIGHLIGHTS

Inca Minerals Limited (Inca or the Company) is pleased to announce that it's Ficha Técnica Ambiental (FTA) drill permit has been granted by Peru's Ministry of Energy and Mines (MINEM). This represents a very material step forward in the pre-drilling permit process. The Company will now lodge applications for its Water Permit and Certificate to Commence Work (also known as an Exploration Permit).

More details will follow concerning the commencement of drilling. The Company will take the opportunity to reiterate the nature and objective of the proposed 6,070m diamond-core program, which has been fully described (and unchanged) in previous ASX announcements.
