New Partnership formed for CULTURAL HERITAGE MANAGEMENT IN SOUTHEAST **CAPE YORK PENINSULA**

Highlights:

- K2fly, The Keeping Place and Griffith University partner to deliver new cultural heritage solution to map ancient rock art in Cape York Peninsula
- Five-year project involves six universities, working with eight industry partners, which include six discrete Aboriginal corporations, a State government agency, and a private business.

Further to the update on 29 March 2021 K2fly Limited (ASX: K2F) (K2fly or the Company) advises that it has contracted with Griffith University to deliver a new system for Aboriginal rock art and cultural heritage management in the sandstone country of southeast Cape York Peninsula. K2fly will work with its long-term cultural heritage partner The Keeping Place, to deliver the solution for Griffith University and its project stakeholders.

The Laura Sandstone Basin of Cape York Peninsula hosts one of the richest bodies of rock art in Australia and the world. It documents the lifeways of generations of Aboriginal Australians from their original settlement, through major environmental changes, to European invasion. This vast area, much of which is now jointly managed as National Parks by Traditional Owners, remains virtually unexplored archaeologically. This project aims to record this unique rock art so that its testimony remains for future generations. This will provide a framework for its sustainable management and findings will have profound implications for our understandings of the cultural behaviour and dispersal of the earliest modern humans to colonise Australia.

The Keeping Place was created for native title organisations, Indigenous ranger programs and organisations operating within the Indigenous information and land management sector within Australia. It is a cloudbased solution to digitally protect and share cultural knowledge. It is also a complete business tool, helping Traditional Owner groups protect their rights and interests in land.

All data deriving from this project will have varying levels of permission. The project is set up so that these permissions will be negotiated up front as part of the consultation process. This will include ways and forms in which communities (including the different Aboriginal groups) would like their cultural information to be managed, used, and returned to them.

The inaugural Steering Committee meeting for the project will be held in April 2021 and the project will run for five years. It will involve six universities, working with eight industry partners, which include six discrete Aboriginal corporations, a State government agency, and a private business. The K2fly Board acknowledges its importance to traditional owners and stakeholder groups in cultural heritage.
