Quarterly Activity Report to March 2021

Eneco Refresh Ltd is pleased to provide a review for the nine months ended March 2021.

A breakdown of revenue for the period by Cash Generating Units is presented below. Refresh Waters has continued to do well, with an 8% increase in sales compared to the same period last year. Sales growth at Refresh Plastics has achieved a creditable 25% year-to-date, although growth has slowed. Overall, growth has increased by 12%.

Refresh Waters

Sales in Western Australia improved, reducing its negative variance from the first half year. New South Wales has had a positive variance because of a pick up in our custom labelled bottled water division. As business activity returns to normal, promotional spending has started to increase. Victoria continued to do well, with its increase coming mainly from its sale of commercial distilled water. Northern Territory sales has increased significantly, although growth slowed because of heavy flooding in several places. Queensland achieved good growth at 7% which we foresee will continue.



Refresh Plastics

Refresh Plastics had a marginal increase in the third quarter, resulting in growth dropping from 38% in the first half year. This is partly because we no longer sell Petainer one-way PET kegs. However overall, it has outperformed sales compared to this time last year, at 25%.
