DIRECTORS' REPORT

Your directors present their report on Superior Resources Limited ("Superior" or "the Company") and the entities it controlled (referred to hereafter as "the Group" or "the consolidated entity") for the half-year ended 31 December 2021.

The following persons were directors of Superior Resources Limited during the half-year and up to the date of this report. Directors were in office for the entire period unless otherwise stated.

Results and review of operations

The operating loss after income tax of the consolidated entity for the half-year was \$360,544 (2020: loss \$333,648).

The reported losses reflect the nature of the consolidated entity's principal activity, being mineral exploration.

During the half year period the principal activity of the Group was exploration for gold, copper-gold and nickel-copper-PGE deposits in northern Queensland, Australia. There were no significant changes in the nature of the company's activities during the reporting period.

- Greenvale Project (porphyry copper, gold and nickel-cobalt)
 - Completed a 13,000m drilling campaign at the Steam Engine Gold Deposit and Bottletree Copper Prospect.
 - Completed a ground magnetometer survey over the Steam Engine Prospect area.
 - Completed field geological mapping of Steam Engine Prospect new extension areas, including Windmill East and Origin gold lode zones.
 - Progressed a Scoping Study on the Steam Engine Gold Deposit on the basis of a potential toll treatment operation.
 - Commenced an interim Steam Engine strategy study.
 - Progressing a Mining Lease application for the Steam Engine Project.
 - Completed a technical study and established an Exploration Target in respect of the Wyandotte Copper Deposit.
 - o Progressed a technical study on the Cockie Creek Copper Deposit.
 - Completed field geological mapping of the Bottletree Copper Prospect area.
 - Completed a large soil geochemical survey over the Bottletree Copper Prospect.
 - Progressing mineralogical, mineralisation and structural studies on Bottletree drill core.
 - Commenced porphyry copper-gold potential study over the entire Greenvale Project area.

Corporate – Commercial

- The Company completed a capital raising via a private placement to sophisticated investors on 16 September 2021. Under the capital raising, 119,818,096 fully paid ordinary shares in the Company were issued at an issue price of \$0.0105 per new share to raise \$1,258,090 before costs.
- During the half year 75,721,286 options were exercised raising \$454,328 additional capital.

DIRECTORS' REPORT

Matters subsequent to reporting date

The Company completed a capital raising via a private placement to sophisticated and institutional investors on 8 February 2022. Under the capital raising, 118,421,053 fully paid ordinary shares in the Company were issued at an issue price of \$0.038 per new share to raise \$4,500,000 before costs.

10 million unlisted options with an exercise price of 8 cents and expiring on 31 August 2023 were issued to the lead manager of the capital raising.

There are no other matters or circumstances that have arisen since 31 December 2021 that have significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Group, the results of those operations or the state of affairs of the Group in future financial years.

NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

Note 1 General Information

Superior Resources Limited (the **Company**) is a company limited by shares, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. The Company's shares are listed on the Australian Securities Exchange.

The financial statements are for the Group consisting of Superior Resources Limited and its subsidiaries (the **consolidated entity** or the **Group**).

There have been no significant changes in the nature of the principal activities of the Group during the half year.

Note 2 Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Statement of compliance

The half-year financial report is a general purpose financial report prepared in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* and AASB 134 'Interim Financial Reporting'. Compliance with AASB 134 ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standard IAS 34 'Interim Financial Reporting'. The Group is a for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing this report.

This half-year financial report does not include all the notes of the type normally included in an Annual Financial Report and therefore cannot be expected to provide as full an understanding of the financial position and financial performance of the Group as the Annual Financial Report. As a result, this report should be read in conjunction with the 30 June 2021 Annual Financial Report of the Group and any public announcements made in the period by the Group in accordance with the continuous disclosure requirements of the Corporations Act 2001 and the ASX Listing Rules.

The financial statements were approved and authorised for issue by the Directors on 14 March 2022.

(b) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention, as modified where applicable by the revaluation of financial assets and liabilities at fair value through other comprehensive income.

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of the half-year financial statements are consistent with those of the previous financial year and corresponding interim reporting period.

NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2021

Note 3 Application of New and Revised Accounting Standards

The consolidated entity has adopted all the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period. There has been no material impact on the financial statements by their adoption and therefore no material changes to the Company's accounting policies are necessary.

Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been adopted. The potential financial impact of these changes is not yet possible to determine.

Note 4 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Critical judgements in applying the entity's accounting policies

The Group has capitalised exploration expenditure of \$8,111,097 (30 June 2021: \$6,065,340). These amounts include costs directly associated with exploration. These costs are capitalised as an intangible asset until assessment of the permit is complete and the results have been evaluated. These costs include employee remuneration, materials, rig costs, delay rentals and payments to contractors. The expenditure is carried forward until such a time as the asset moves into the development phase, is abandoned or sold. Given exploration activities have not yet reached a stage which permits a reasonable assessment of the existence or otherwise of recoverable resources and the difficulty in forecasting cash flows to assess the fair value of exploration expenditure there is uncertainty as to the carrying value of exploration expenditure. The ultimate recovery of the carrying value of exploration expenditure is dependent upon the successful development and commercial exploitation or, alternatively, sale of the interest in the tenements.

Note 5 Going Concern

Notwithstanding that the Group incurred an operating loss after tax of \$360,544 (2020: loss of \$333,848) and had net cash outflows from operating activities of \$487,853 (2020: outflow of \$182,074), these financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which assumes continuity of normal business activities and the realisation of assets and the settlement of liabilities in the ordinary course of business.

The ability of the consolidated entity to continue as a going concern is dependent upon one or more of the following:

- achieving sufficient future cash flows from operations to enable its obligations to be met;
- the success of cost saving initiatives, which include entering into Joint Venture arrangements and reducing tenement areas, so as to reduce the carrying and expenditure costs for tenements;
- cash flows from the sale of any of the Group's assets; and
- · obtaining additional funding from capital raising activities.

The Directors acknowledge that to continue the exploration and development of the Group's exploration projects, the budgeted cash flows from operating and investing activities for the future will necessitate further capital raisings.

The Directors are confident of being able to secure additional funding and believe the entity is a going concern and will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due and payable.

At the date of this report and having considered the above factors, the Directors are confident that the Group will be able to continue as a going concern.

Note 5 Going Concern (continued)

In the event that the Group is unable to satisfy future funding requirements, a material uncertainty would arise that may cast significant doubt on the Group's ability to continue as a going concern with the result that the Group may be required to realise its assets at amounts different from those currently recognised, settle liabilities other than in the ordinary course of business and make provisions for costs which may arise as a result of cessation or curtailment of normal business operations.

The Group operates solely within one segment, being the mineral exploration industry in Australia.

 December 2021 and of its performance for the half year ended on that date; and
- b) complying with Australian Accounting Standard 134 *Interim Financial Reporting* and the *Corporations Regulations 2001*.

Material Uncertainty Related to Going Concern

We draw attention to Note 5 in the financial report, which indicates that the Group incurred a net loss after tax of \$360,544 during the half year ended 31 December 2021 and had net cash outflows from operating activities of \$487,853. These events or conditions, along with other matters as set forth in Note 5, indicate that a material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt on the Group's ability to continue as a going concern. Our conclusion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Basis for Conclusion

We conducted our review in accordance with ASRE 2410 Review of a Financial Report Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity. Our responsibilities are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Review of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including Independence Standards) (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the annual financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.
