Notice is hereby given that the annual general meeting of shareholders of GCX Metals Limited (**Company**) will be held at Conference Room, Ground Floor, 28 The Esplanade, Perth WA 6000 on Tuesday, 15 November 2022 at 11:00am (AWST) (**Meeting**).

The Directors have determined pursuant to regulation 7.11.37 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001* (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered as Shareholders on Sunday, 13 November 2022 at 5:00pm (AWST).

The Company advises that a poll will be conducted for all Resolutions.

Terms and abbreviations used in this Notice (including the Explanatory Memorandum) are defined in Schedule 1.

1 Annual Report

To consider the Annual Report of the Company and its controlled entities for the year ended 30 June 2022, which includes the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Auditor's Report.

2 Resolution 1 – Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

'That, pursuant to and in accordance with section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given by the Shareholders for the adoption of the Remuneration Report on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

Voting Exclusion

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast:

- (a) by or on behalf of a member of the Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such member, regardless of the capacity in which the vote is cast; or
- (b) by a person appointed as a proxy, where that person is either a member of the Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such member.

However, a vote may be cast by such persons if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person who is excluded from voting on this Resolution, and:

- (a) the person is appointed as a proxy that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the person is the Chairman and the appointment of the Chairman as proxy does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution, but expressly authorises the Chairman to exercise the proxy even if this Resolution is connected with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

3 Resolution 2 – Re-Election of Mr Ian Middlemas as Director

'That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 14.4, Article 7.3(c) of the Constitution and for all other purposes, Mr Ian Middlemas, Director, retires and being eligible for re-appointment, is re-elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

4 Resolution 3 – Election of Mr Benjamin Cleary as Director

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

'That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 14.4, Article 7.3(i) of the Constitution and for all other purposes, Mr Benjamin Cleary, Director, who was appointed as a Director on 16 June 2022, retires and being eligible pursuant to Article 7.3(i) of the Constitution, is elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum'

5 Resolution 4 – Election of Mr Haydn Smith as Director

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

'That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 14.4, Article 7.3(i) of the Constitution and for all other purposes, Mr Haydn Smith, Director, who was appointed as a Director on 16 June 2022, retires and being eligible pursuant to Article 7.3(i) of the Constitution, is elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

6 Resolution 5 – Election of Mr Ryan de Franck as Director

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

'That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 14.4, Article 7.3(i) of the Constitution and for all other purposes, Mr Ryan de Franck, Director, who was appointed as a Director on 16 June 2022, retires and being eligible pursuant to Article 7.3(i) of the Constitution, is elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

7 Resolution 6 – Approval of 10% Placement Facility

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as a special resolution the following:

'That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the issue of Equity Securities of up to 10% of the issued capital of the Company (at the time of the issue) calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

Voting Exclusion

The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of this Resolution by or on behalf of a person (and/or their nominee(s)) who is expected to participate in the proposed issue or who will obtain a material benefit as a result of the proposed issue (except a benefit solely by reason of being a holder of Shares), or any associates of those persons.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of a resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the resolution, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the resolution that way; or
- (b) the Chairman of the Meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chairman to vote on the resolution as the Chairman decides; or

- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Note: As at the date of this Notice, it is not known who may participate in any Equity Securities issued under Resolution 6 and the Company has not approached any Shareholder or identified a class of existing Shareholders to participate in any issue of Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity. Accordingly, no Shareholders are excluded from voting on Resolution 6.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

1 Introduction

This Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared for the information of Shareholders in connection with the business to be conducted at the Meeting.

This Explanatory Memorandum should be read in conjunction with and forms part of the Notice. The purpose of this Explanatory Memorandum is to provide information to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

This Explanatory Memorandum includes the following information to assist Shareholders in deciding how to vote on the Resolutions:

A Proxy Form is located at the end of this Explanatory Memorandum.

2 Action to be taken by Shareholders

Shareholders should read the Notice including this Explanatory Memorandum carefully before deciding how to vote on the Resolutions.

The Company advises that a poll will be conducted for all Resolutions.

2.1 Proxies

A Proxy Form is attached to the Notice. This is to be used by Shareholders if they wish to appoint a representative (a 'proxy') to vote in their place. All Shareholders are invited and encouraged to attend the Meeting or, if they are unable to attend in person, sign and return the Proxy Form to the Company in accordance with the instructions thereon. Returning the Proxy Form will not preclude a Shareholder from attending and voting at the Meeting in person.

Please note that:

- (a) a member of the Company entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy;
- (b) a proxy need not be a member of the Company; and
- (c) a member of the Company entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. Where the proportion or number is not specified, each proxy may exercise half of the votes.

Proxy Forms must be received by the Company no later than 11:00am (AWST) on Sunday, 13 November 2022, being at least 48 hours before the Meeting

The Proxy Form provides further details on appointing proxies and lodging Proxy Forms.

2.2 Voting Prohibition by Proxy holders (Remuneration of Key Management Personnel)

A vote on Resolution 1 must not be cast:

- (a) by or on behalf of a member of the Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such member, regardless of the capacity in which the vote is cast; or
- (b) by a person appointed as a proxy, where that person is either a member of the Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such member.

However, a vote may be cast by such persons if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person who is excluded from voting on this Resolution, and:

- (a) the person is appointed as a proxy that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the person is the Chairman and the appointment of the Chairman as proxy does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution, but expressly authorises the Chairman to exercise the proxy even if this Resolution is connected with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

2.3 Attendance at Meeting

To vote in person, Shareholders are able to attend the Meeting at the time, date and place set out above. Based on the best information available to the Board at the time of the Notice, the Board considers it will be in a position to hold an 'in-person' meeting to provide Shareholders with a reasonable opportunity to participate in and vote at the Meeting. If it becomes necessary or appropriate to make alternative arrangements to those detailed in this Notice, Shareholders will be updated via the ASX announcements platform and on the Company's website at <https://www.gcxmetals.com.au>

3 Annual Report

In accordance with section 317(1) of the Corporations Act, the Annual Report must be laid before the annual general meeting. There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report.

At the Meeting, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to:

- (a) discuss the Annual Report which is available online at <https://www.gcxmetals.com.au>;
- (b) ask questions about, or comment on, the management of the Company; and
- (c) ask the auditor questions about the conduct of the audit and the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report.

In addition to taking questions at the Meeting, written questions to the Chairman about the management of the Company, or to the Company's auditor about:

- (a) the preparation and the content of the Auditor's Report;
- (b) the conduct of the audit;
- (c) accounting policies of the Company in relation to the preparation of the financial statements; and
- (d) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit,

may be submitted no later than five business days before the Meeting to the Company Secretary at the Company's registered office.

4 Resolution 1 – Remuneration Report

In accordance with section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, the Company must put the Remuneration Report to the vote of Shareholders. The Directors' Report contains the Remuneration Report which sets out the remuneration policy for the Company and the remuneration arrangements in place for the executive Directors, specified executives and non-executive Directors.

In accordance with section 250R(3) of the Corporations Act, Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Directors of the Company. If Resolution 1 is not passed, the Directors will not be required to alter any of the arrangements in the Remuneration Report.

Shareholders will have the opportunity to remove the whole Board except the Managing Director if the Remuneration Report receives a 'no' vote of 25% or more (**Strike**) at two consecutive annual general meetings.

Where a resolution on the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at two consecutive annual general meetings, the Company will be required to put to Shareholders at the second annual general meeting a resolution on whether another meeting should be held (within 90 days) at which all Directors (other than the Managing Director) who were in office at the date of approval of the applicable Directors' Report must stand for re-election.

The Company's Remuneration Report did not receive a Strike at the 2021 annual general meeting. Please note if the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at this Meeting and if a second Strike is received at the 2022 annual general meeting, this may result in the re-election of the Board.

The Chairman will allow reasonable opportunity for Shareholders to ask questions about or comment on the Remuneration Report.

Resolution 1 is an ordinary resolution.

The Chairman intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 1.

If the Chairman is appointed as your proxy and you have not specified the way the Chairman is to vote on Resolution 1, by signing and returning the Proxy Form, you are considered to have provided the Chairman with an express authorisation for the Chairman to vote the proxy in accordance with the Chairman's intention, even though the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

5 Resolution 2 – Re-Election of Mr Ian Middlemas as Director

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer. However, a director appointed to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the board must not hold office (without re-election) past the next annual general meeting of the entity. This rule does not apply to the managing director.

Article 7.3(b) of the Constitution provides that a Director must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the Director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer.

Article 7.3(c) of the Constitution requires that one third of the Directors must retire at each AGM (rounded down to the nearest whole number), excluding the Managing Director.

Article 7.3(f) of the Constitution states that a Director retiring from office under Article 7.3(b) or Article 7.3(c) of the Constitution is eligible for re-election.

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 14.4 and Article 7.3(b) of the Constitution, Resolution 2 provides that Mr Ian Middlemas retires by rotation and seeks re-election as a Director.

Mr Middlemas is a Chartered Accountant, a member of the Financial Services Institute of Australasia and holds a Bachelor of Commerce degree. He worked for a large international Chartered Accounting firm before joining the Normandy Mining Group where he was a senior group executive for approximately 10 years. He has had extensive corporate and management experience and is currently a Director with a number of publicly listed companies in the resources sector.

Mr Middlemas was appointed as a Director of the Company on 16 October 2013 and as Chairman on 7 January 2014. During the three year period to the end of the financial year, Mr Middlemas has held directorships in Constellation Resources Limited (November 2017 – present), Apollo Minerals Limited (July 2016 – present), Berkeley Energia Limited (April 2012 – present), GreenX Metals Limited (August 2011 – present), Salt Lake Potash Limited (Administrators Appointed) (Receivers and Managers Appointed) (January 2010 – present), Equatorial Resources Limited (November 2009 – present), Peregrine Gold Limited (September 2020 – February 2022), Piedmont Lithium Limited (September 2009 – December

2020), Sovereign Metals Limited (July 2006 – present), Odyssey Gold Limited (September 2005 – present) and Cradle Resources Limited (May 2016 – July 2019).

If Resolution 2 is passed, Mr Middlemas will be a Director of the Company, subject to retirement, for the next three years.

If Resolution 2 is not passed, Mr Middlemas will cease to be a Director of the Company.

If Resolutions 2, 3, 4 and/or 5 are not passed, such that the Company does not have a minimum of 3 directors, the remaining directors and/or the Company at a general meeting of Shareholders will appoint the number of additional directors following the meeting to ensure that the Company has a minimum of 3 directors.

Resolution 2 is an ordinary resolution.

The Chairperson intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 2.

Director recommendation

The Board (excluding Mr Ian Middlemas) unanimously supports the re-election of Mr Ian Middlemas as a Director and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

6 Resolution 3 – Election of Mr Benjamin Cleary as Director

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer. However, a director appointed to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the board must not hold office (without re-election) past the next annual general meeting of the entity. This rule does not apply to the managing director.

Article 7.3(i) of the Constitution provides that a Director appointed under Article 7.2(b) may retire at the next general meeting of the Company and is eligible for election at that meeting.

Mr Benjamin Cleary was appointed as a Non-Executive Director pursuant to Article 7.2(b) of the Constitution on 16 June 2022.

Accordingly, Mr Benjamin Cleary will retire as a Director at the Meeting and, being eligible, seeks to be elected as a Director.

Mr Cleary is a Portfolio Manager and Director of Tribeca Investment Partners and is based in Singapore. He has had an extensive career in the natural resources sector over the last 20 years and the Tribeca Global Natural Resources strategies that he manages have been involved in over \$10 billion of transactions within the natural resources sector. Mr Cleary holds a Bachelor of Economics from the University of Queensland, a Graduate Diploma in Applied Finance from FINSIA and is a member of the Australian Institute of the Company Directors.

Mr Cleary was appointed as a Director of the Company on 16 June 2022. During the three year period to the end of the financial year, Mr Cleary has held directorships in Tribeca Global Natural Resources Limited (July 2018 – present) and DGR Global Limited (October 2017 – January 2021).

If Resolution 3 is passed, Mr Cleary will be a Director of the Company, subject to retirement, for the next three years.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, Mr Cleary will cease to be a Director of the Company.

If Resolutions 2, 3, 4 and/or 5 are not passed, such that the Company does not have a minimum of 3 directors, the remaining directors and/or the Company at a general meeting of Shareholders will appoint the number of additional directors following the meeting to ensure that the Company has a minimum of 3 directors.

Resolution 3 is an ordinary resolution.

The Chairperson intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 3.

Director recommendation

The Directors (excluding Mr Benjamin Cleary) support the election of Mr Benjamin Cleary as a Director and recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

7 Resolution 4 – Election of Mr Haydn Smith as Director

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer. However, a director appointed to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the board must not hold office (without re-election) past the next AGM of the entity. This rule does not apply to the managing director.

Article 7.3(i) of the Constitution provides that a Director appointed under Article 7.2(b) may retire at the next general meeting of the Company and is eligible for election at that meeting

Mr Haydn Smith was appointed as a Non-Executive Director pursuant to Article 7.2(b) of the Constitution on 16 June 2022.

Accordingly, Mr Haydn Smith will retire as a Director at the Meeting and, being eligible, seeks to be elected as a Director.

Mr Haydn Smith is a Portfolio Manager at Tribeca Investment Partners and is based in Sydney. Previously Mr Smith had a 20-year career at Macquarie Bank where he was an Executive Director, Global Head of the bank's Mining Finance Group and Executive Committee Member of the Commodities and Financial Markets Group. Mr Smith holds a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of Sydney, a Graduate Diploma in Applied Finance from the FINSIA and is a member of the Australian Institute of the Company Directors.

Mr Smith was appointed as a Director of the Company on 16 June 2022. During the three year period to the end of the financial year, Mr Smith has not held a directorship in any other listed companies.

If Resolution 4 is passed, Mr Smith will be a Director of the Company, subject to retirement, for the next three years.

If Resolution 4 is not passed, Mr Smith will cease to be a Director of the Company.

If Resolutions 2, 3, 4 and/or 5 are not passed, such that the Company does not have a minimum of 3 directors, the remaining directors and/or the Company at a general meeting of Shareholders will appoint the number of additional directors following the meeting to ensure that the Company has a minimum of 3 directors.

Resolution 4 is an ordinary resolution.

The Chairperson intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 4.

Director recommendation

The Directors (excluding Mr Haydn Smith) support the election of Mr Haydn Smith as a Director and recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

8 Resolution 5 – Election of Mr Ryan de Franck as Director

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer. However, a director appointed to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the board must not hold office (without re-election) past the next annual general meeting of the entity. This rule does not apply to the managing director.

Article 7.3(i) of the Constitution provides that a Director appointed under Article 7.2(b) may retire at the next general meeting of the Company and is eligible for election at that meeting

Mr Ryan de Franck was appointed as a Non-Executive Director pursuant to Article 7.2(b) of the Constitution on 16 June 2022.

Accordingly, Mr Ryan de Franck will retire as a Director at the Meeting and, being eligible, seeks to be elected as a Director.

Mr Ryan de Franck is currently Executive Director of the Valperlon Group, an Australian based project generation and corporate development group focused on the natural resources sector. Mr de Franck has a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of Western Australia, a

Masters in Applied Finance from FINSIA and a Graduate Diploma in Mineral Exploration Geoscience from the Western Australian School of Mines.

Mr de Franck was appointed as a Director of the Company on 16 June 2022. During the three year period to the end of the financial year, Mr de Franck has held a directorship in Fin Resources Limited (July 2021 – May 2022).

If Resolution 5 is passed, Mr de Franck will be a Director of the Company, subject to retirement, for the next three years.

If Resolution 5 is not passed, Mr de Franck will cease to be a Director of the Company.

If Resolutions 2, 3, 4 and/or 5 are not passed, such that the Company does not have a minimum of 3 directors, the remaining directors and/or the Company at a general meeting of Shareholders will appoint the number of additional directors following the meeting to ensure that the Company has a minimum of 3 directors.

Resolution 5 is an ordinary resolution.

The Chairperson intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 5.

Director recommendation

The Directors (excluding Mr Ryan de Franck) support the election of Mr Ryan de Franck as a Director and recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 5.

9 Resolution 6 – Approval of 10% Placement Facility

9.1 General

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period.

Listing Rule 7.1A enables eligible entities to issue Equity Securities up to 10% of its issued share capital through placements over a 12 month period after the annual general meeting (**10% Placement Facility**). The 10% Placement Facility is in addition to the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

An eligible entity for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1A is an entity that is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less. The Company is an eligible entity.

The Company is seeking Shareholder approval to issue Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility. The number of Equity Securities to be issued under the 10% Placement Facility will be determined in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 (refer to Section 6.2(c)).

If Resolution 6 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A up to 10% of its issued share capital over a 12 month period after the annual general meeting, in addition to the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

If Resolution 6 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the 10% Placement Facility to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

Resolution 6 is a special resolution and therefore requires approval of 75% of the votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote (in person, by proxy, by attorney or, in the case of a corporate Shareholder, by a corporate representative).

The Chairman intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 6.

Director recommendation

The Board unanimously recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 6.

9.2 Listing Rule 7.1A

(a) Shareholder approval

The ability to issue Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility is subject to Shareholder approval by way of a special resolution at an annual general meeting.

(b) Equity Securities

Any Equity Securities issued under the 10% Placement Facility must be in the same class as an existing quoted class of Equity Securities of the Company.

The Company, as at the date of the Notice, has on issue two quoted classes of Equity Securities, being Shares and listed Options exercisable at \$0.07 each, expiring 16 June 2027.

(c) Formula for calculating 10% Placement Facility

 - (II) the issue of, or agreement to issue, the convertible securities was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to have been approved under Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4;
- (C) plus the number of Shares issued in the relevant period under an agreement to issue securities within Listing Rule 7.2 exception 16 where:
 - (I) the agreement was entered into before the commencement of the relevant period; or
 - (II) the agreement was approved, or taken under these rules to have been approved, under Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4
- (D) plus the number of any other Shares issued in the relevant period with approval under Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4;
- (E) plus the number of partly paid ordinary shares that became fully paid in the relevant period;
- (F) less the number of Shares cancelled in the relevant period.

Note that A is has the same meaning in Listing Rule 7.1 when calculating an entity's 15% placement capacity.

D is 10%

E is the number of Equity Securities issued or agreed to be issued under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the 12 months before the date of the issue or agreement to issue that are not issued with Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.4.

(d) **Listing Rule 7.1 and Listing Rule 7.1A**

The ability of an entity to issue Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A is in addition to the entity's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

At the date of the Notice, the Company has on issue 185,778,694 Shares and therefore has a capacity to issue:

- (i) 27,866,804 Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1; and
- (ii) subject to Shareholder approval being sought under Resolution 6, 18,577,869 Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.

The actual number of Equity Securities that the Company will have capacity to issue under Listing Rule 7.1A will be calculated at the date of issue of the Equity Securities in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 (refer to Section 6.2(c)).

(e) **Minimum Issue Price**

The issue price of Equity Securities issued under Listing Rule 7.1A must be not less than 75% of the VWAP of Equity Securities in the same class calculated over the 15 Trading Days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 Trading Days of the date in paragraph (i) above, the date on which the Equity Securities are issued.

(f) **10% Placement Period**

Shareholder approval of the 10% Placement Facility under Listing Rule 7.1A is valid from the date of the annual general meeting at which the approval is obtained and expires on the earlier to occur of:

- (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of the annual general meeting at which the approval is obtained;
- (ii) the date of the entity's next annual general meeting; or
- (iii) the date of Shareholder approval of a transaction under Listing Rules 11.1.2 (a significant change to the nature or scale of activities) or 11.2 (disposal of main undertaking),

(the 10% Placement Period).

9.3 Effect of Resolution

The effect of Resolution 6 will be to allow the Directors to issue the Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A during the 10% Placement Period without using the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

9.4 Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.3A
