Instead, the Notice of Meeting and accompanying explanatory statement are being made available to shareholders electronically and can be viewed and downloaded from:

- the ASX market announcements page under the Company's code "PDI".

If you have nominated an email address and have elected to receive electronic communications from the Company, you will also receive an email to your nominated email address with a link to an electronic copy of the Notice of Meeting. Participation and voting at the Meeting

The Meeting is being held virtually via a web-based meeting portal as well as in person. The Company has put in place processes for shareholders to participate in the virtual meeting that is equivalent to attending in person. Shareholders who choose to attend the virtual Meeting, will be able to:

- view the Meeting live;
- exercise a right, orally and in writing, to ask questions and make comments; and
- cast votes in real time on a poll during the Meeting.

Details of how shareholders will be able to vote via proxy prior to the Meeting or by poll during the Meeting (though the Company strongly encourages shareholders to vote via proxy) are set out in detail in the Notice of Meeting.
