NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Notice is given that the annual general meeting of the Shareholders of Kingfisher Mining Limited ACN 629 675 216 (**Company**) will be held at Level 8, 216 St Georges Terrace, Perth on Monday, 21 November 2022, commencing at 9:00am (AWST). The Explanatory Statement that accompanies and forms part of this Notice of Meeting describes in more detail the matters to be considered.

The Board is closely monitoring the rapidly changing coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. The health of the Company's Shareholders, employees and other stakeholders is of paramount importance.

Annual Report

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Important information

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared for the information of the Shareholders of Kingfisher Mining Limited ACN 629 675 216 (**Company**) in connection with the Resolutions to be considered at the Annual General Meeting to be held at Level 8, 216 St Georges Terrace, Perth on Monday, 21 November 2022, commencing at 9:00am (AWST).

The purpose of this Explanatory Statement is to provide Shareholders with all information known to the Company, which is material to a decision on how to vote on the Resolutions in the accompanying Notice of Meeting.

This Notice and Explanatory Statement should be read in their entirety. If Shareholders are in doubt as to how to vote, they should seek advice from their professional adviser prior to voting.

Interpretation

Capitalised terms which are not otherwise defined in this Notice and Explanatory Statement have the meanings given to those terms under the Definitions section. References to "\$" and "A\$" in this Notice and Explanatory Statement are references to Australian currency unless otherwise stated. References to time in this Notice and Explanatory Statement relate to the time in Perth, Western Australia.

Voting exclusions

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of:

Resolution 3: if at the time of the Meeting, the Company is proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.2, by or on behalf of any persons who are expected to participate in, or who will obtain a material benefit as a result of, the proposed issue (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates.

Resolution 5: by or on behalf of a person who is eligible to participate in the New Plan, or any of their respective associates.

Resolution 7(a): by or on behalf of James Farrell (or their nominee), and any person referred to in Listing Rule 10.14.1, 10.14.2 or 10.14.3 who is eligible to participate in the New Plan, or any of their respective associates.

Resolution 7(b): by or on behalf of Warren Hallam (or their nominee), and any person referred to in Listing Rule 10.14.1, 10.14.2 or 10.14.3 who is eligible to participate in the New Plan, or any of their respective associates.

- (c) a holder acting solely as nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Voting prohibitions

Resolution 1: In accordance with sections 250BD and 250R of the Corporations Act, a vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Resolution 6: In addition to the above, in accordance with section 200E(2A) of the Corporations Act, a vote on this Resolution must not be cast by any participants or potential participants in the New Plan and their associates, otherwise the benefit of this Resolution will be lost by such a person in relation to that person's future retirement.

However, a vote may be cast by such a person if:

- (a) the person is appointed as proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution; and
- (b) it is not cast on behalf of the person or an associate of the person.

Resolution 5, Resolution 6, Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive) and Resolutions 10(a)-(d) (inclusive): In accordance with sections 250BD of the Corporations Act, a person appointed as a proxy must not vote, on the basis of that appointment, on this Resolution if:

- (a) the proxy is either a member of the Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such member; and
- (b) the appointment does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution.

However, the above prohibition does not apply if:

- (a) the proxy is the Chair; and
- (b) the appointment expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Further, in accordance with section 224 of the Corporations Act, a vote on Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive) must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of a related party of the Company to whom the relevant Resolution would permit a financial benefit to be given, or an associate of such a related party.

However, the above prohibition does not apply if:

- (a) it is cast by a person as a proxy appointed by writing that specifies how the proxy is to vote on the Resolution; and
- (b) it is not cast on behalf of a related party of the Company to whom the Resolution would permit a financial benefit to be given, or an associate of such a related party.

Please note: If the Chair is a person referred to in the section 224 Corporations Act voting prohibition statement above, the Chair will only be able to cast a vote as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote if the Chair is appointed as proxy in writing and the Proxy Form specifies how the proxy is to vote on the relevant Resolution.

If you purport to cast a vote other than as permitted above, that vote will be disregarded by the Company (as indicated above) and you may be liable for breaching the voting restrictions that apply to you under the Corporations Act.

Voting in person

To vote in person, Shareholders are able to attend the Meeting at the time, date and place set out above.

Based on the best information available to the Board at the date of this Notice, the Board considers it will be in a position to hold an 'in-person' meeting to provide Shareholders with a reasonable opportunity to participate in and vote at the Meeting, while complying with the COVID-19 restrictions regarding public gatherings. The Company, however, strongly encourages Shareholders to submit proxies prior to the Meeting. If the situation in relation to

COVID-19 were to change in a way that affected the position above, the Company will provide a further update ahead of the Meeting via the ASX announcements platform.

Voting by proxy

A Proxy Form is attached to the Notice. This is to be used by Shareholders if they wish to appoint a representative (a 'proxy') to vote in their place. All Shareholders are invited and encouraged to attend the Meeting or, if they are unable to attend in person, sign and return the Proxy Form to the Company in accordance with the instructions thereon and in this Notice. Lodgement of a Proxy Form will not preclude a Shareholder from attending and voting at the Meeting in person.

Please note that:

- (a) a member of the Company entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy;
- (b) a proxy need not be a member of the Company; and
- (c) a member of the Company entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise, but where the proportion or number is not specified, each proxy may exercise half of the votes.

The enclosed Proxy Form provides further details on appointing proxies and lodging Proxy Forms.

Section 250BB(1) of the Corporations Act provides that an appointment of a proxy may specify the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution and, if it does:

- (a) the proxy need not vote on a show of hands, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed);
- (b) if the proxy has 2 or more appointments that specify different ways to vote on the resolution the proxy must only vote on a poll;
- (c) if the proxy is the Chair of the meeting at which the resolution is voted on the proxy must vote on a poll, and must vote that way (i.e. as directed); and
- (d) if the proxy is not the Chair the proxy need not vote on the poll, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed).

Section 250BC of the Corporations Act provides that, if:

- (a) an appointment of a proxy specifies the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution at a meeting of the Company's members;
- (b) the appointed proxy is not the chair of the meeting;
- (c) at the meeting, a poll is duly demanded on the resolution; and
- (d) either the proxy is not recorded as attending the meeting or the proxy does not vote on the resolution,

the Chair of the meeting is taken, before voting on the resolution closes, to have been appointed as the proxy for the purposes of voting on the resolution at the meeting.

Chair's voting intentions

The Chair intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of all Resolutions, unless the Shareholder has expressly indicated a different voting intention. In exceptional circumstances, the Chair of the Meeting may change his/her voting intention on any Resolution, in which case an ASX announcement will be made.

Subject to the following paragraph, if the Chair is your proxy, either by appointment or by default, and you have not indicated your voting intention, you expressly authorise the Chair to exercise the proxy in respect of Resolution 1, Resolution 5, Resolution 6, Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive) and Resolutions 10(a)-(d) (inclusive) even though these Resolutions are connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of the Company's Key Management Personnel.

If the Chair is a person referred to in the voting prohibition statement applicable to a Resolution (under section 224 of the Corporations Act), the Chair will only be able to cast a vote as proxy for you on the relevant Resolution if you are entitled to vote and have specified your voting intention in the Proxy Form.

Voting entitlements

In accordance with Regulations 7.11.37 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001* (Cth), the Board has determined that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered Shareholders as at 9:00am (AWST) on Saturday, 19 November 2022.

REGULATORY INFORMATION

1. Annual Report

In accordance with section 317 of the Corporations Act, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to discuss the Annual Report, including the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Auditor's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2022.

There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report.

At the Meeting, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to:

- (i) ask questions about, or make comments on, the Annual Report and the management of the Company; and
- (ii) ask the auditor questions about the conduct of the audit and the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report.

In addition to taking questions at the Meeting, written questions to the Chair about the management of the Company, or to the Company's auditor about:

- (i) the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report;
- (ii) the conduct of the audit;
- (iii) accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the financial statements; and
- (iv) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit,

may be submitted no later than five business days before the Meeting to the Company Secretary at the Company's registered office.

A representative of the Company's auditor, Criterion Audit Pty Ltd, will be in attendance at the Meeting to respond to any questions raised of the auditor or on the Auditor's Report.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's Annual Report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so.

2. Resolution 1: Remuneration Report

In accordance with section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, the Company must put the Remuneration Report to the vote of Shareholders. The Directors' Report contains the Remuneration Report which sets out the remuneration policy for the Company and the remuneration arrangements in place for the executive Directors, specified executives and non-executive Directors.

In accordance with section 250R(3) of the Corporations Act, Shareholders should note that Resolution 1 is an "advisory only" Resolution which does not bind the Directors or the Company. If Resolution 1 is not passed, the Directors will not be required to alter any of the arrangements in the Remuneration Report.

If the Company's Remuneration Report receives a 'no' vote of 25% or more (**Strike**) at two consecutive annual general meetings, Shareholders will have the opportunity to remove the whole Board, except the managing director (if any).

Where a resolution on the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at two consecutive annual general meetings, the Company will be required to put to Shareholders at the second annual general meeting a resolution on whether another meeting should be held (within 90 days) at which all Directors (other than the managing director, if any) who were in office at the date of approval of the applicable Directors' Report must stand for re-election.

The Company's Remuneration Report did not receive a Strike at the 2021 annual general meeting held on 26 November 2021. If the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at this Meeting, Shareholders should be aware that if a second Strike is received at the 2023 annual general meeting, this may result in the re-election of the Board.

The Chair will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders as a whole to ask about, or make comments on the Remuneration Report.

3. Resolution 2: Re-election of Director – Adam Schofield

Clause 7.2(a) of the Constitution provides that a director must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer. Additionally, Clause 7.2(b) of the Constitution and ASX Listing Rule 14.5 provide that an election of directors must be held at each annual general meeting.

Clause 7.3 of the Constitution provides that a director who retires holds office until the conclusion of the meeting at which that director retires but is eligible for re-election.

Accordingly, Adam Schofield, a Director appointed on 29 October 2018 retires at this Meeting and, being eligible, and offering himself for re-election, seeks re-election pursuant to this Resolution 2.

Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr Schofield is a Non-Executive Director with over 21 years' experience in the resources sector in Africa and Australia. He is a Mechanical Engineer with significant experience in conducting feasibility studies and taking projects from feasibility stage into operations. Mr Schofield has an extensive experience in gold, mineral sands, iron ore and copper. Mr Schofield is currently a director of Heavy Minerals Limited (ASX: HVY).

Independence

If elected, the Board (with Mr Schofield abstaining) considers Mr Schofield to be an independent Director. Mr Schofield is not considered by the Board to hold any interest, position or relationship that might influence, or reasonably be perceived to influence, in a material respect his capacity to bring an independent judgement to bear on issues before the Board and to act in the best interests of the entity as a whole rather than in the interests of an individual security holder or other party.

Time

Mr Schofield has acknowledged to the Company that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director.

Board recommendation

The Board (other than Adam Schofield who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) supports the re-election of Adam Schofield on the basis of his skills, qualifications, exploration industry and leadership experience, and his contributions to the Board's activities.

Additional information

Resolution 2 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board (other than Adam Schofield who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) recommends Shareholders vote in favour of this Resolution.

4. Resolution 3: Approval of 10% Placement Facility

The Company seeks Shareholder approval to issue Equity Securities up to 10% of its issued share capital through placements over a 12 month period (**Relevant Period**) after the Meeting (**10% Placement Facility**). The 10% Placement Facility is in addition to the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

The exact number of Equity Securities to be issued under the 10% Placement Facility will be determined in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 (see below).

Resolution 3 is a **special resolution** and therefore requires approval of 75% of the votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote (in person, by proxy, by attorney or, in the case of a corporate Shareholder, by a corporate representative).

If Resolution 3 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval in Listing Rule 7.1.

Listing Rule 7.1A

(a) Eligible entity

An eligible entity for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1A is an entity that is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less.

The Company is an eligible entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of approximately \$22.99 million, based on the closing price of Shares on 6 October 2022, being \$0.440.

(b) Equity Securities that can be issued

Any Equity Securities issued under the 10% Placement Facility must be in the same class as an existing quoted class of Equity Securities of the eligible entity.

As at the date of the Notice, the Company has on issue one quoted class of Equity Securities; Shares.

(c) Maximum number of Equity Securities which may be issued

The number of Equity Securities which may be issued, or agreed to be issued, under the 10% Placement Facility is prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and is calculated as follows:

 - the issue of, or agreement to issue, the convertible securities was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to have been approved, under Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.4;
- plus the number of fully paid ordinary shares issued in the Relevant Period under an agreement to issue securities within Listing Rule 7.2 exception 16 where:
 - the agreement was entered into before the commencement of the Relevant Period; or
 - the agreement or issue was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to have been approved, under Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.4;
- plus the number of any other fully paid ordinary shares issued in the Relevant Period with approval under Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.4;
- plus the number of partly paid shares that became fully paid Shares in the Relevant Period; and
- less the number of fully paid ordinary shares cancelled in the Relevant Period.
- "D" = is 10%.
- "E" = is the number of Equity Securities issued or agreed to be issued under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the Relevant Period where the issue or agreement has not been subsequently approved by Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.4.

The actual number of Equity Securities that may be issued under Listing Rule 7.1A is calculated at the date of issue of the Equity Securities in accordance with the above formula.

(d) Interaction with Listing Rule 7.1

The ability of an entity to issue Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A is in addition to the entity's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

(e) Minimum Issue Price

The issue price of Equity Securities issued under Listing Rule 7.1A must be for a cash consideration per security which is not less than 75% of the VWAP of Equity Securities in the same class calculated over the 15 Trading Days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed by the Company and the recipient of the Equity Securities; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 Trading Days of the date in paragraph (i) above, the date on which the Equity Securities are issued,

(Minimum Issue Price).

Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.3A

 - (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of the Meeting;
 - (ii) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; and
 - (iii) the time and date of the approval by Shareholders of a transaction under Listing Rule 11.1.2 or Listing Rule 11.2,

(10% Placement Period).

- (b) Where the Company issues Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility, it will only do so for cash consideration and the issue price will be not less than the Minimum Issue Price.
- (c) The Company intends to use any funds raised towards continued exploration and expenditure on the Company's current assets, acquisition of new assets or investments (including expenses associated with such acquisitions) and/or general working capital.
- (d) There is a risk of economic and voting dilution to existing Shareholders in approving the 10% Placement Facility, including the risks that:
 - (i) the market price for the Company's Equity Securities may be significantly lower on the date of the issue of the Equity Securities than when Shareholders approve the 10% Placement Facility; and
 - (ii) the Equity Securities may be issued at a price that is at a discount to the market price for the Company's Equity Securities on the issue date.

Resolution 3 is a **special resolution** and therefore requires approval of 75% of the votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote (in person, by proxy, by attorney or, in the case of a corporate Shareholder, by a corporate representative).

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

5. Resolution 4: Modification of Constitution

General

Under section 136(2) of the Corporations Act, a company may modify or repeal its constitution or a provision of its constitution by special resolution of Shareholders.

Resolution 4 seeks the approval of Shareholders to modify the Company's existing Constitution.

The proposed modifications to the existing Constitution will incorporate recent amendments to the Corporations Act regarding the holding of meetings of Shareholders using virtual meeting technology and the new regime for the making of offers in connection with employee share schemes under Part 7.12 of the Corporations Act.

The Directors believe that it is preferable in the circumstances to simply modify a couple of provisions of the existing Constitution rather than repealing the entire existing Constitution and replacing it with a new constitution.

The Directors believe these amendments are not material nor will they have any significant impact on Shareholders.

A copy of the modified Constitution is available for review by Shareholders at the Company's website **https://kingfishermining.com.au/** and at the office of the Company. A copy of the modified Constitution can also be sent to Shareholders upon request to the Company Secretary at **info@kingfishermining.com.au**. Shareholders are invited to contact the Company if they have any queries or concerns.

If Resolution 4 is passed, the Company will adopt the modified Constitution with effect from the date this Resolution is passed.

Summary of material proposed changes

(a) **Convening a general meeting (Article 5.2)**

The modifications provide for the ability of the Company to hold general meetings using virtual technology only, as well as physical or hybrid meetings. This improved flexibility is necessary to ensure the Company is able to hold general meetings at times where physical meetings may not be practicable (such as during pandemics).

Set out below are the proposed modifications to Article 5.2 of the existing Constitution:

Prior to modification:

5.2 Convening a general meeting

(a) The Directors may convene and arrange to hold a general meeting of the Company whenever they think fit and must do so if required to do so under the Corporations

Act.

- (b) The Company may hold a meeting of Members at 2 or more venues using any technology that gives the Members as a whole a reasonable opportunity to participate.
- (c) Notice of a general meeting must be given in accordance with article 14, the Corporations Act and the Listing Rules.
- (d) In computing the period of notice under article 5.2(c), the day of the meeting is to be disregarded.
- (e) A Director is entitled to receive notice of and to attend all general meetings and all separate meetings of the holders of any class of shares in the capital of the Company and is entitled to speak at those meetings.

After modification:

5.2 Convening a general meeting

- (a) The Directors may convene and arrange to hold a general meeting of the Company whenever they think fit and must do so if required to do so under the Corporations Act.
- (b) The Company may hold a meeting of Members at a time determined by the Directors:
 - (i) at one or more physical venues;
 - (ii) at one or more physical venues and using virtual meeting technology; and
 - (iii) using virtual meeting technology only,

provided that, in each case, Members as a whole are given a reasonable opportunity to participate in the meeting, and otherwise in the manner determined by the Directors.

- (c) If the Directors elect to use virtual meeting technology for a general meeting of the Company, the Directors will determine the type of virtual meeting technology to be used, which may include any combination of telephone, video conferencing, messaging, smartphone application or any other audio and/or visual device which permits instantaneous communication.
- (d) Notice of a general meeting must be given in accordance with article 14, the Corporations Act and the Listing Rules.
- (e) In computing the period of notice under article 5.2(d), the day of the meeting is to be disregarded.
- (f) A Director is entitled to receive notice of and to attend all general meetings and all separate meetings of the holders of any class of shares in the capital of the Company and is entitled to speak at those meetings.
- (b) Issue cap for offers involving monetary consideration under an employee incentive scheme

The proposed amendment provides the ability for the Company to increase the 5% issue cap under the Corporations Act in respect of offers for monetary consideration under the New Plan to 10%. Set out below is the proposed modification to the existing Constitution.

(i) Insert as new definitions in Article 1.1:

ESS Interests has the meaning under section 1100M(1) of the Corporations Act.

Share means a fully paid ordinary share in the capital of the Company.

(ii) Insert as a new Article 2.8:

2.8 Issue cap for offers involving monetary consideration under an employee incentive scheme

For the purposes of section 1100V(2)(a) of the Corporations Act, the Company may only make an offer of ESS Interests if, at the time the offer is made, the Company reasonably believes:

- (a) the total number of Shares that are, or are covered by, the ESS Interests of the Company that may be issued under the offer; and
- (b) the total number of Shares that are, or are covered by, the ESS Interests that have been issued, or could have been issued, under offers made under the Company's employee share scheme at any time during the 3 year period ending on the day the offer is made,

does not exceed 10% of the number of Shares actually on issue as at the start of the day the offer is made.

Additional information

Resolution 4 is a **special resolution** and therefore requires approval of 75% of the votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote (in person, by proxy, by attorney or, in the case of a corporate Shareholder, by a corporate representative).

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

6. Resolution 5: Approval of New Employee Securities Incentive Plan

General

On 1 October 2022, amendments to the Corporations Act will commence, simplifying the process for incentivising participants under employee share schemes (**ESS**). Division 1A will be introduced into Part 7.12 of the Corporations Act, providing a new regime for the making of offers in connection with an ESS (**New Regime**). This regime will replace the current relief afforded by ASIC Class Order 14/1000 (**Class Order**), which has been in force since 30 October 2014.

To ensure that the Company's ESS complies with the New Regime, the Company will adopt, subject to Shareholder approval, a new ESS called the 'Kingfisher Mining Limited Employee Securities Incentive Plan' (the **New Plan**).

Resolution 5 seeks Shareholder approval of the New Plan in accordance with Listing Rule 7.2 exception 13(b).

Under the New Plan, the Board may offer to eligible persons the opportunity to subscribe for such number of Equity Securities in the Company as the Board may decide and on the terms set out in the rules of the

New Plan. A summary of the key terms of the New Plan is in Schedule 3. In addition, a copy of the New Plan is available for review by Shareholders at the registered office of the Company until the date of the Meeting. Shareholders are invited to contact the Company if they have any queries.

Key changes between the Class Order and New Regime

The following table summarises the key changes that will be implemented by the New Regime for "Invitations" (within the meaning given in the New Plan) made on or after 1 October 2022. These changes are reflected in the New Plan.

Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.2, exception 13(b)

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

Listing Rule 7.2, exception 13(b), provides an exception to Listing Rule 7.1 such that issues of Equity Securities under an employee incentive scheme are exempt for a period of three years from the date on which Shareholders approve the issue of Equity Securities under the scheme as an exception to Listing Rule 7.1.

Listing Rule 7.2, exception 13(b), ceases to be available to the Company if there is a material change to the terms of the New Plan from those set out in this Notice in Schedule 3.

If Resolution 5 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities under the New Plan pursuant to Listing Rule 7.2, exception 13(b), to eligible participants over a period of three years up to a nominated maximum amount without using the Company's 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

However, any future issues of Equity Securities under the New Plan to a related party or a person whose relationship with the Company or the related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained will require additional Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 10.14 at the relevant time.

If Resolution 5 is not passed, any issue of Equity Securities pursuant to the New Plan must either be undertaken using the Company's 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1, or with prior Shareholder approval.

Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.2, exception 13(b)

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.2, exception 13(b), the following information is provided in relation to the New Plan:

- (a) A summary of the material terms of the New Plan is in Schedule 3.
- (b) As at the date of this Notice, no Equity Securities have been issued under the New Plan.
- (c) 250,000 options have been issued under the Existing Plan, adopted on or about 9 November 2020.

- (d) The maximum number of Equity Securities proposed to be issued under the New Plan pursuant to Listing Rule 7.2, exception 13(b), following approval of Resolution 5 is 5,225,00 (subject to adjustment in the event of a reorganisation of capital and further subject to applicable laws and the Listing Rules). This number comprises approximately 10% of the Company's Equity Securities currently on issue.
- (e) A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

Additional information

Resolution 5 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 5.

7. Resolution 6: Approval of potential termination benefits under the New Plan

General

The Corporations Act contains certain limitations concerning the payment of 'termination benefits' to persons who hold a 'managerial or executive office'. The Listing Rules also provides certain limitations on the payment of 'termination benefits' to officers of listed entities.

As is common with employee incentive schemes, the New Plan provides the Board with the discretion to, amongst other things, determine that some or all of the Equity Securities granted to a participant under the New Plan (**Plan Securities**) will not lapse in the event of that participant ceasing their engagement with the Company before such Plan Securities have vested. This 'accelerated vesting' of Plan Securities may constitute a 'termination benefit' prohibited under the Corporations Act, regardless of the value of such benefit, unless Shareholder approval is obtained.

If Resolution 6 is not passed, the Company will not be able to offer 'termination benefits' to persons who hold a 'managerial or executive office' pursuant to the terms of the New Plan unless Shareholder approval is obtained each and every time such termination benefit is proposed, in accordance with section 200E of the Corporations Act.

Part 2D.2 of the Corporations Act

Under section 200B of the Corporations Act, a company may only give a person a benefit in connection with them ceasing to hold a 'managerial or executive office' (as defined in the Corporations Act) if an exemption applies or if the benefit is approved by Shareholders in accordance with section 200E of the Corporations Act.

Subject to Shareholder approval of Resolution 5, Shareholder approval is sought for the purposes of Part 2D.2 of the Corporations Act to approve the giving of benefits under the New Plan to a person by the Company in connection with that person ceasing to be an officer of, or ceasing to hold a managerial or executive office in, the Company (or subsidiary of the Company) on the terms and conditions in this Explanatory Memorandum.

Under the terms of the New Plan and subject to the Listing Rules and the Corporations Act, the Board possesses the discretion to vary the terms or conditions of the New Plan Securities. Notwithstanding the foregoing, without the consent of the participant in the New Plan, no amendment may be made to the terms of any granted Plan Security which reduces the rights of the participant in respect of that Plan Security, other than an amendment introduced primarily to comply with legislation, to correct any manifest error or mistake or to take into consideration possible adverse tax implications.

As a result of the above discretion, the Board has the power to determine that some or all of a participant's Plan Securities will not lapse in the event of the participant ceasing employment or office before the vesting of their Plan Securities.

The exercise of this discretion by the Board may constitute a 'benefit' for the purposes of section 200B of the Corporations Act. The Company is therefore seeking Shareholder approval for the exercise of the Board's discretion in respect of any current or future participant in the New Plan who holds:

- (a) a managerial or executive office in, or is an officer of, the Company (or subsidiary of the Company) at the time of their leaving or at any time in the three years prior to their leaving; and
- (b) Plan Securities at the time of their leaving.

Valuation of the termination benefits

Provided Shareholder approval is given, the value of the termination benefits may be disregarded when applying section 200F(2)(b) or section 200G(1)(c) of the Corporations Act (i.e. the approved benefit will not count towards the statutory cap under the legislation).

The value of the termination benefits that the Board may give under the New Plan cannot be determined in advance. This is because various matters will or are likely to affect that value. In particular, the value of a particular benefit will depend on factors such as the Company's Share price at the time of vesting and the number of Plan Securities that will vest or otherwise be affected. The following additional factors may also affect the benefit's value:

- (a) the participant's length of service and the status of the vesting conditions attaching to the relevant Plan Securities at the time the participant's employment or office ceases; and
- (b) the number of unvested Plan Securities that the participant holds at the time they cease employment or office.

In accordance with Listing Rule 10.19, the Company will ensure that no officer of the Company or any of its child entities will, or may be, entitled to termination benefits if the value of those benefits and the terminations benefits that are or may be payable to all officers together exceed 5% of the equity interests of the Company as set out in the latest accounts given to ASX under the Listing Rules.

Additional information

Resolution 6 is conditional on the passing of Resolution 5.

If Resolution 5 is not approved at the Meeting, Resolution 6 will not be put to the Meeting.

Resolution 6 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board declines to make a recommendation in relation to Resolution 6 due to their potential personal interests in the outcome of the Resolution.

8. Resolutions 7(a)-(d): Approval of issue of Director Options

Background

The Company is proposing, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to issue up to a total of 2,500,000 Options to James Farrell, Warren Hallam, Adam Schofield and Scott Huffadine, or their respective nominees, under the New Plan (**Director Options**) as follows:

The Company is in an important stage of development with significant opportunities and challenges in both the near and long-term, and the proposed issue of the Director Options seeks to align the efforts of the Directors in seeking to achieve growth of the Share price and in the creation of Shareholder value. In addition, the Board also believes that incentivising with Options is a prudent means of conserving the Company's available cash reserves. The Board believes it is important to offer these Director Options to continue to attract and maintain highly experienced and qualified Board members in a competitive market.

Resolutions 7(a)-(d) seek Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 10.14 and sections 195(4) and 208 of the Corporations Act for the issue of the up to 2,500,000 Director Options under the New Plan to the Directors or their respective nominees. These Resolutions are subject to shareholders approving Resolution 5.

Listing Rule 10.14

Listing Rule 10.14 provides that an entity must not permit any of the following persons to acquire Equity Securities under an employee incentive scheme without the approval of its Shareholders:

- (a) a director of the entity (Listing Rule 10.14.1);
- (b) an associate of a person referred to in Listing Rule 10.14.1 (Listing Rule 10.14.2); and
- (c) a person whose relationship with the entity or a person referred to in Listing Rule 10.14.1 or 10.14.2 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the acquisition should be approved by Shareholders.

Approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue of the Director Options as approval is being obtained under Listing Rule 10.14. Accordingly, the issue of the Director Options will not be included in the Company's 15% annual placement capacity in Listing Rule 7.1 or the maximum permitted number of Equity Securities issued under Listing Rule 7.2, exception 13(b).

The effect of Shareholders passing Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive) will be to allow the Company to proceed with the issue of the Director Options to the Directors (or their respective nominees) in the proportions listed above.

If Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive) are not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Director Options to the Directors (or their respective nominees) and the Company will consider other alternative commercial means to incentivise the Directors, including by the payment of cash, subject to the requirements of the Constitution, Corporations Act and Listing Rules.

Specific information required by Listing Rule 10.15

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.15, the following information is provided in relation to the proposed issue of the Director Options:

- (a) The Director Options will be issued under the New Plan to James Farrell, Warren Hallam, Adam Schofield and Scott Huffadine (or their respective nominees).

- (e) No Equity Securities have previously been issued under the Existing Plan or the New Plan to the Directors (or their respective nominees).
- (f) The Director Options will be issued on the terms and conditions in Schedule 1.
- (g) The Board considers that the Director Options, rather than Shares or Performance Rights, are an appropriate form of incentive for the following reasons:
 - (i) they provide prudent cash management while rewarding and incentivising the recipient;
 - (ii) the Director Options granted will generally only be of benefit if the relevant Director continues to remain employed by the Company;
 - (iii) the issue of the Director Options will therefore align the interests of the Directors with Shareholders; and
 - (iv) the deferred taxation benefit which is available to a related party in respect of an issue of Options is also beneficial to the Company as it means the related party is not required to immediately sell the Options to fund a tax liability (as would be the case in an issue of Shares where the tax liability arises upon issue of the Shares) and will instead, continue to hold an interest in the Company.

- (n) Any additional persons covered by Listing Rule 10.14 who become entitled to participate in an issue of securities under the Plan after the resolution is approved and who were not named in the Notice will not participate until approval is obtained under Listing Rule 10.14.
- (o) A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

Section 195 of the Corporations Act

Section 195(1) of the Corporations Act prohibits a director of a public company who has a material personal interest in a matter that is being considered at a meeting of directors from being present while the matter is being considered at the meeting or voting on the matter. If there is not a quorum of directors who are eligible to vote on a matter because of the operation of section 195(1) of the Corporations Act, one or more directors may call a general meeting and the general meeting may deal with the matter.

The Directors have a personal interest in the outcome of each of their respective Resolutions under Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive) and have exercised their right under section 195(4) of the Corporations Act to put the issue of the Director Options to the Directors to Shareholders to resolve upon.

Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

In accordance with Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act, in order to give a financial benefit to a related party, the Company must:

- (a) obtain Shareholder approval in the manner set out in section 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The proposed issue of the Director Options constitutes giving a financial benefit to related parties of the Company.

The Board considers that the issue of the Director Options constitutes 'reasonable remuneration' in the circumstances, and therefore falls within the scope of the exception in section 211 of the Corporations Act. However, in the interests of good corporate governance, as all Directors have a personal interest, the Company is seeking approval for the purposes of Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act in respect of the Director Options.

Information requirements for Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

Pursuant to and in accordance with section 219 of the Corporations Act, the following information is provided in relation to the proposed issue of the Director Options:

The Director Options will be issued to James Farrell, Warren Hallam, Adam Schofield and Scott Huffadine (or their respective nominees).

Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive) seek approval from Shareholders to allow the Company to issue the Director Options in the amounts specified on page 26 above to the Directors or their nominees. The Director Options are to be issued in accordance with the New Plan and otherwise on the terms and conditions in Schedule 1.

The Shares to be issued upon exercise of the Director Options will be fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares and will rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares. The Company will apply for official quotation of the Shares on ASX.

(c) Valuation of financial benefit

A valuation of the Director Options is in Schedule 2.

(d) Remuneration of Directors

The total annual remuneration arrangements current for James Farrell, Warren Hallam, Adam Schofield and Scott Huffadine as at the date of this Notice is set out on page 27 above.

(e) Existing relevant interests

At the date of this Notice, the Directors hold the following relevant interests in Equity Securities of the Company:

- (ii) Warren Hallam's interest would represent approximately 4.47% of the Company's issued Share capital;

- (iv) Scott Huffadine's interest would represent approximately 2.97% of the Company's issued Share capital.

(f) Trading history

Assuming the current Share capital structure as at the latest practicable date before the date of this Notice (being 52,250,001 Shares on 6 October 2022) and that no Shares are issued other than the Shares issued on exercise of the Director Options, the exercise of all of the Director Options will result in a total dilution of all other Shareholders' holdings of 4.57% (assuming that all Director Options are exercised). The actual dilution will depend on the extent that additional Shares are issued by the Company.

(h) Corporate governance

James Farrell is an Executive Director of the Company and therefore the Board believes that the grant of the Director Options is in line with Recommendation 8.2 of the 4th edition of the ASX Corporate Governance Council's Corporate Governance Principles and Recommendations.

The Board acknowledges that the grant of the Director Options to the Non-Executive Directors, Warren Hallam, Adam Schofield and Scott Huffadine is contrary to Recommendation 8.2 of the 4th edition of the ASX Corporate Governance Council's Corporate Governance Principles and Recommendations. However, the Board considers the grant of Director Options to the Non-Executive Directors is reasonable in the circumstances for the reasons set out on page 26 above.

(i) Taxation consequences

There are no material taxation consequences for the Company arising from the issue of the Director Options (including fringe benefits tax).

(j) Director recommendations

The Directors decline to make a recommendation to Shareholders in relation to Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive) due to their personal interests in the outcome of the Resolutions.

(k) Other information

The Board is not aware of any other information that would be reasonably required by Shareholders to allow them to make a decision whether it is in the best interests of the Company to pass Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive).

Additional information

Resolutions 7(a)-(d) (inclusive) are ordinary resolutions.

9. Resolution 8(a) and (b): Ratification of issue of Placement Shares

General

On 13 September 2022 Company announced a placement to raise up to \$4,250,000 (before costs) through the issue of 10,000,000 fully paid ordinary shares (**Placement Shares**) in the Company at an issue price of \$0.425 (**Placement**). Subject to Shareholder approval, participants will also receive one free attaching option for every four Placement Shares subscribed for under the Placement, exercisable at a price of \$0.70 on or before 30 May 2025 (**Placement Options**) (the subject of Resolution 9).

The Placement Shares were issued on 19 September 2022 as follows:

- (a) 5,775,000 Placement Shares were issued under the Company's placement capacity available under Listing Rule 7.1 (the subject of Resolution 8(a)); and
- (b) 4,225,000 Placement Shares were issued under the Company's placement capacity available under Listing Rule 7.1A (the subject of Resolution 8(b)).

Resolutions 8(a) and (b) seek the approval of Shareholders pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 to ratify the issue of the Placement Shares.

Listing Rules 7.1, 7.1A and 7.4

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

The issue of the Placement Shares does not fit within any of the exceptions to Listing Rules 7.1. It therefore requires the approval of the Company's Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.1.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, an eligible entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25%. The Company obtained this approval at its annual general meeting held on 26 November 2021.

The issue of the Placement Shares does not fit within any of the exceptions to Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, effectively uses up part of the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 and 10% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1A. This reduces the

Company's capacity to issue further Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under those Listing Rules for the 12 month period following the issue of the Placement Shares.

Listing Rule 7.4 provides an exception to Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A. It provides that where a company in a general meeting ratifies the previous issue of securities made pursuant to Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A (and provided that the previous issue did not breach Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A), those securities will be deemed to have been made with shareholder approval for the purpose of Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A.

The effect of Shareholders passing Resolutions 8(a) and (b) will be to allow the Company to retain the flexibility to issue Equity Securities in the future up to the 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 and the additional 10% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1A without the requirement to obtain prior Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 8(a) is passed, 5,775,000 Placement Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of Equity Securities it can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the issue date.

If Resolution 8(b) is passed, 4,225,000 Placement Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's 10% limit in Listing Rule 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of Equity Securities it can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the issue date (assuming the Company's approval under Listing Rule 7.1A remains in force for this period).

If Resolution 8(a) is not passed, 5,775,000 Placement Shares will continue to be included in the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of Equity Securities the Company can issue or agree to issue without obtaining prior Shareholder approval, to the extent of 5,775,000 Equity Securities for the 12 month period following the issue of the Placement Shares.

If Resolution 8(b) is not passed, 4,225,000 Placement Shares will continue to be included in the Company's 10% limit in Listing Rule 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of Equity Securities the Company can issue or agree to issue without obtaining prior Shareholder approval, to the extent of 4,225,000 Equity Securities for the 12 month period following the issue of the Placement Shares (assuming the Company's approval under Listing Rule 7.1A remains in force for this period).

Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.5

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to the ratification of the issue of the Placement Shares:

- (a) The Placement Shares were issued to sophisticated and institutional investors, none of whom are a Material Investor. The participants in the Placement were identified through a bookbuild process, which involved CPS Capital seeking expressions of interest to participate in the Placement from existing contacts of the Company and clients of CPS Capital (Placement Participants).
- (b) The Placement Shares are fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company and rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares on issue.
- (c) The Placement Shares were issued on 19 September 2022 as follows:
 - (i) 5,775,000 Placement Shares were issued under the Company's placement capacity available under Listing Rule 7.1 (the subject of Resolution 8(a)); and
 - (ii) 4,225,000 Placement Shares were issued under the Company's placement capacity available under Listing Rule 7.1A (the subject of Resolution 8(b)).
- (d) The Placement Shares were issued at a price of \$0.425 per Share.

Additional information

Resolutions 8(a) and (b) are separate ordinary resolutions.

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolutions 8(a) and (b).

10. Resolution 9: Approval of issue of Placement Options

General

Background to the Placement is summarised above in Section 9.

If Resolution 9 is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of 2,500,000 Placement Options. In addition, the Placement Options will be excluded from the calculation of the number of Equity Securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

If Resolution 9 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Placement Options.

Listing Rule 7.1

A summary of Listing Rule 7.1 is provided above in Section 9.

Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.3

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.3, the following information is provided in relation to the issue of the Placement Options:

- (a) The Placement Options will be issued to the Placement Participants (refer to Section 9 for further details of the Placement Participants).
- (b) A maximum of 2,500,000 Placement Options will be issued if Shareholders pass this Resolution.
- (c) The Placement Options are exercisable at a price of \$0.70 on or before 30 May 2025 and will otherwise be issued on the terms and conditions in Schedule 4. The Company intends to apply for quotation of the Placement Options.
- (d) The Placement Options will be issued within three months after the date of the Meeting.
- (e) The Placement Options are being issued as free attaching Options to the Placement Shares. Accordingly, nil additional cash consideration will be payable by the Placement Participants.
- (f) There are no other material terms to the agreement for the subscription of the Placement Options.
- (g) A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

Additional information

Resolution 9 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 9.

The Board considers that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the issue of the Director Placement Securities because the Shares and Options will be issued on the same terms as those Shares and Options issued to non-related party participants in the Placement and as such the giving of the financial benefit is on arm's length terms.

Additional information

Each of Resolutions 10(a)-(d) (inclusive) are ordinary resolutions.

The Directors decline to make a recommendation to Shareholders in relation to Resolutions 10(a)-(d) (inclusive) due to their personal interests in the outcome of the Resolutions.

12. Resolution 11: Approval of issue of Lead Manager Options

General

The Company and CPS Capital entered a mandate dated 8 September 2022 (**CPS Capital Mandate**) whereby CPS Capital was engaged to act as lead manager to the Placement, as well as broker and corporate advisor to the Company on an exclusive basis for a period of 12 months.

Under the CPS Capital Mandate, the Company agreed to pay CPS Capital (or its nominees) the following fees in consideration for acting as lead manager to the Placement:

- (a) a cash management fee of 6% (excluding GST) of the funds raised under the Placement; and
- (b) 1,800,000 Options at an issue price of \$0.00001 per Option, with an exercise price of \$0.70 each and an expiry date of 30 May 2025 (Lead Manager Options).

In addition to the above, the Company agreed to pay CPS Capital a monthly fee of \$6,000 in consideration for corporate advisory services, and CPS Capital will provide management services in respect of the proposed Loyalty Options Offer announced by the Company on 13 September 2022.

The Company may terminate the CPS Capital Mandate by giving seven days written notice.

Resolution 11 seeks Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 for the issue of the Lead Manager Options to CPS Capital as partial consideration for services provided as lead manager to the Placement (refer to the summary of the Placement in Section 9).

If Resolution 11 is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of the Lead Manager Options. In addition, the Lead Manager Options will be excluded from the calculation of the number of Equity Securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

If Resolution 11 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Lead Manager Options without using its available capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

- 12. (Change of control): If a change of control event occurs in relation to the Company, or the Board determines that such an event is likely to occur, the Board may in its discretion determine the manner in which any or all of the Participant's Convertible Securities will be dealt with, including, without limitation, in a manner that allows the Participant to participate in and/or benefit from any transaction arising from or in connection with the change of control event.

- (a) a written notice of exercise of Options specifying the number of Options being exercised; and

6. Exercise Notice
