QUARTERLY REPORT 30 SEPTEMBER 2022 (Q1 FY2023)

Business back in focus

HIGHLIGHTS

- Key management change implemented post quarter end with internationally experienced executive Steve Voorma appointed as CEO to bring leadership, renewed energy and focus
- Operating Revenue of A\$5.9 million in Q1 FY2023, up 16% on the prior quarter Q4 FY2022 and up 94% on Q1 FY2022. This represents a record revenue quarter for the group.
- Fundraising: Institutional funding agreement reached with US-based institutional investor, New Technology Capital Group, LLC, for up to a maximum of \$5m.
- Cash Receipts were down 7% on Q4 FY2022 and up 47% on Q1 FY2022
- Platform operating metrics and key initiatives:
 - o Activated Suppliers of 1,328 up 10% on the prior quarter and up 111% on Q1 FY2022
 - o Overlap of Suppliers using both Fulfilment & Marketplace platforms at 6%
 - o Kaddy Marketplace:
 - o GMV of A\$4.8m, up 19% on the prior quarter of \$4.02m
 - o **Total Trade Buyers** of 3,290, up 16% on the prior quarter. Total Lifetime Active Trade Buyers of 1,761, up 19% on the prior quarter
 - o Brands of 2,917 (up 43% on prior quarter), Product SKUs of 19,876 (up 14% on prior quarter)
 - o Kaddy Fulfilment:
 - o Cases Shipped of 280k down 8% on the prior quarter but up 31% on Q1 FY2022
- Project One: Savings and synergies of A\$4.0m p.a. (P&L based) now delivered in full
- Cash at bank of A\$1.955m at 30 September 2022, noting commentary on page 4 of this report

OUTLOOK

CEO Steve Voorma said "My first 2 weeks as CEO have been incredibly busy and fulfilling, I am encouraged by the team's experience, talent and enthusiasm. My focus has been on moving through the business and understanding our touch points, our internal and external ways of working and how these flow into our business operations and overall customer experiences.

"While we have many positives to our business, particularly surrounding our Kaddy marketplace platform - its scalability and positive growth trends are reflected in the quarterly update - it is also clear that we have work to do in a number of areas pertaining to our operational execution and total cost to serve our customers.

At a cost level, early observations demonstrate opportunity to:

- Improve our internal process and systems for enhanced operating efficiency
- Realise improvements in our 3rd party supplier network
- Rapidly reduce our operating expenses, as seen in multiple duplications and inefficiencies that currently exist through our operating environments
- Foster an enhanced performance culture to drive accountability and learnings.

"I look forward to updating the market on go-forward strategies in the coming weeks. Whilst it is too soon to be able to quantify them, I can already say that I expect to achieve material further P&L cost savings.

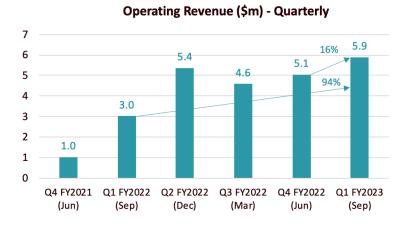

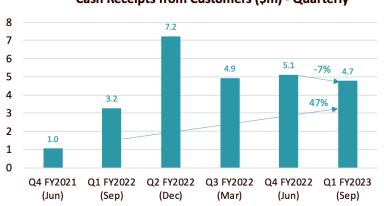
DW8 Limited (DW8: ASX), or the "**Company**", operates **Kaddy**, a unique and innovative technology platform which provides beverage suppliers an end-to-end supply chain solution that allows them to connect with buyers, simplify operations, streamline payments and fulfil both trade and consumer orders, is pleased to provide a summary of activity undertaken in the September quarter, Q1 FY2023 (unaudited).

KEY FINANCIAL RESULTS

Operating Revenue: DW8 generated A\$5.9m in **Operating revenue** in Q1 FY2023, up 16% on the prior quarter Q4 FY2022 and up 94% on Q1 FY2021.



Operating cashflows: DW8 generated A\$4.8m in **Cash Receipts from Customers** in Q1 FY2023, down 7% on the prior quarter Q4 FY2022 and up 47% on Q1 FY2021.

OPERATING METRICS - ACROSS PLATFORM'S TWO KEY COMPONENTS:

KADDY COMBINED PLATFORM

- Activated Suppliers using the Company's platform, increased to 1,328, up 10% on the prior quarter (up 111% on Q1 FY2022).
- Overlap of suppliers using both the Fulfilment and Marketplace platforms at the end of September was 6%.





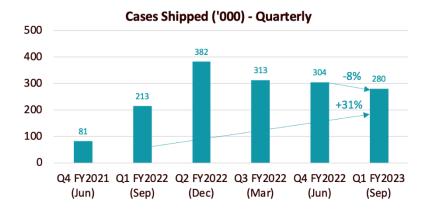
KADDY MARKETPLACE

- GMV of A\$4.8m, up 19% on the prior quarter's GMV of \$4.02m
- Total Trade Buyers of 3,290, up 16% on the prior quarter (up 82% on total as at 30 September 2021)
- Total Active Trade Buyers of 1,077 up 19% on the prior quarter (up 91% on total as at 30 September 2021)
- Brands of 2,917 up 43% on prior quarter (up 361% on total as at 30 September 2021)
 Product SKUs of 19,876 up 14% on the prior quarter (up 174% on total as at 30 September 2021)



KADDY FULFILMENT

- Cases shipped of 280k down 8% on the prior quarter but up 31% on Q1 FY2022.
- Average cases shipped per order was 3.5, down 4% on Q4 FY2022.





FUNDING

Institutional funding arrangement: Funding was agreed with US-based institutional investor, New Technology Capital Group, LLC, for up to a maximum of \$5m, replacing the previously announced convertible note agreement with Singapore based investor Triton Growth. See ASX announcement 18 August 2022. To date, \$1.5m has been received.

A non-renounceable entitlement offer (rights issue) was made to existing eligible shareholders. The rights issue disappointingly raised only \$168,248. See ASX announcement <u>27 September 2022</u>.

Cash position: DW8 held A\$1.955m cash at bank as at 30 September 2022. Cash at bank excludes circa A\$2.29m in term deposits held as securities for property related bank guarantees. Cash at bank includes the above mentioned \$1.5m.

The Company notes the Appendix 4C Section 8.5 shows a cash runway of 1.09 quarters (based on historic cash flows, September quarter, Q1 FY2023) and notes the following key factors affecting cash flows from operating activities in the September quarter:

- 1. In its Investor Presentation dated 13 September 2022 (slide 17), the former CEO indicated that the Company anticipated 'cash burn' to be materially lower in Q1 FY2023 than in Q4 FY2022. In fact the 'Net cash used in operating activities' was not materially lower, this is discussed below.
- 2. Pleasingly, the \$4.0m per annum of cost savings and P&L synergies generated by 'Project One' and noted on slide 16 of the same Investor Presentation have been realised in the quarter.
- 3. However, the timing of various working capital movements in the June and September quarters, which were not taken into account as a factor influencing the statement made regarding 'cash burn', has meant that 'Net cash used in operating activities' has not achieved the anticipated level in the September quarter.
- 4. The Company has executed changes that have reduced net operating cash outflows, revenue growth through Q1 has been strong and is expected to grow further in Q2. The Company also expects R&D tax refunds to release between \$0.8m and \$1.0m in cash in Q2.

Further capital will be sought to support growth. The Company is holding discussions with a range of investors and funders and will provide updates to shareholders as appropriate.

Operating expenditure: In Q1 FY2023, Net Cash from Operating Activities outflow was A\$3.787m (Section 1.9, Appendix 4C) and gross operating cash outflows were A\$8.459m (Section 1.2, Appendix 4C). See section on Key Financial Results for commentary.

Financing activities: During the quarter the Company repaid A\$140k of principal related to finance agreements on warehouse equipment and motor vehicles.

CORPORATE

Chief Executive Officer appointment: The Company appointed Mr Steve Voorma on 11 October.

Steve is an internationally experienced executive with deep global consumer and digital media expertise working for blue chip brands. His most recent role was as CEO of the Active Display Group where he led a highly successful profit improvement strategy and ultimately sale to an ASX listed company. Prior to this Steve led three separate divisions of Sony in Europe and Australia, developing expertise in logistics, service delivery and operational transformation. See ASX announcement 11 October 2022.

Related Party Payments: During the quarter, the Company made payments of A\$162k to related parties and their associates. These payments relate to the existing remuneration agreements for the Executive and Non-Executive Directors. Non-executive Chair Paul Evans waived his fee for the September quarter.



Annual General Meeting (AGM): The Company will hold its AGM in late November. The Notice Of Meeting (NOM) will be lodged with the ASX shortly. The Company expects to propose a name change to Kaddy Limited and an appropriate ASX code change to shareholders for approval at this meeting.
