Rey Resources Limited (ASX: REY) (“Rey” or “the Company”) is focused on developing its oil and gas interests in the Canning and Perth Basins, Western Australia.

1. Oil and Gas

1.1 Fitzroy Blocks (EP457 and EP458)

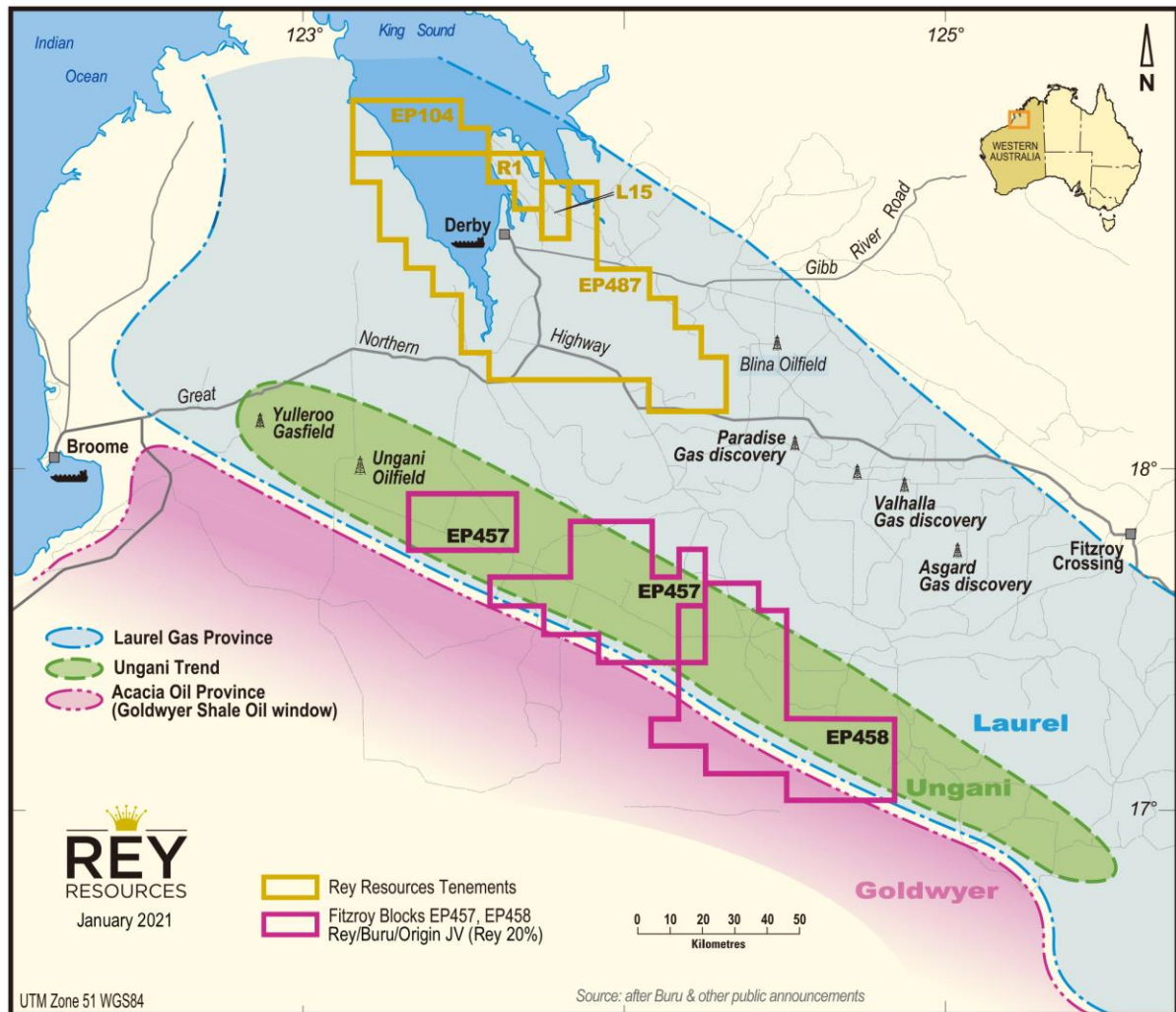


Figure 1: The three major prospective trends relative to Fitzroy Blocks EP457 and EP458 and Derby Block EP487.

The Fitzroy Blocks are located in the Canning Basin in the northwest of Western Australia (refer Figure 1 below).

During the report period, Rey keeps working with JV partners for the future exploration based on 2D seismic.

1.2 Derby Block (EP487)

The Company currently holds a 100% interest in petroleum exploration permit EP487, the Derby Block, via its 100% owned subsidiaries Rey Lennard Shelf Pty Ltd and Rey Derby Block Pty Ltd.

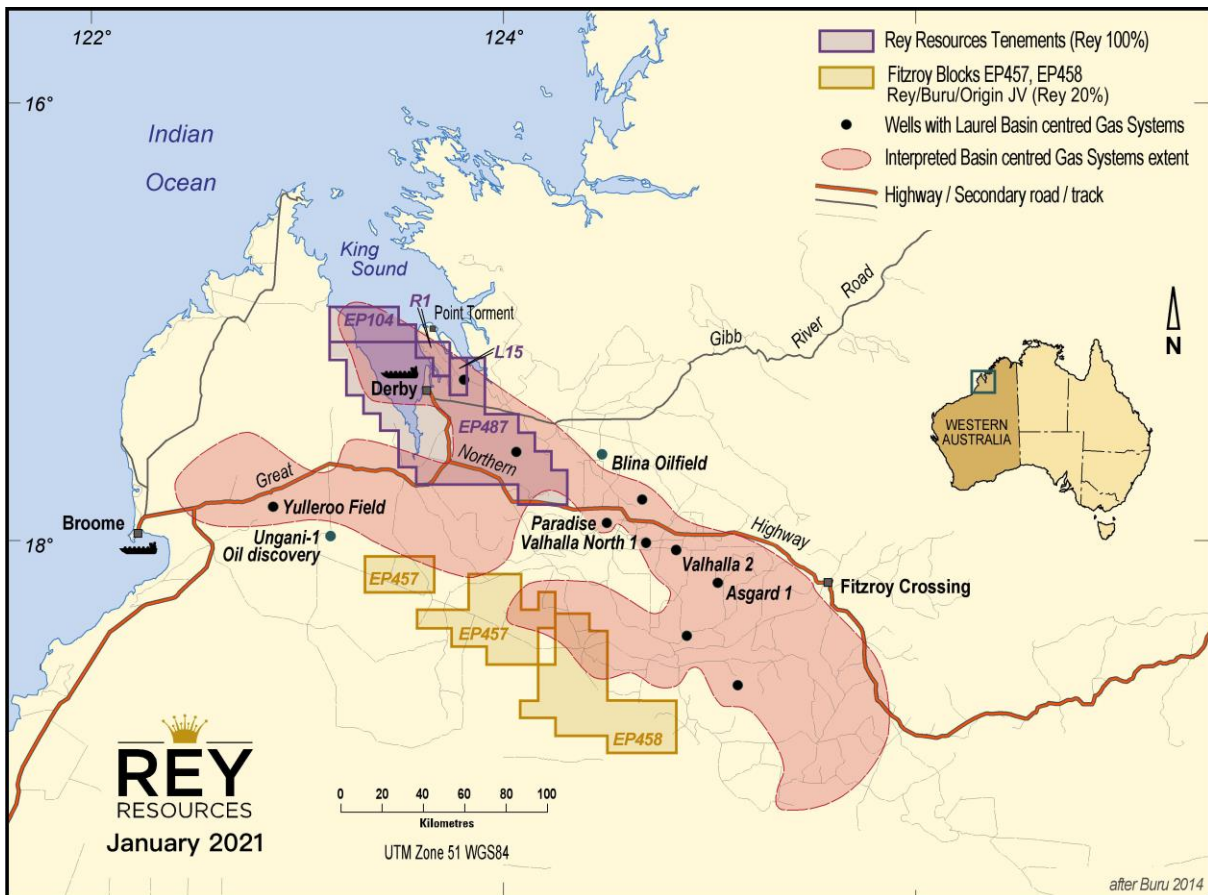


Figure 2: Interpreted extent of the Laurel Basin gas system in relation to Rey's petroleum interests (after Buru and others).

The Derby Block is considered to be predominantly a Wet Laurel Basin Centred Gas play (BCG) which is regionally extensive throughout the Canning Basin (refer to Figures 2 below) and has been the subject of exploration elsewhere in the Canning Basin by other parties in 2015, resulting in encouraging flow tests by Buru at Valhalla and Asgard.

Based on the assessment of the permit carried out by Rey, a 500km² 3D seismic has been proposed. The new 3D seismic is currently under design and Rey expects it will cover a larger area of the Butler prospects, which is potentially a large conventional resources target, and will provide more information to minimise the risk of future drilling.

In August 2022, a work program suspension & extension and variation application to replace the drilling commitment in Permit Year 2 and 2D seismic in Permit Year 3 and 4 was lodged to DMIRS. The application was approved in September 2022. This enables Rey to have more time to prepare the proposed 3D seismic in rest of 2022 and 2023 before having large scale 3D seismic over Butler and followed by the first well drilling in 2024.

The Butler Prospect is a deep and large onshore stratigraphic trap that lies on the edge of the Lennard Shelf within Laurel Formation in the northern Canning Basin. The existing 2D seismic data measures the Butler Prospect as a sandstone like target with a potentially very prospective conventional opportunity, but never been tested to date. Rey is proposing to acquire a 3D seismic program over the prospect, which will provide key benefits to the exploration program for the permit. Firstly, 3D seismic surveys are very limited in Canning Basin and the proposed surveys will provide the necessary level of confidence required to derisk the Butler prospect and provide Rey with significantly increased confidence to mature an optimal well location. Secondly, the size and scale of the 3D seismic acquisition is planned to be enlarged to identify new conventional leads and prospects. This approach will increase the chances to identify any new potential conventional target in EP487.

1.3 Lennard Shelf Blocks (EP104, R1 and L15)

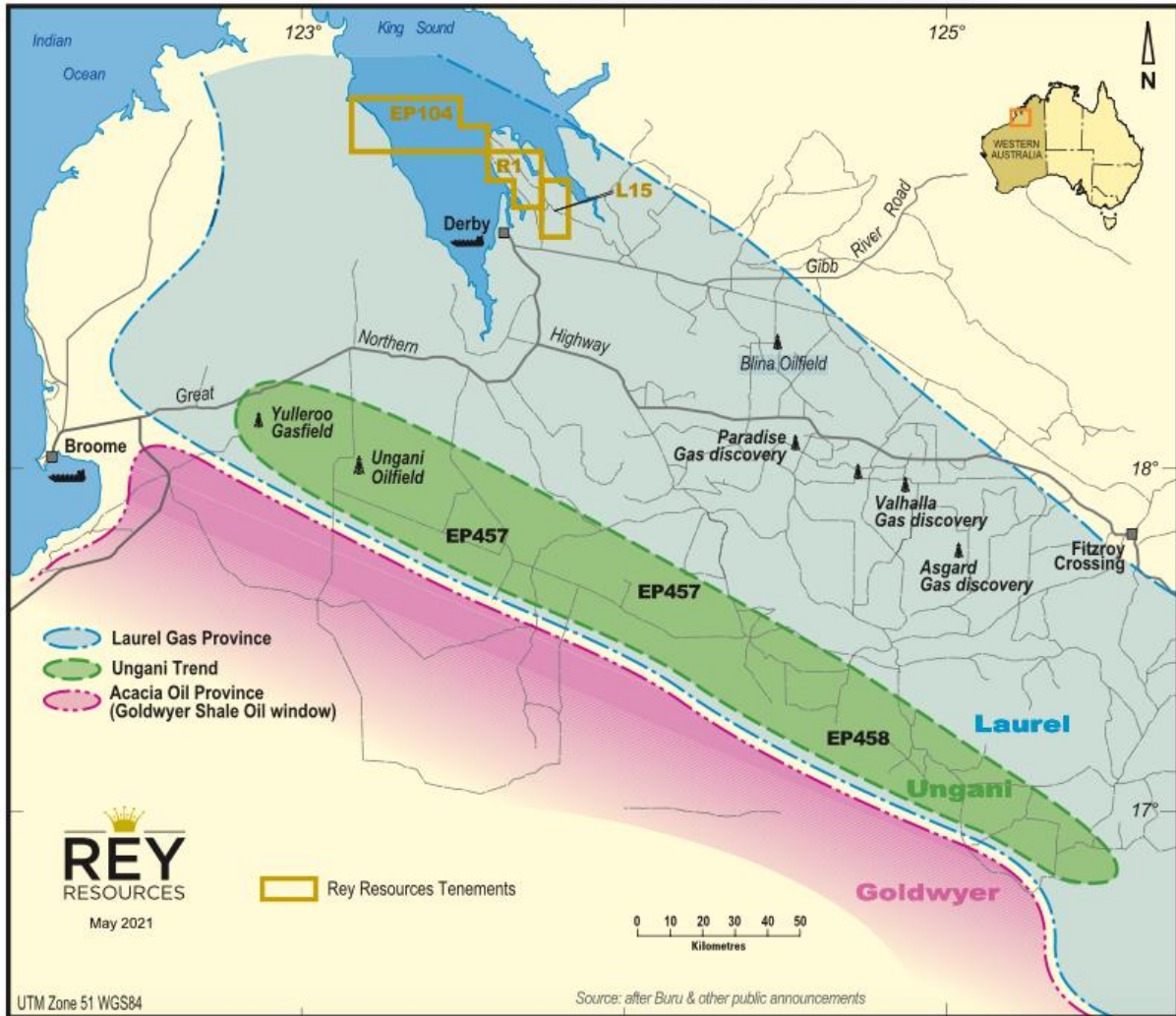


Figure 3: Location of Lennard Shelf Blocks

Rey holds a 100% interest in the Lennard Shelf Blocks, comprising EP104, a Retention Lease (R1) and one Production Licence (L15). The Lennard Shelf Blocks are situated to the north of Rey's existing interests in the Canning Basin (refer Figure 3) petroleum exploration licence, EP487 covering a total area of approximately 1,145 km² and are considered prospective for conventional oil and tight gas.

in July 2022, a 5 years program over R1 with new renewal term has been approved by DMIRS. The new work program targets to test the untested gas bearing during drilling of Point Torment-1. Rey is now planning a deeper desktop engineering study for the commitment well testing work in 2024.

An annual well inspection work has also been done in September 2022 as part of the requirements of environmental plan which covers R1 and L15 wells. No accidents occurred and no significant environmental risks were identified.

2. Coal

The Duchess Paradise Coal Project (**DP Project**) is a proposed bituminous thermal coal operation located in the Canning Basin of Western Australia and is partly contiguous with the Fitzroy Blocks.

Following the execution of the Access Deed with the last objector to the Mining Licence Application, the Court is making the final recommendations to the Minister. DMIRS also requested Rey to re-start the negotiation process. Rey continues the negotiation with Native Titleholders during the quarter for a heritage agreement.

3. Corporate

On 4 August 2022, the Company announced the extension of its on-market buyback program for a further 12 months from 18 August 2022 and up to 21.2 million shares can be bought back by the Company over the next 12 months period.

On 30 September 2022, the Company announced that Mr Louis Chien resigned as Alternate Director to Ms Min Yang, effective 1 October 2022. The Board would like to thank Mr Chien for his valuable contributions during his tenure with the Company.

As at the quarter ended 30 September 2022, the Company maintained a cash balance of \$37,000 and available loan facilities from Ms Wanyan Liu and ASF Group Limited of \$4.25 million and \$2 million respectively.

As required pursuant to section 6 of the Company's Appendix 5B, the Company paid approximately \$32,000 to related parties during the quarter, of which \$15,583 were consulting fees and \$16,500 were Director fees.
