Voting Prohibition Statements

Resolution 1 – Adoption of Remuneration Report

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the **voter**) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (c) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (d) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Voting Exclusion Statements

 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Voting by proxy

To vote by proxy, please complete and sign the enclosed Proxy Form and return by the time and in accordance with the instructions set out on the Proxy Form.

In accordance with section 249L of the Corporations Act, Shareholders are advised that:

- each Shareholder has a right to appoint a proxy;
- the proxy need not be a Shareholder of the Company; and
- a Shareholder who is entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the Shareholder appoints two proxies and the appointment does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes, then in accordance with section 249X(3) of the Corporations Act, each proxy may exercise one-half of the votes.

Shareholders and their proxies should be aware that:

- if proxy holders vote, they must cast all directed proxies as directed; and
- any directed proxies which are not voted will automatically default to the Chair, who must vote the proxies as directed.

Virtual Meeting

The Company is pleased to provide Shareholders with the opportunity to attend and participate in a virtual Meeting through an online meeting platform powered by Lumi, where shareholders will be able to watch, listen and vote online.

Registration will open at 1:30 pm (AEDT) on Friday, 25 November 2022, half an hour before the Meeting commences. Information on how to attend and vote at the Meeting online is set out below.

Shareholders will be able to vote and ask questions at the virtual Meeting. Shareholders are also encouraged to submit questions in advance of the Meeting to the Company. EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the business of the Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2022 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's annual financial report is available on its website at www.myrewardsinternational.com/investors.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out the company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the remuneration report at the annual general meeting.

2.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

2.3 Previous voting results

As this is the Company's first annual general meeting since listing on ASX, the remuneration report of the Company has not been considered before. Accordingly, a Spill Resolution will not be relevant for this Meeting.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – DAVID VINSON

3.1 General

Listing Rule 14.5 provides that an entity which has directors must hold an election of directors at each annual general meeting.

The Constitution sets out the requirements for determining which Directors are to retire by rotation at an annual general meeting.

David Vinson, who has served as a Director since 24 April 2005 and was last re-elected on 29 January 2021, retires by rotation and seeks re-election.

3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr David Vinson has been a director and actively involved in the My Rewards business for over 15 years, with a particular focus on sales, operations and customer experience.

Mr Vinson has over 30 years' experience in the marketing services industry with a focus on establishing and commercialising new concepts. Mr Vinson was the founder and Managing Director of CUC Australasia Limited, a company that introduced membership and loyalty strategies to Australia in the early 1990's.

Mr Vinson is one of Australia's most experienced practitioners of membership and loyalty marketing strategy and he has had extensive exposure to value added marketing throughout the USA, UK and Europe.

Mr Vinson holds a Bachelor of Science, and a Chemical Engineering degree from Purdue University (1978). Mr Vinson was formerly an executive director of Plentex Ltd (ASX:PRM).

3.3 Independence

If re-elected the Board does not consider David Vinson will be an independent Director.

3.4 Board recommendation

The Board has reviewed David Vinson's performance since his appointment to the Board and considers that his skills and experience will continue to enhance the Board's ability to perform its role. Accordingly, the Board supports the re-election of David Vinson and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE

4.1 General

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period.

However, under Listing Rule 7.1A, an eligible entity may seek shareholder approval by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25% (**7.1A Mandate**).

An 'eligible entity' means an entity which is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300,000,000 or less. The Company is an eligible entity for these purposes.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT CONT'D

As at the date of this Notice, the Company is an eligible entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a current market capitalisation of \$10.6 million (based on the number of Shares on issue and the closing price of Shares on the ASX on 19 October 2022).

Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% placement capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

4.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 7.1A

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.3A, the information below is provided in relation to Resolution 3:

(a) Period for which the 7.1A Mandate is valid

The 7.1A Mandate will commence on the date of the Meeting and expire on the first to occur of the following:

- (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of this Meeting;
- (ii) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; and
- (iii) the time and date of approval by Shareholders of any transaction under Listing Rule 11.1.2 (a significant change in the nature or scale of activities) or Listing Rule 11.2 (disposal of the main undertaking).

(b) Minimum price

Any Equity Securities issued under the 7.1A Mandate must be in an existing quoted class of Equity Securities and be issued for cash consideration at a minimum price of 75% of the volume weighted average price of Equity Securities in that class, calculated over the 15 trading days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed by the entity and the recipient of the Equity Securities; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 trading days of the date in Section 4.2(b)(i), the date on which the Equity Securities are issued.

(c) Use of funds raised under the 7.1A Mandate

The Company intends to use funds raised from issues of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate for the potential acquisition of new businesses and investments (including expenses associated with acquisitions), the development of the Company's current business and for general working capital.

(d) Risk of Economic and Voting Dilution

Any issue of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate will dilute the interests of Shareholders who do not receive any Shares under the issue.

If Resolution 3 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues the maximum number of Equity Securities available under the 7.1A Mandate, the economic and voting dilution of existing Shares would be as shown in the table below.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT CONT'D

The table below shows the dilution of existing Shareholders calculated in accordance with the formula outlined in Listing Rule 7.1A.2, on the basis of the closing market price of Shares and the number of Equity Securities on issue or proposed to be issued as at 19 October 2022.

The table also shows the voting dilution impact where the number of Shares on issue (Variable A in the formula) changes and the economic dilution where there are changes in the issue price of Shares issued under the 7.1A Mandate.

*The number of Shares on issue (Variable A in the formula) could increase as a result of the issue of Shares that do not require Shareholder approval (such as under a pro-rata rights issue or scrip issued under a takeover offer) or that are issued with Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

The table above uses the following assumptions:

- There are currently 238,063,012 Shares on issue comprising:
 - 211,611,566 existing Shares as at the date of this Notice; and
 - 26,451,446 Shares which will be issued assuming the completion of the Company's fully underwritten non-renounceable entitlement issue¹.
- The issue price set out above is the closing market price of the Shares on the ASX on 19 October 2022 (being \$0.050).
- The Company issues the maximum possible number of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate.
- The Company has not issued any Equity Securities in the 12 months prior to the Meeting that were not issued under an exception in Listing Rule 7.2 or with approval under Listing Rule 7.1.
- The issue of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate consists only of Shares. It is assumed that no Options are exercised into Shares before the date of issue of the Equity Securities. If the issue of Equity Securities includes quoted Options, it is assumed that those quoted Options are exercised into Shares for the purpose of calculating the voting dilution effect on existing Shareholders.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT CONT'D

6. The calculations above do not show the dilution that any one particular Shareholder will be subject to. All Shareholders should consider the dilution caused to their own shareholding depending on their specific circumstances.
7. This table does not set out any dilution pursuant to approvals under Listing Rule 7.1 unless otherwise disclosed.
8. The 10% voting dilution reflects the aggregate percentage dilution against the issued share capital at the time of issue. This is why the voting dilution is shown in each example as 10%.
9. The table does not show an example of dilution that may be caused to a particular Shareholder by reason of placements under the 7.1A Mandate, based on that Shareholder's holding at the date of the Meeting.

Shareholders should note that there is a risk that:

- (i) the market price for the Company's Shares may be significantly lower on the issue date than on the date of the Meeting; and
- (ii) the Shares may be issued at a price that is at a discount to the market price for those Shares on the date of issue.

(e) Allocation policy under the 7.1A Mandate

The recipients of the Equity Securities to be issued under the 7.1A Mandate have not yet been determined. However, the recipients of Equity Securities could consist of current Shareholders or new investors (or both), none of whom will be related parties of the Company.

The Company will determine the recipients at the time of the issue under the 7.1A Mandate, having regard to the following factors:

- (i) the purpose of the issue;
- (ii) alternative methods for raising funds available to the Company at that time, including, but not limited to, an entitlement issue, share purchase plan, placement or other offer where existing Shareholders may participate;
- (iii) the effect of the issue of the Equity Securities on the control of the Company;
- (iv) the circumstances of the Company, including, but not limited to, the financial position and solvency of the Company;
- (v) prevailing market conditions; and
- (vi) advice from corporate, financial and broking advisers (if applicable).

(f) Previous approval under Listing Rule 7.1A

The Company did not obtain approval under Listing Rule 7.1A at its annual general meeting held on 29 January 2021. Accordingly, the Company has not issued any Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the twelve months preceding the date of the Meeting.

4.3 Voting Exclusion Statement

A voting exclusion statement is included in Resolution 3 of this Notice.

¹ On 4 October 2022, the Company announced that it had lodged a prospectus for a fully underwritten non-renounceable entitlement issue of new Shares on the basis of one (1) new Share for every eight (8) Shares held, at an issue price of \$0.05 per new Share, together with one (1) free new Option for every one (1) new Share applied for and issued (Offer). It is assumed that 26,451,446 Shares will be issued under the Offer prior to the date of the Meeting.

5. RESOLUTIONS 4-7 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUES OF SHARES TO KLYP AUSTRALIA

5.1 Background

On 6 April 2021, the Company entered into a services agreement with Klyp Australia (**Klyp Services Agreement**), pursuant to which Klyp Australia agrees to provide outsourced additional software development, marketing and strategy services to the Company for a period of 12 months.

In consideration for the services, the Company has agreed to satisfy the amount owing to Klyp Australia (exclusive of GST) under the Klyp Services Agreement to be converted into Shares.

As at the date of the Company's Admission, the Company had issued a total of 2,021,451 Shares to Klyp Australia. Following the Company's Admission, the Company issued an additional 8,372,085 Shares to Klyp Australia, comprising:

- (a) 2,064,722 Shares issued at a deemed issue price of \$0.10 per Share on 17 June 2022 (the subject of Resolution 4);
- (b) 1,580,181 Shares issued at a deemed issue price of \$0.10 per Share on 27 July 2022 (the subject of Resolution 5);
- (c) 1,977,182 Shares issued at a deemed issue price of \$0.07 per Share on 5 August 2022 (the subject of Resolution 6); and
- (d) 2,750,000 Shares issued at a deemed issue price of \$0.058 per Share on 5 September 2022 (the subject of Resolution 7),
(together, the **Klyp Shares**).

Resolutions 4 to 7 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Klyp Shares to Klyp Australia.

5.2 General

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

It is noted that the Company's ability to utilise the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A for issues of equity securities following this Meeting remains conditional on Resolution 3 being passed at this Meeting.

- (f) the Klyp Shares were issued to Klyp Australia under the Klyp Services Agreement. A summary of the material terms of the Klyp Services Agreement is set out in Schedule 1.

6. RESOLUTIONS 8 AND 9 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF SHARES TO THE CFO SOLUTION

6.1 General

On 27 April 2022, the Company entered into a services agreement with The CFO Solution to provide certain finance, administration and secretarial services to the Company (**CFO Services Agreement**).  - (b) 284,483 Shares at a deemed issue price of \$0.058 on 5 September 2022 (the subject of Resolution 9),
- (together, the **CFO Solution Shares**).

As summarised in Section 5.1 above, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12-month period.

7. RESOLUTION 10 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF SEPTEMBER PLACEMENT SHARES

7.1 General

On 5 September 2022, the Company issued 11,000,000 Shares to AMRAM Corp Pty Ltd at an issue price of \$0.05 per Share to raise \$550,000 under a placement (**Placement Shares**). As summarised in Section 5.1 above, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12-month period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, an eligible entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25%.

The Company's ability to utilise the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A for issues of equity securities following this Meeting remains conditional on Resolution 3 being passed at this Meeting.

It is noted that the Company's ability to utilise the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A for issues of equity securities following this Meeting remains conditional on Resolution 3 being passed at this Meeting.

7.3 Technical information required by Listing Rule 7.5

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to Resolution 10:

- (a) the Placement Shares were issued to AMRAM Corp Pty Ltd;

 - (ii) issued more than 1% of the issued capital of the Company;
- (c) 11,000,000 Placement Shares were issued, and the Placement Shares issued were all fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company issued on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares;
- (d) the Placement Shares were issued on 5 September 2022;
- (e) the issue price was \$0.05 per Placement Shares. The Company has not and will not receive any other consideration for the issue of the Placement Shares;
- (f) the purpose of the issue of the Placement Shares was to raise \$550,000, which will be applied towards working capital; and
- (g) the Placement Shares were not issued pursuant to an agreement.

8. RESOLUTION 11 – APPROVAL TO ISSUE BROKER OPTIONS

8.1 General

On 13 February 2022, the Company entered into an agreement with Still Capital Pty Ltd (**Still Capital**) to provide services to the Company as a business development manager (**Still Capital Mandate**). Pursuant to the Still Capital Mandate, Still Capital provides ASX listing management and ongoing corporate relations services (**Services**).

The Company is seeking shareholder approval to issue 20,000,000 Options to Still Capital for ongoing corporate advisory services, which is in addition to the consideration paid to Still Capital under the Mandate (**Broker Options**).

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

The proposed issue of the Broker Options does not fall within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and exceeds the 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1. It therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.1.

8.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 11 is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of the Broker Options. In addition, the issue of the Broker Options will be excluded from the calculation of the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

If Resolution 11 is not passed, the issue of the Broker Options can still proceed but it will reduce, to that extent, the Company's capacity to issue equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for 12 months following the issue.

Resolution 11 seeks Shareholder approval for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1 for the issue of the Broker Options.

- (e) the purpose of the issue of the Broker Options is consideration for ongoing corporate advisory services provided to the Company by Still Capital;
- (f) the Broker Options are not being issued under an agreement; and
- (g) the Broker Options are not being issued under, or to fund, a reverse takeover.

Intellectual Property	Klyp Australia acknowledges and agrees that the Company will own all intellectual property rights in any work resulting from the Services rendered, including but not limited to, copyright and trademark rights. Klyp Australia will take all necessary steps as practicable to ensure that the intellectual property will vest in and remain vested in the Company. Klyp Australia further grants to the Company a non-exclusive, transferable, royalty free, perpetual license to use and intellectual property rights owned by Klyp Australia, which have been used in completion of the Services, that were already in existence prior to commencing the Services.

Termination by the Company

- (a) The Company may terminate the Klyp Services Agreement for any breach of the terms of this Klyp Services Agreement by providing 30 days written notice to Klyp Australia. The Company, at its discretion may allow Klyp Australia to remedy the breach within 14 days' notice or another timeframe as the Company elects, and in being satisfied with the remedy of the breach by Klyp Australia, the Company will not terminate the Klyp Services Agreement.

7. Timing of issue of Shares on exercise

Within 5 Business Days after the Exercise Date, the Company will:

- (a) issue the number of Shares required under these terms and conditions in respect of the number of Broker Options specified in the Notice of Exercise and for which cleared funds have been received by the Company;
