

Drilling commences at Ularring, targeting Ni-PGE and Cu-Au

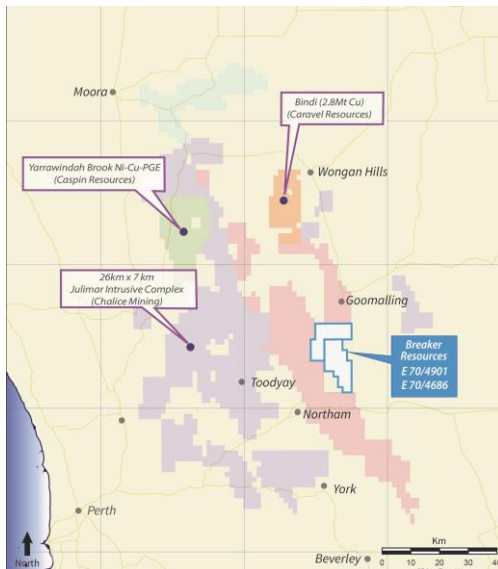
Breaker Resources NL (ASX: BRB; the **Company** or **Breaker**) wishes to advise that it has commenced diamond drilling at its 100% owned Ularring project in Western Australia.

The project is located 100km north east of Perth near the town of Northam, and 45km east of Chalice Mining's Julimar discovery. Breaker pegged this tenement in 2014, prior to the emergence of the region as a burgeoning mining jurisdiction, which also includes Caravel Mineral's 2.8Mt Bindi copper project.

A four-hole diamond drilling program, co-funded by the Western Australian government's Exploration Incentive Scheme, commenced this week to test Ni-PGE and Cu-Au targets.

The first diamond hole is designed to intercept an historical geophysical anomaly (FLTEM) interpreted to be sulphidic in nature, associated with copper anomalies at surface and never drill tested.

The remaining three diamond holes are planned at the Centre Forest copper-gold prospect, to test multiple metal anomalies directly east of historical drilling where intervals such as 61m at 0.87g/t Au and 25m at 0.47g/t Au and 0.18% Cu were reported. (WAMEX Report A64958).

About Breaker Resources

Breaker Resources NL is unlocking the potential of a major new greenfields gold district at its 100%-owned Lake Roe Gold Project, located 100km east of Kalgoorlie, Western Australia. This core project is situated between two operating gold mines on a recently identified southern extension of the 22Moz Laverton Tectonic Zone. After discovery of the Bombora deposit in 2015, drilling identified a typical Archean, multi-lode gold deposit hosted by dolerite. The project has the attributes of scale, high-grade and growth potential in a 9km-long gold system that is growing in several areas. Gold at the main Bombora deposit occurs in a 150m-wide zone, starting 5m from surface in a 3km-long single pit configuration with the flexibility to transition underground based on extensive high-grade lodes discovered below the open pit Resource since 2020. A December 2021 Resource update resulted in a Global Resource of 1.7Moz Au (32Mt @ 1.6g/t) across the project.

Breaker also owns the Ularring project located 100km north east of Perth. Breaker pegged this project in 2014 and it is now part of an exciting new mineral province in WA's Southwest Yilgarn following the world-class Julimar PGE-Ni discovery, and the growth of the 2.8Mt copper resource at Bindi 50km along strike from Breaker's Ularring project.
