RESULTS OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The 2022 Annual General Meeting of Shareholders of Cann Global Ltd (ASX:CGB, Company) was held on 30 November 2022 at 3.00 pm AEDT.

All resolutions voted on were in accordance with the Notice of General Meeting previously released. As Resolution 1 (Remuneration Report) was passed with a majority of less than 75%, Resolution 2 (Spill Resolution) was required to be put to the Meeting but was not passed. All resolutions (other than Resolution 2 as noted) were passed on a poll.

In accordance with Listing Rule 3.13.2 and section 251AA of the Corporations Act 2001, details of the results of voting and proxies are detailed in the attached Appendix A.
