1.2 Background to the Offers

1.2.1 Introduction

The Placement Offer

As announced on 15 February 2023, the Company secured funding of \$5 million (before associated costs) by a placement of 142,857,143 Shares (**Placement Shares**) to sophisticated and professional investors at an issue price of \$0.035 per Share (**Placement**).

The Company has agreed to issue one (1) free attaching New Option for every two (2) Placement Shares subscribed for and issued under the Placement.

The purpose of the Placement Offer being made under this Prospectus is to make the offer of approximately 71,428,572 New Options (subject to rounding of allocations under the Placement) to the participants that subscribed for and were allocated Placement Shares under the Placement (**Placement Participants**).

The Placement Shares are proposed to be issued on or about 23 February 2023 and in any event prior to the Closing Date of the Cleansing Offer.

The Broker Offer

The Company engaged PAC Partners Securities Pty Ltd (**Lead Manager**) to act as lead manager and bookrunner to the Placement. In consideration for lead manager services provided in relation to the Placement, the Company has agreed to:

- (a) pay the Lead Manager a selling fee of 6% plus GST on the total gross proceeds raised under the Placement; and
- (b) issue 14,000,000 New Options to the Lead Manager and certain other brokers who assisted with facilitation of the Placement (collectively with the Lead Manager, the **Brokers**).

The purpose of the Broker Offer being made under this Prospectus is to make the offer of 14,000,000 New Options to the Brokers.

- (b) 75,000,000 Placement Shares pursuant to the approval of Shareholders, which was obtained at the Company's annual general meeting held on 30 November 2022.

3. PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF THE OFFERS

3.1 Purpose and effect of the Placement Offer

The purpose of the Placement Offer is to remove any trading restrictions attaching to the New Options issued under the Placement Offer and any Shares issued on exercise of these New Options, given that the New Options offered under the Placement Offer are being issued with disclosure under this Prospectus.

Subject to ASX granting Official Quotation of the New Options, this will allow holders to trade the New Options on the ASX and ensure that any Shares issued on exercise of the New Options can be on-sold within 12 months of their issue, without a disclosure document for the on-sale offer.

No funds will be raised directly under the Placement Offer as the New Options are being issued free attaching at a nil issue price in accordance with the terms of the Placement. However, if all of the New Options are exercised, the Company will receive approximately \$4,285,714 in aggregate, by virtue of payment of the exercise price.

The principal effect of the Placement Offer, assuming all New Options offered under the Placement Offer are issued, will be to increase the total number of Options on issue by approximately 71,428,572 Options on completion of the Placement Offer.

3.2 Purpose and effect of the Broker Offer

The purpose of the Broker Offer is to remove any trading restrictions attaching to the New Options issued under the Broker Offer and any Shares issued on exercise of these New Options, given that the New Options offered under the Broker Offer are being issued with disclosure under this Prospectus.

Subject to ASX granting Official Quotation of the New Options, this will allow holders to trade the New Options on the ASX and ensure that any Shares issued on exercise of the New Options can be on-sold within 12 months of their issue, without a disclosure document for the on-sale offer.

No funds will be raised directly under the Broker Offer as the New Options are being issued in consideration for lead manager services provided by the Brokers in relation to the Placement. However, if all of the New Options are exercised, the Company will receive approximately \$840,000 in aggregate, by virtue of payment of the exercise price.

The principal effect of the Broker Offer, assuming all New Options offered under the Broker Offer are issued, will be to increase the total number of Options on issue by 14,000,000 Options on completion of the Broker Offer.

3.3 Purpose and effect of the Cleansing Offer

The purpose of the Cleansing Offer is to remove any trading restrictions that may have attached to Shares issued by the Company without disclosure under Chapter 6D of the Corporations Act prior to the Closing Date of the Cleansing Offer (including prior to the date of this Prospectus). Accordingly, the purpose of the Cleansing Offer is not to raise capital.

All of the funds raised under the Cleansing Offer (if any) will be applied towards the expenses of the Offers. On that basis, there will be no surplus proceeds from the Cleansing Offer. Refer to Section 6.7 for further details relating to the estimated expenses of the Offers.

3.4 Financial effects of the Offers

The New Options to be issued pursuant to the Options Offers will be issued at a nil issue price. Accordingly, there will be no immediate effect on the Company's balance sheet. However, capital will be raised if the New Options are exercised, which will affect the Company's balance sheet.

The Company is unable to specify with any certainty the extent of any change to the balance sheet, given that there is no certainty if or when any of the New Options will be exercised.

The expenses of the Offers (exceeding any amount raised under the Cleansing Offer) will be met from the Company's existing cash reserves.

Accordingly, the Offers will have an effect on the Company's financial position, being the decrease in the Company's existing cash reserves.

4. RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES ATTACHING TO SECURITIES

4.1 Terms and conditions of New Options

The terms and conditions of the New Options are set out below:

(a) **Entitlement**

(b) Exercise Price

(g) Timing of issue of Shares on exercise

(h) Shares issued on exercise

Shares issued on exercise of the New Options rank equally with the then issued shares of the Company.

(i) Reconstruction of capital

If at any time the issued capital of the Company is reconstructed, all rights of an Optionholder are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules at the time of the reconstruction.

(j) Participation in new issues

There are no participation rights or entitlements inherent in the New Options and holders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of capital offered to Shareholders during the currency of the New Options without exercising the New Options.

4.2 Rights and liabilities attaching to Shares

The following is a summary of the more significant rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares, being the underlying security of the New Options being offered pursuant to this Prospectus. This summary is not exhaustive and does not constitute a definitive statement of the rights and liabilities of Shareholders. To obtain such a statement, persons should seek independent legal advice.

Full details of the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares are set out in the Constitution, a copy of which is available for inspection at the Company's registered office during normal business hours.

(a) General meetings

Shareholders are entitled to be present in person, or by proxy, attorney or representative to attend and vote at general meetings of the Company. The Company's constitution permits the use of technology at general meetings of shareholders (including wholly virtual meetings) to the extent permitted under the Corporations Act, Listing Rules and applicable law.

Shareholders may requisition meetings in accordance with section 249D of the Corporations Act and the Constitution of the Company.

(b) Voting rights

Subject to any rights or restrictions for the time being attached to any class or classes of shares, at general meetings of shareholders or classes of shareholders:

- (i) each Shareholder entitled to vote may vote in person or by proxy, attorney or representative;
- (ii) on a show of hands, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder has one vote; and
- (iii) on a poll, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder shall, in respect of each fully paid Share held by him, or in respect of which he is appointed a proxy, attorney or representative, have one vote for each Share held, but in respect of partly paid shares shall have such number of votes as bears the same proportion to the total of such Shares registered in the Shareholder's name as the amount paid (not credited) bears to the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited).

Where there are 2 or more joint holders of a Share and more than one of them is present at a meeting and tenders a vote in respect of the Share, the Company will count only the vote cast by the member whose name appears first in the Company's register of members.

(c) Issues of further Shares

The Directors may, on behalf of the Company, issue, grant options over unissued shares to any person on the terms, with the rights, and at the times that the Directors decide. However, the Directors must act in accordance with the restrictions imposed by the Constitution, ASX Listing Rules, the Corporations Act and any rights for the time being attached to the shares in any special class of those shares.

(d) Variation of Rights

Unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of a class of shares and subject to the Corporations Act, the rights attached to the shares in any class may be varied or cancelled only with the written consent of the holders of at least three-quarters of the issued shares of the affected class, or by special resolution passed at a separate meeting of the holders of the issued shares of the affected class.

(e) Transfer of Shares

Subject to the Constitution, the Corporations Act and ASX Listing Rules, Shares are freely transferable.

The Shares may be transferred by a proper transfer effected in accordance with the ASX Settlement Operating Rules, by any other method of transferring or dealing with Shares introduced by ASX and as otherwise permitted by the Corporations Act or by a written instrument of transfer in any usual form or in any other form approved by either the Directors or ASX that is permitted by the Corporations Act.

The Directors may decline to register a transfer of Shares (other than a proper transfer in accordance with the ASX Settlement Operating Rules) where permitted to do so under the ASX Listing Rules. If the Directors decline to register a transfer, the Company must, within 5 Business Days after the transfer is delivered to the Company, give the party lodging the transfer written notice of the refusal and the reason for the refusal. The Directors must decline to register a transfer of Shares when required by law, by the ASX Listing Rules or by the ASX Settlement Operating Rules.

(f) Dividends

The Directors may from time to time determine dividends to be distributed to members according to their rights and interests. The Directors may fix the time for distribution and the methods of distribution. Subject to the terms of issue of shares, the Company may pay a dividend on one class of shares to the exclusion of another class.

Each share carries the right to participate in the dividend in the same proportion that the amount for the time being paid on the share (not credited) bears to the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited) in respect of such shares.

(g) Dividend reinvestment and Share plans

Subject to the requirements in the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules, the Directors may implement and maintain dividend reinvestment plans (under which any member may elect that dividends payable by the Company be reinvested by way of subscription for fully paid shares in the Company).

(h) Capitalisation of profits

Subject to the ASX Listing Rules and any rights or restrictions attaching to any class of shares, the Company may capitalise profits. Members are entitled to participate in a capital distribution in the same proportions in which they are entitled to participate in dividends.

(i) Winding-up

Subject to the rights of holders of shares with special rights in a windingup and the Corporations Act, if the Company is wound up all monies and property that are to be distributed among Shareholders on a winding-up, shall be distributed in proportion to the Shares held by them respectively, irrespective of the amount paid-up or credited as paid-up on the Shares.

(j) Shareholder liability
