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Rey Resources Limited (ASX: REY) ("Rey" or "the Company") is focused on developing its oil and gas interests in the Canning and Perth Basins, Western Australia.

1. Oil and Gas

1.1 Fitzroy Blocks (EP457 and EP458)




Figure 1: The three major prospective trends relative to Fitzroy Blocks EP457 and EP458 and Derby Block EP487.

The Fitzroy Blocks are located in the Canning Basin in the northwest of Western Australia (refer Figure 1 below).

On 13 February 2023, Rey announced that Origin has decided to withdraw from the Canning Basin and the 40% interests in each of the tenements previously assigned to Origin under the farm-in agreement will be assigned back to Buru and Rey equally in accordance with the pre-farmin equities. Buru will remain as operator with a participating interest of 60% in each of the tenements, with Rey holding the remaining 40%.

A technical committee meeting was held between the joint venture parties, the initial new 2D seismic interpretation has been presented to Rey. An integrity work program for the commitment well drilling before June 2025 has been proposed and is under review by Rey.

1.2 Derby Block (EP487)

The Company currently holds a 100% interest in petroleum exploration permit EP487, the Derby Block, via its 100% owned subsidiaries Rey Lennard Shelf Pty Ltd and Rey Derby Block Pty Ltd.




Figure 2: Interpreted extent of the Laurel Basin gas system in relation to Rey's petroleum interests (after Buru and others).

The Derby Block is considered to be predominantly a Wet Laurel Basin Centred Gas play (BCG) which is regionally extensive throughout the Canning Basin (refer to Figures 2 below) and has been the subject of exploration elsewhere in the Canning Basin by other parties in 2015, resulting in encouraging flow tests by Buru at Valhalla and Asgard.

Based on the assessment of the permit carried out by Rey, a 500km2 3D seismic has been proposed. The initial seismic design has been drafted and under adjustment with environmental and technical contractors. The stakeholder contacting will be commenced shortly once the seismic line is firmed. Rey plans to complete all new seismic preparation work before end of 2023.

1.3 Lennard Shelf Blocks (EP104, R1 and L15)




Figure 3: Location of Lennard Shelf Blocks

Rey holds a 100% interest in the Lennard Shelf Blocks, comprising EP104, a Retention Lease (R1) and one Production Licence (L15). The Lennard Shelf Blocks are situated to the north of Rey's existing interests in the Canning Basin (refer Figure 3) petroleum exploration licence, EP487 covering a total area of approximately 1,145 km² and are considered prospective for conventional oil and tight gas.

Rey has contacted the contractor for the committed study work for current permit year and initial work scope has been received. Rey is aiming to complete the work in the following quarter.

During the report period, Rey received indicative approval for the renewal of EP104. About 50% of the permit blocks have been dropped in accordance with the renewal rules. Once the renewal is formally approved, Rey will start the proposed commitment for exploration of the great oil resources potential.

1.4 Coal

The Duchess Paradise Coal Project (**DP Project**) is a proposed bituminous thermal coal operation located in the Canning Basin of Western Australia and is partly contiguous with the Fitzroy Blocks.

As requested by the Native Title, Rey has agreed to attend the face to face meeting proposed in April/May 2023. Rey believes the meeting will provide opportunity for the Native Title holders to better understand the project and to ask questions. It may also help on the progress of the heritage protection agreement negotiation.

2. Corporate

On 6 March 2023, the Company announced the appointment of Mr William Kuan as Director of the Company.

During the quarter, the Company bought back 23,862 shares under the on-market buyback program at an average price of \$0.0938 per share.

As at the quarter ended 31 March 2023, the Company maintained a cash balance of \$115,000 and available loan facilities from Ms Wanyan Liu and ASF Group Limited of \$2.72 million and \$2 million respectively.

As required pursuant to section 6 of the Company's Appendix 5B, the Company paid approximately \$52,000 to related parties during the quarter, of which \$13,500 were consulting fees and \$38,676 were Director fees.
