Netlinkz executes key partnerships during the June quarter to underpin long-term revenue growth

Netlinkz achieves significant revenue growth in the June quarter and the financial year ended 30 June 2023, and signs key partnership agreements to further accelerate commercial growth in the next financial year

Highlights

- Group revenue for the June quarter of \$5.5 million was a 90% increase over the same quarter in the prior year, and a 17% increase on the third quarter. Revenue for the year was \$20.7 million, a 32% increase on the prior year
- Cash receipts for the June quarter were \$5.3 million, bringing cash receipts for the year to \$20.9 million, a 24% increase on the prior year
- Satellites Division (Starlink) sales contributed ~\$1 million during the quarter, with future sales pipeline strengthened by partnership agreements with Spark in New Zealand, PT&T in the Philippines and Telestar in Australia
- Network-as-a-Service (NaaS) joint product development with Hutchison Global Communications (HGC) has continued, with customer trials expected to commence in the quarter ending 30 September 2023
- Recognised as a Fast Global Company (ranked #20) by the Australian Financial Review as a result of commercial growth achieved in international markets between 2019 and 2022

Netlinkz Limited (ASX:NET) ("Netlinkz" or "the Company") is pleased to provide its Appendix 4C for the quarter ended 30 June 2023 (June quarter) along with the following operational update for its key business divisions.

Significant revenue growth achieved and major strategic partnerships agreed

Satellites Division (Starlink)

In November 2022, the Company entered into an agreement with Space Exploration Technology Corp. (SpaceX) for Netlinkz to be a global reseller of the enterprise, mobile and maritime Starlink satellite based high-speed, low-latency broadband internet.

Netlinkz commenced sales of the product in February 2023, and derived ~\$1 million revenue during the June quarter. The NaaS Starlink bundle is proving to be a compelling offer which provides customers with a fully encrypted invisible private network for all devices connected to the network that access the internet.

The Company is developing sales channels via a limited partner network and has to date signed a number of substantial partnership agreements, including with Spark for New Zealand, PT&T for the Philippines and Telestar for Australia. Additional partnership agreements are under negotiation for further markets. Netlinkz also expects new opportunities as Starlink opens up additional eligible countries for satellite internet services. The Company is investing in operations and after sales support services to support the delivery of the service to end customers.



A further \$3.0 million (including tax) was invested in Starlink inventory during the June quarter, bringing the total investment to \$8.0 million (including tax). The company does not have any future purchase commitments with Starlink. The Company will purchase additional equipment in order to meet demand, and as such expects these future purchases to be aligned with contractual sales arrangements.

Network-as-a-Service (NaaS)

The Company is partnering with HGC Global Communications (HGC) on building an integrated global communication platform, Network as a Service (NaaS) for enterprises, based on VSN. Phase 1 will be the rollout of the NaaS for enterprises based in Thailand. This will be followed by a roll out across the South-East Asia region.

During the June quarter, joint development activity was undertaken by both parties to integrate the Netlinkz product to enable a bundled roll-out. Netlinkz expects the first customer trials to commence in the quarter ending 30 September 2023.

Netlinkz has partnered with Dipole, who has significant depth of expertise in our sector, to assist with the rollout of the NaaS and work with customers to implement the NaaS. Dipole is an organization that has over 120 network engineers deployed at various customer locations within Australia and Asia that will provide customer support and servicing. The Dipole partnership ensures Netlinkz maintains a control on its costs but doesn't compromise on the planned speed of the roll out of our key NaaS project.

SSI Telecom Surveillance

SSI Telecom surveillance business continues to perform strongly with revenue of \$1.2 million in the June quarter, an 161% increase over the same quarter in the prior year, and revenue for the year of \$3.9 million, an 83% increase over the prior year. The increase was driven by critical project work for two key customers in Australia and New Zealand.

China Network Engineering Solutions

The China Network Engineering Solutions business (AOFA and iLinkAll) also continued to grow its revenue. Revenue for the quarter of \$3.3 million was a 53% increase over the same quarter in the prior year, and revenue for the year of \$14.9 million was a 20% increase over the prior year. The business achieved this growth by fostering key partner relationships with major Chinese and international technology businesses.

Southcloud ISP

Southcloud was acquired in June 2022. The Company has just concluded a strategic review of the business which is to be implemented for the 2024 financial year. The business is to focus on growing its NBN customer base (both retail and enterprise) and connecting enterprise customers in regional Australia to satellite internet services via Netlinkz.

Overall group results

The Group derived revenue for the quarter of \$5.5 million was a 90% increase over the same quarter in the prior year, and revenue for the year of \$20.7m was a 32% increase over the prior year.

Total cash receipts from customers were \$5.3 million for the June quarter, bringing cash receipts for the year to \$20.9 million, a 24% increase on the prior year.

Payments for operating costs for the June quarter included \$3.0 million payments for Starlink equipment. At 30 June 2023, the Company held \$6.5 million in Starlink inventory.

Gross margins were in excess of 20% and were largely unchanged from the prior year. Gross margins are expected to increase once higher volume Starlink sales occur and high margin NaaS subscription revenues grow. Cash outflows on product manufacturing costs will vary between quarters due to timing of payments.



Research and development costs were \$343k for the June quarter, and \$1.5 million for the year as the Company continues to develop enhancements to its Network-as-a-Service suite of products and services, and invest in the integration of the NaaS and Starlink satellite.

Initial Starlink equipment purchases completed and cost reduction measures implemented to balance investment and growth

The Company continues to manage its cost base, with staff costs, administration and corporate costs of \$2.6 million continuing a quarter-on-quarter downward trend, whilst still supporting significant business growth.

Cash at the end of the quarter was \$0.7 million. The Company has unused facilities of \$6.75 million (see analysis in Item 7 below).

Equity facility agreement

At 30 June 2023 the Company had drawn down \$7.0 million of the Regal Funds Management Pty Ltd (Regal) \$20.5 million facility. These funds were principally used to fund Starlink equipment purchases. No drawn downs were made during the June quarter.

At the time the Regal facility was put in place it was not intended to fund the purchase of Starlink equipment. The Company has currently reached its share issuance capacity under the Regal facility (not the drawdown limit) and are in confidential discussions with Regal on its operation going forward.

Debt facilities

\$3.425 million was drawn down from debt facilities during the June quarter. \$2.0 million was drawn from a new facility from AFGS Capital Pty Ltd to fund the purchase of Starlink inventory. The remaining \$1.425 million was drawn from the facility from Booker Super Services Pty Ltd to fund ongoing working capital.

At 30 June 2023 the Company had \$7.25 million in outstanding debt, of which \$4.0m was current.

Board and Management

The Company paid directors \$106,000 during the quarter comprised of salaries, superannuation, and expense reimbursements.

During the June quarter, Mr Jordi Martin joined as Chief Operating Officer. Mr Martin is an experienced executive and has held senior roles with LendLease and JLL (Jones Lang LaSalle). He was CEO of JLL's APAC property outsourcing business from 2014 to 2023, based out of Singapore. He brings extensive skills to improve the Company's operation delivery.

Netlinkz Managing Director & CEO James Tsiolis said: "We have made great progress during the quarter, signing significant partnerships to accelerate our Starlink rollout, and moving our NaaS collaboration with HGC through some key hurdles. We expect further progress in both areas during the next quarter as Netlinkz transitions to the next stage of growth."

The Company entered into an unsecured short-term facility of \$4.0 million provided by Juel Finance Pty Ltd to fund equipment purchases from Starlink Internet Services Pte Limited, at an interest rate of 20% per annum. The facility is unsecured, with a maturity date of 30 September 2023.

The Company entered into a short-term loan arrangement for \$2.0 million with AFSG Capital Pty Ltd to fund equipment purchases from Starlink Internet Services Pte Limited, at an interest rate of 30% per annum. The facility is secured, with a maturity date of 16 August 2023.

See ASX Announcement 1 August 2022. The Company entered an equity facility agreement with Regal Funds Management Pty Limited (Regal) for an amount up to \$20.5 million. The facility is for a period of 3 years, with terms as outlined in the ASX announcement.

^{*} As at 30 June 2023 the Company could not issue further shares to Regal under the facility agreement and is in discussion with Regal on the use of the facility going forward. Therefore, the undrawn value of the facility has not been included as part of unused financing facilities available at quarter end.
