The Board of Lynch Group Holdings Limited (ACN 608 543 219) (the **Company**) is pleased to provide information in relation to its 2023 annual general meeting of Shareholders.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that the Company will hold its annual general meeting of the Shareholders on Friday, 24 November 2023 at 10:30am (AEDT) (the **Meeting**).

Participation of Shareholders

The Company is pleased to invite Shareholders to attend the meeting in person. Shareholders will be able to submit questions at the meeting, or prior to the Meeting through the Company's Share Registry's website at: https://investorcentre.linkgroup.com.

Voting eligibility

The Directors of the Company have determined that pursuant to Regulation 7.11.37 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001* (Cth) persons who are registered holders of shares in the Company at 7:00pm (AEDT) on 22 November 2023 will, for the purposes of determining voting entitlements at the Meeting, be taken to be the Shareholders of the Company. Shareholders may vote by accessing the online voting platform at: https://investorcentre.linkgroup.com.

Proxies and authorised representatives

A Shareholder who is entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting has the right to appoint a proxy to attend and vote for them. The proxy does not have to be a Shareholder.





Shareholders who are entitled to cast two or more votes can appoint either one or two proxies to attend virtually and vote at the Meeting on that Shareholder's behalf. Where two proxies are appointed, the appointing Shareholder can specify the number of votes or the proportion of the Shareholder's votes they want each proxy to exercise. If no number or proportion is specified, each proxy may exercise half of the Shareholder's votes.

Corporate Shareholders must provide the Company with satisfactory evidence of the appointment of any corporate representative under section 250D of the Corporations Act prior to the commencement of the Meeting.

A proxy can be either an individual or a body corporate. Should you appoint a body corporate as your proxy, that body corporate will need to ensure that it:

- appoints an individual as its corporate representative to exercise its powers at meetings;
 and
- provides the Company with satisfactory evidence of the appointment of its corporate representative under section 250D of the Corporations Act prior to commencement of the Meeting.

If a proxy appointment is signed by the Shareholder but does not name the proxy or proxies in whose favour it is given, the Chair will be deemed to have been appointed as the proxy. In addition, if you direct your proxy how to vote and your nominated proxy does not attend the Meeting, or attends but does not vote on a poll on a resolution, the Chair of the Meeting will act in place of the nominated proxy and vote in accordance with any instructions.

A voting/proxy form is included with this Notice of Meeting. If you wish to appoint two proxies, please obtain an additional form from Link Market Services Limited (**Share Registry**), or make a photocopy of the enclosed proxy form. To be effective, a duly completed proxy form and the power of attorney (if any) under which the proxy form is signed or a certified copy of the relevant authority must be received by the Share Registry at least 48 hours before the start of the Meeting, being no later than 10:30am (AEDT) on 22 November 2023.

BUSINESS OF THE MEETING

Ordinary Business

1. Financial Statements and Reports

To receive and consider the Financial Report, Directors' Report and Auditor's Report for the Company for the year ended 2 July 2023.

2. Resolution 1 – Adoption of Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an ordinary resolution of the Company:

"THAT pursuant to and in accordance with section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Annual Report for the financial year ended 2 July 2023."

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors of the Company.

Voting Exclusion Statement for Resolution 1:

In respect of Resolution 1, in accordance with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast:

- by or on behalf of a member of the Key Management Personnel (KMP) named in the Remuneration Report for the year ended 2 July 2023, or that KMP's Closely Related Party, regardless of the capacity in which the vote is cast; and
- as a proxy by a member of the KMP at the date of the Meeting, or that KMP's Closely Related Party,

unless the vote is cast as a proxy for a person who is entitled to vote on Resolution 1:

- in accordance with their directions of how to vote as set out in the proxy form; or
- by the Chair pursuant to an express authorisation on the proxy form to vote as the proxy decides, even though Resolution 1 is connected with the remuneration of the KMP.





If the Chair is your proxy or is appointed as your proxy by default, and you do not direct the Chair how to vote on Resolution 1 on your proxy form, you will be expressly authorising the Chair to vote on Resolution 1 as the Chair sees fit. The Chair intends to vote undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 1.

3. Resolution 2: Re-election of Director: Peter Clare

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an ordinary resolution of the Company:

"THAT Peter Clare, having retired from his office as Director in accordance with clause 20.2 of the Constitution and ASX Listing Rule 14.5, and being eligible, having offered himself for election, be elected as a Director of the Company."

The Chair intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of this Resolution.

4. Resolution 3: Re-election of Director: Peter Arkell

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an ordinary resolution of the Company:

"THAT Peter Arkell, having retired from his office as Director in accordance with clause 20.2 of the Constitution and ASX Listing Rule 14.5, and being eligible, having offered himself for election, be elected as a Director of the Company."

The Chair intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of this Resolution.

Special Business

1. Resolution 4: Issue of Options to Executive Director Hugh Toll

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an ordinary resolution of the Company:

"THAT for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 10.14 and for all other purposes, approval be given for the grant of options to the Chief Executive Officer and Executive Director, Hugh Toll under the Company's long-term incentive scheme, in accordance with the terms of the Company's long-term incentive scheme and as described in the Explanatory Notes."





Voting Exclusion Statement for Resolution 4

In respect of Resolution 4, in accordance with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of Resolution 4:

- by or on behalf of any Director who is eligible to participate in the Company's longterm incentive scheme (LTI Scheme) or a person referred to in ASX Listing Rule 10.14.1, 10.14.2 or 10.14.3 who is eligible to participate in the LTI Scheme, and any of their associates or Closely Related Parties (together, Excluded Persons), regardless of the capacity in which the vote is cast; and
- as a proxy by an Excluded Person,

unless the vote is cast:

- as a proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on Resolution 4 in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the resolution in that way;
- by the Chair of the Meeting as a proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on Resolution 4, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair where the proxy appointment expressly authorises the Chair to vote on the resolution as the Chair decides, even though Resolution 4 is connected with the remuneration of KMP; or
- by a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - o the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on Resolution 4; and
 - o the holder votes on Resolution 4 in accordance with the directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

If the Chair is your proxy or is appointed as your proxy by default, and you do not direct the Chair how to vote on Resolution 4 on your proxy form, you will be expressly authorising the Chair to vote on Resolution 4 as the Chair sees fit. The Chair intends to vote undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 4.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Explanatory Notes have been prepared to provide information that the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass a Resolution.

1. Financial Statements and Reports

The Corporations Act requires the Financial Report (which includes the Directors' Declaration, Directors' Report and Auditor's Report (Annual Report)) to be received and considered at the Meeting. The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Annual Report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's Annual Report is available on its website at https://www.lynchgroup.com.au/investor-centre/results-reports-and-announcements. Those Shareholders who have specifically requested a hard copy of the 2023 Annual Report will receive it by mail.

Questions and Comments

Shareholders will be given a reasonable opportunity to ask guestions about, and make comments on, the Annual Report and the audit and the management of the Company at the Meeting. Neither the Corporations Act nor the Constitution requires Shareholders to vote on the Annual Report. Shareholders will also have a reasonable opportunity at the Meeting to ask Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu, the Company's auditor, questions about their Auditor's Report. Alternatively, you can submit written questions to the auditor about their Auditor's Report. A list of questions for the auditor will be available at the Meeting.

As there is no requirement for a formal resolution on this item, a resolution will not be put to the Meeting.

2. Resolution 1: Adoption of Remuneration Report

The Remuneration Report of the Company for the financial year ended 2 July 2023 is set out in the Company's 2023 Annual Report. The Remuneration Report includes:

- details of the remuneration provided to the Non-Executive Directors and other Key Management Personnel for the year ended 2 July 2023;
- discussion of the Board's policy in relation to the nature and level of remuneration of the Directors, Chief Executive Officer and other Key Management Personnel, including in relation to performance hurdles; and
- discussion of the relationship between the Board's remuneration policy and the Company's financial performance.





Shareholders will be requested to vote on the Remuneration Report. However, the Shareholder vote is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company. Nevertheless, the Board will take into account the outcome of the vote when considering the future remuneration arrangements of the Company. The Chair will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders to ask questions about, or make comments on, the Remuneration Report at the Meeting.

Recommendation

The Directors abstain, in the interests of good corporate governance, from making a recommendation in relation to this Resolution.

3. Resolution 2: Re-election of Peter Clare

The ASX Listing Rules and the Constitution require that an election of Directors must take place each year. In accordance with the requirements of the ASX Listing Rules and the terms of the Constitution, Peter Clare retires by rotation at the close of the Meeting and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election as a Director.

Peter was appointed to the Board in February 2021 as an independent Non-Executive Director.

With an extensive corporate career in banking and broad industry experience, Peter has served on a variety of boards in the technology and finance industries in Australia and New Zealand. Peter is currently a Non-Executive Director of Heritage Bank and SilverChef.

Peter was formerly the CEO of Westpac New Zealand and prior to that, held numerous roles within Westpac and St. George and Commonwealth Bank. Peter's career began as an insolvency practitioner and included a number of years as a management consultant.

Peter holds a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of New South Wales and a Master of Business Administration from Macquarie University. Peter is also a member of the Australian Institute of Company Directors, Governance Institute of Australia and a fellow of CPA Australia and the Financial Services Institute of Australasia (FINSIA).

Peter is Chair of the Audit and Risk Committee and is a Member of the Remuneration and Nomination Committee.

Recommendation

The Board (other than Peter Clare, who has abstained from making a recommendation on this Resolution due to his personal interest) recommends that you vote in favour of this Resolution.





4. Resolution 3: Re-election of Peter Arkell

The ASX Listing Rules and the Constitution require that an election of Directors must take place each year. In accordance with the requirements of the ASX Listing Rules and the terms of the Constitution, Peter Arkell retires by rotation at the close of the Meeting and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election as a Director.

Peter was appointed to the Board in February 2021 as an independent Non-Executive Director.

Peter is currently the Managing Director of Carrington Day, a consulting company based in China which assists international companies to operate effectively in China. He was previously Non-Executive Director of the Group's China operations between January 2018 and February 2022.

Peter has been based in Shanghai since 2004. He is an active member of the international business community in China, having been on the board of directors and Chair of AustCham Shanghai, the Australian Chamber of Commerce. He is the Chair of the Global Mining Association of China, the representative body of the international mining community in China. Peter is also a founder and Non-Executive Director of the GE Morrison Institute, a China-Australia business focused think tank.

He was appointed for 2019-2024 to the panel of mediators of the Shenzhen International Mediation and Arbitration Centre of China Mining. In addition, Peter was a Board Member of the China International Mining Cooperation Committee, a sounding board for the Chinese Ministry of Commerce on outbound investment.

Peter has an extensive network at the most senior levels of international and Chinese business and government in China.

Peter is a member of each of the Audit and Risk Committee and the Remuneration and Nomination Committee.

Recommendation

The Board (other than Peter Arkell, who has abstained from making a recommendation on this Resolution due to his personal interest) recommends that you vote in favour of this Resolution.





5. Resolution 4: Issue of Options to Executive Director Hugh Toll

5.1. General

The Company has offered a Long-term incentive scheme (LTI Scheme) in the financial year ended 2 July 2023 to assist in the motivation, reward and retention of Senior Executives and other selected Senior Managers. The LTI Scheme is designed to align participants' interests with the interests of Shareholders by providing participants an opportunity to receive Shares in the Company through the granting of Options.

The Company is seeking approval for all purposes, including ASX Listing Rule 10.14, for the award of 772,649 Options to CEO and Executive Director, Hugh Toll, under the LTI Scheme in order to issue Hugh Toll with Options to the value of 60% of his total fixed remuneration of \$632,225. If Shareholders do not approve Resolution 4, the Company will consider alternative arrangements to appropriately remunerate and incentivise Hugh Toll.

A summary of the material terms of the LTI Scheme, under which the Options will be offered, is contained in Appendix A of this Notice of Meeting. Any issue of securities in respect of the Options granted to the CEO (or associate of the CEO) requires the approval of Shareholders.

5.2. Regulatory requirements of ASX Listing Rule 10.14

ASX Listing Rule 10.14 provides that a listed entity must not permit any of the following persons to acquire equity securities under an employee incentive scheme without the approval of the holders of its ordinary securities:

- a director of the entity (ASX Listing Rule 10.14.1);
- (b) an associate of a director of the entity (ASX Listing Rule 10.14.2); or
- a person whose relationship with the entity or a person referred to in ASX Listing Rule 10.14.1 or 10.14.2 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the acquisition should be approved by its security holders (ASX Listing Rule 10.14.3).

If approval is given for the issue of Options to Hugh Toll as contemplated by Resolution 4 under ASX Listing Rule 10.14, further approval is not required (and will not be sought) under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 for any resulting securities to be issued or transferred to or on behalf of Hugh Toll following the vesting and exercise of those Options.

5.3. Information required by ASX Listing Rule 10.15

Pursuant to and in accordance with the requirements of ASX Listing Rule 10.15, in addition to the information set out above, the following information is provided for the purposes of Resolution 4:

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval for the issue of Options to Hugh Toll;





- Hugh Toll is an Executive Director of the Company and therefore falls within ASX Listing (b) Rule 10.14.1;
- The total number of Options proposed to be issued to Hugh Toll is 772,649; (c)
- (d) Hugh Toll's current total fixed remuneration package is as follows:
 - Annual cash salary (exclusive of superannuation): \$604,725; (i)
 - (ii) Post-employment benefits (superannuation): \$27,500;
 - Short-term cash bonus (at risk, assuming maximum achievement): \$505,780;
 - (iv) Long-term equity-based incentives (at risk, assuming maximum achievement): \$379,335; and
 - Total current remuneration package: \$1,517,340.
- (e) Under the LTI Scheme, Hugh Toll has previously been issued:
 - (i) 83,333 Options at no cost with an exercise price of \$3.60 on 6 April 2021;
 - (ii) 191,896 Options at no cost with an exercise price of \$3.60 on 26 November 2021; and
 - (iii) 817,567 Options at no cost with an exercise price of \$2.24 on 25 November 2022.
- A summary of the material terms of the Options is set out at section 5.4 below; (f)
- The Board considers that the Options are an appropriate form of incentive on the basis (g) that:
 - (i) the Options retain and reward Hugh Toll for the achievement of long-term business objectives;
 - (ii) Hugh Toll will only obtain value from the Options upon satisfaction of the relevant vesting conditions; and
 - Options are simple to understand, likely to be highly valued by executives (and therefore retentive and incentivising) and are designed to attract, retain and reward quality executives for successfully delivering long-term objectives of the Company;
- (h) The Board attributes a fair value of between \$0.45 and \$0.50 for the Options as calculated by an independent valuer. Specific details of the fair value measurement are as follows:
 - Tranche 1 vesting on 30 June 2026 TSR \$0.45 / EPS \$0.48; (i)
 - (ii) Tranche 2 vesting on 30 June 2027 – TSR \$0.48 / EPS \$0.49; and
 - Tranche 3 vesting on 30 June 2028 TSR \$0.48 / EPS \$0.50.

Fair value has been measured using the Black Scholes option pricing model for the EPS and the Monte Carlo simulation pricing model for the TSR threshold. Details of the inputs





- used in the measurement of fair value as at the grant date of the Options are set out in Appendix B of this Notice of Meeting;
- The Options will be issued to Hugh Toll as soon as practicable following Shareholder (i) approval, and no later than 1 year after the date of the Meeting;
- The Options will be issued to Hugh Toll for no consideration. Each Option has an (i) exercise price of \$1.84;
- A summary of the material terms of the LTI Scheme, under which the Options will be (k) offered, is contained in Appendix A of this Notice of Meeting;
- (I) No loan will be made to Hugh Toll in respect of the grant of Options the subject of this Resolution 4:
- Details of the Options issued under Resolution 4, along with any other securities issued under the LTI Scheme, will be published in the Annual Report of the Company relating to the period in which they are issued, along with a statement that they were issued pursuant to approval obtained under ASX Listing Rule 10.14;
- Any additional persons covered by ASX Listing Rule 10.14 who become entitled to (n) participate in any issue of securities under the LTI Scheme after this Resolution 4 is passed and who was not named in this Notice of Meeting will not participate in the LTI Scheme until approval is obtained under that rule;
- A voting exclusion statement in respect of Resolution 4 is included in the Notice of (o) Meeting.

5.4. Summary of the material terms of the Options

The key terms of the Options proposed to be granted to Hugh Toll in this Resolution 4 are set out below:

Term	Description			
Eligibility	Hugh Toll is eligible to participate in the LTI Scheme.			
Grants	The maximum notional value of Options offered to the Hugh Toll CEO is 60% of his total fixed remuneration. 772,649 Options over Shares are subject to Shareholder approval in this Resolution 4.			
Vesting conditions	Options vest subject to an earnings per share (EPS) hurdle and a total shareholder return (TSR) hurdle over the performance period. 50% of the Options are subject to the EPS hurdle with the remaining 50% subject to the TSR hurdle.			
Limited Audience	The EPS vesting percentages will correspond to the Company's annual compounding EPS growth over the performance period (adjusted where necessary to take into account one-off items as determined by the Board), and are as follows:			





- Annual compounding EPS less than 8%: 0% of Options will vest;
- Annual compounding EPS equal to 8%: 0% of Options will vest;
- Annual compounding EPS between 8% and 12%: Options will vest on a straight-line pro rata basis between 0% and 100%; and
- Annual compounding EPS greater than 12%: 100% of Options will vest.

The TSR vesting percentages will be determined by comparison of the Company's TSR against the TSR of companies which comprise the ASX300 index:

- Company TSR in the bottom quartile (0%-25%) of the ASX300 index: 0% of Options will vest;
- Company TSR in the second quartile (25%-50%) of the ASX300 index: 33% of Options will vest;
- Company TSR in the third quartile (50%-75%) of the ASX300 index: 66% of Options will vest; and
- Company TSR in the top quartile (75%-100%) of the ASX300 index: 100% of Options will vest.

None of the Options will vest during the first two years of the five-year performance period. During each of the third, fourth and fifth year of the performance period, 1/3 of the Options will be eligible to vest (in the manner set out above) if the Company has achieved the relevant compounded EPS target and / or TSR target at the end of that year.

To the extent that any Options which vest in years 3 and 4 do not vest due to the Company not achieving the relevant EPS or TSR target, those Options will be subject to retesting based on the Company's annual compounding EPS and TSR performance until the Option expires (i.e., in years 4 or 5 (as applicable)).

In addition to the EPS performance condition, it is a vesting condition that the participant has been continuously employed by the Company or one its subsidiaries (and has not resigned or been terminated) at all times up to (and including) the relevant vesting date.

These performance conditions were chosen to closely align LTI Scheme outcomes with the performance of the Company.

Options

Each Option confers on its holder the entitlement to receive one Share in the Company at the exercise price upon exercise of the Option. Options will not be quoted on the ASX.

Issue Price

The Options will be issued for nil consideration.





Exercise price	\$1.84 being the volume weighted average price of Shares for the month of May 2023.		
Performance period	Five years following the date of grant of the Options.		
Ranking of Shares	Shares issued upon vesting and exercise of Options under the LTI Scheme will rank equally in all respects with existing Shares.		
Rights attaching to Options	The Options do not carry rights to dividends or voting rights prior to exercise.		
Vesting and exercise of Options	Subject to any vesting conditions having been satisfied or waived by the Board in its discretion, an Option may be exercised in accordance with the invitation and by paying the exercise price.		
Cessation of employment of holders of Options	The LTI Scheme contains provisions concerning the treatment of unvested and vested Options in the event employment ceases as a result of death or serious and debilitating illness. In other circumstances the Board has absolute discretion in the treatment of unvested and vested Options in the event employment ceases.		
Expiry of Options	Options will expire on 30 June 2029. On the expiry date for an Option, the Option will lapse unless it has been validly exercised.		

5.5. Reasonable remuneration under the Corporations Act

Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act regulates the provision of financial benefits to related parties by a public company. Section 208 of the Corporations Act prohibits a public company giving a financial benefit to a related party unless a relevant exception applies.

A "financial benefit" is defined in the Corporations Act in broad terms and includes the grant of equity incentives by a public company.

Under the Corporations Act, a director of a company is a related party of that company. As Hugh Toll is a recipient under the LTI Scheme and a Director of the Company, Options granted to Hugh Toll will constitute a financial benefit being given by the Company to a related party.

Section 211 of the Corporations Act provides an exception to the prohibition in section 208 of the Corporations Act where the financial benefit is remuneration given to a related party as an officer of the company and to give the remuneration would be reasonable given the circumstances of the company and the related party's circumstances (including the responsibilities involved in the office or employment) (Reasonable Remuneration Exemption).





It is the view of the Directors that the proposed grant of Options to Hugh Toll as contemplated in Resolution 4 falls within the Reasonable Remuneration Exemption given the circumstances of the Company and the position held by Hugh Toll.

Accordingly, the Directors have determined not to seek Shareholder approval for the purposes of section 208 of the Corporations Act for the grant of Options contemplated by Resolution 4.

Recommendation

The Board (other than Hugh Toll, who has abstained from making a recommendation on this Resolution due to his personal interest) recommends that you vote in favour of this Resolution.
