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Rey Resources Limited (ASX: REY) ("Rey" or "the Company") is focused on developing its oil and gas interests in the Canning and Perth Basins, Western Australia.

#### 1. Oil and Gas

#### 1.1 Fitzroy Blocks (EP457 and EP458)




Figure 1: The three major prospective trends relative to Fitzroy Blocks EP457 and EP458 and Derby Block EP487.

The Fitzroy Blocks are located in the Canning Basin in the northwest of Western Australia (refer Figure 1 below).

During the guarter, Rev received a withdrawal notice from Buru that it decided to withdraw from EP458 JOA. After internal discussion and permit assessment, Rey is willing to take over Buru's 60% interest in the permit. An assignment agreement has been executed and an application for the transfer of the permit interest has been lodged with the department. Rey currently holds 40% interest in EP458, once the transfer is completed Rey will hold 100% interest of EP458.

#### 1.2 Derby Block (EP487)

The Company currently holds a 100% interest in petroleum exploration permit EP487, the Derby Block, via its 100% owned subsidiaries Rey Lennard Shelf Pty Ltd and Rey Derby Block Pty Ltd.




Figure 2: Interpreted extent of the Laurel Basin gas system in relation to Rey's petroleum interests (after Buru and others).

The Derby Block is considered to be predominantly a Wet Laurel Basin Centred Gas (BCG) play which is regionally extensive throughout the Canning Basin (refer to Figures 2 below) and has been the subject of exploration elsewhere in the Canning Basin by other parties in 2015, resulting in encouraging flow tests by Buru at Valhalla and Asgard.

Rey is continually working on the proposed 3D Seismic design and preparation work. After discussed with service providers, the first draft of the environmental plan is close to be finalised. Rey is also actively contacting the Native Title holders for the heritage clearance.

# 1.3 Lennard Shelf Blocks (EP104, R1 and L15)




Figure 3: Location of Lennard Shelf Blocks.

Rey holds a 100% interest in the Lennard Shelf Blocks, comprising EP104, a Retention Lease (R1) and one Production Licence (L15). The Lennard Shelf Blocks are situated to the north of Rey's existing interests in the Canning Basin (refer Figure 3) petroleum exploration licence, with EP487 covering a total area of approximately 1,145 km² and considered prospective for conventional oil and tight gas.

The West Kora-1 workover and production testing is under preparation during the quarter. Based on the engineering assessment report prepared by Labrador, three options are under consideration by Rey's management. In the meantime, Rey is also discussing with onsite contractor to detail the well workover plan.

Rey is also actively discussing with drilling contractors for the planned sidetrack drilling in R1. Unfortunately no suitable rig can be sourced in short term but Rey is discussing with contractors for other options.

# 1.4 Coal

The Duchess Paradise Coal Project (**DP Project**) is a proposed bituminous thermal coal operation located in the Canning Basin of Western Australia and is partly contiguous with the Fitzroy Blocks.

Rey's director had met the Walalakoo Aboriginal people at Derby in early October and discussed the HPA & Protocol terms. The meeting maintained a well relationship with them.

#### 2. Corporate

As at the quarter ended 31 December 2023, the Company maintained a cash balance of \$532,000 and available loan facilities from Ms Wanyan Liu and ASF Group Limited of \$2.45 million and \$2 million respectively.

As required pursuant to section 6 of the Company's Appendix 5B, the Company paid approximately \$67,000 to related parties during the quarter, of which \$28,000 were consulting fees and \$39,000 were Director fees.
