MARCH 2024 QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT

K-TIG Limited (ASX: KTG) ("K-TIG" or the "Company"), a technology company deploying a fully commercialised industry-disruptive high-speed welding technology, provides the following summary of activities during the quarter ended 31 March 2024.

Graham Engineering Limited

As announced on 16 February 2024 the Company announced that the acquisition of Graham Engineering Limited ("GEL") will not proceed.

Following announcements on 22 March 2023, 24 July 2023 and 1 September 2023 in relation to the acquisition, that as a result of market volatility caused by underlying macro events and the underlying trading performance of GEL, the acquisition will not proceed and the share purchase agreement executed on 22 March 2023 has been terminated by K-TIG.

Corporate

On 21 February 2024 the Board of Directors appointed Richard Tucker and John Bumback as joint and several administrators of KTIG Limited and Keyhole TIG Pty Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of K-TIG. The appointment <u>did not</u> extend to Keyhole TIG (USA) Inc and Keyhole TIG (UK) Pty Ltd, the Company's USA and UK operations.

As announced to the ASX on 17 April 2024, a Deed of Company Arrangement was executed on 12 April 2024 and effectuated on 16 April 2024. Since this date the companies returned to trading with a reduced cost base, reduced and restructured debt profile and additional working capital.

Management Changes

During the period Mr Adrian Smith and Stephen Urkenov stepped down from the position of Managing Director and Chief Financial Officer. These roles have not been replaced. Mr Smith remains a non-executive director of the Company.

Operations

During the quarter the Company continued to generate sales and build its sales pipeline in both the US and UK/European markets.

In addition, K-TIG continues its work with General Dynamics Electric Boat (a subsidiary of General Dynamics) as part of a US Department of Defense Navy Manufacturing Technology sponsored program associated with the 'Next Generation Autogenous Welding Process and Equipment Development'. Under this project, K-TIG's research and development team are continuing to develop the keyhole welding process and parameters for the pipe joints and undertake the initial prototype welding.

Financial Summary

The attached Appendix 4C provides details on the cashflows for the quarter ended 31 March 2024. As at 31 March 2024, the Company had a cash balance of \$0.580m. The Company's net cash from operating activities for the quarter amounted to \$0.227m comprising \$0.663m receipts from customers, \$0.276m for product manufacturing and operating costs, \$0.017m for advertising and marketing, \$0.257m for staff costs and \$0.097m for administrative and corporate costs.

As disclosed in item 6.1 of the attached Appendix 4C, \$18k was paid in respect of Managing Directors' fees during the March 2024 quarter.

K-TIG is a transformative, industry disrupting welding technology that seeks to change the economics of fabrication. K-TIG's high speed precision technology welds up to 100 times faster than traditional TIG welding, achieving full penetration in a single pass in materials up to 16mm in thickness and typically operates at twice the speed of plasma welding. K-TIG works across a wide range of applications and is particularly well suited to corrosion resistant materials such as stainless steel, nickel alloys, titanium alloys and most exotic materials. It easily handles longitudinal and circumferential welds on pipes, spooling, vessels, tanks and other materials in a single pass. Originally developed by the CSIRO, K-TIG owns all rights, title and interest in and to the proprietary and patented technology and has been awarded Australian Industrial Product of the Year and the DTC Defence Industry Award.
