



Update on Drilling Operations at Cheer

Labyrinth Resources Ltd (ASX: LRL) ('Labyrinth' or 'the Company') is pleased to provide an operational update regarding its ongoing exploration activities at the Comet Vale Gold Project near Menzies WA. Reverse Circulation ('RC') drilling operations at Cheer are progressing on budget and on time with 2738m from 25 holes drilled to date.

After completing the drilling at Cheer, the drill rig will move to the Comet Vale mine site to target the northern extension of Sovereign Trend. In April 2023, CV23RC_16 intersected **7m at 5.5g/t Au from 125m** showing mineralisation potential to the north of the historic Sand Queen and Gladsome Mines¹.




Figure 1. Plan View of Comet Vale Project drilling targets and significant historic intercepts.

The Company is encouraged by the progress to date and advises that the initial assay results from the drilling are expected within the next 3 to 6 weeks. These results will provide valuable insights into the mineralisation potential at the Cheer Prospect.
