Summary Update for the Quarter Ended 30 September 2024

Fatfish Group Ltd ("**Fatfish**" or the "**Company**") is pleased to provide a summary of its activities for the quarter ended 30 September 2024 ("**Quarter**").

During the Quarter, Fatfish recorded total cash receipts of A\$0.63 million, an improvement from A\$0.58 million in the previous quarter, reflecting management's continued focus on driving sustainable revenue streams across its businesses.

Operating expenditure for the Quarter was A\$0.76 million. This marks a reduction of approximately 19% compared to the A\$0.94 million spent in the previous quarter. The combination of an 9% increase in cash receipts and disciplined cost management has led to a net cash outflow from operating activities of A\$0.12 million, an improvement of 65% versus the previous quarter of A\$0.36 million. This highlights the Company's progress towards positive operating cash flow and its commitment to building long-term shareholder value.

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Business Update

As outlined in the Business Update dated 26 September 2024, the Company has completed its investment in Al Gaming Co. Pte Ltd ("**AIGC**"), an Artificial Intelligence-enabled game developer. During the Quarter, the Company is actively involved in advancing AIGC's business.

Following the launch of Hibur.io social gaming platform, the Company has also begun developing a social gaming app on Telegram, tapping into the rising popularity of Telegram gaming, Simultaneously, the Company is exploring white-label service opportunities with strategic partners to expand the reach and capabilities of the Hibur.io platform.

In our fintech division, under the ASEAN Fintech Group (AFG), the Company has concentrated efforts on streamlining product offerings to target sustainable market segments, with a clear roadmap towards profitability.

1. Payment

Our payment division continued to grow during the Quarter, driven by increased Gross Merchandise Value ("**GMV**") from new customer acquisitions. This resulted in a $\sim 3\%$ rise in revenue and a $\sim 8\%$ reduction in expenditure in the Quarter. Several strategic initiatives were executed during this period, including targeted advertising, strategic marketing campaigns, and platform enhancements. We remain committed to building on this momentum and are on track to return to profitability by 2025.

2. Insurtech

We have made significant progress in aligning our Insurtech business with a sustainable revenue model by focusing on returning customers and the targeted acquisition of new customers in the automobile insurance segment. We were selected by Bank Negara Malaysia ("BNM") to be among the first companies to submit an application for the newly introduced Insurance and Takaful Aggregation business licence. This will enable us to onboard more insurance partners and products, enhancing our platform's revenue potential. Additionally, we are in discussions to offer our Insurtech platform as a white-label solution to strategic partners.

We will continue to explore partnership opportunities to further unlock the value of our fintech lending licences across the ASEAN region.

The Company entered into a definitive legally binding agreement with US based Arena Investors, LP for the iussuance of up to \$8 million convertible notes. Salient terms of the Notes are as follows:

(i) To be drawn 1 tranche;

(ii) Investor may elect to convert the Notes at any time up to the Maturity Date, at a conversion price of \$0.07 per Note.

(iii) Maturity date is 27 August 2024, which shall be extendable upon mutual agreement of the parties, after which the Company shall redeem the relevant Notes in cash, provided that they have not been converted into shares by the Investor. It has received confirmation that the Note Holder will not call on the Notes in the next 12 months or until the Company has sufficient funds; and

(iv) Coupon rate of 1.0% per annum
