Quarterly Activities Report and Appendix 4C for the period ended 31 December 2024

Q2 FY25 Highlights:

- **Cody Star has completed its explorational fishing trips into the Coral Sea Fishery (CSF) with excellent results.**
- **Breach of Listing Rule 10.1.**
- **The Company has identified a potential acquisition.**
- **Proposed purchase of a 387-ton fishing vessel.**

Processor, distributor and exporter of premium seafood products. And secondary producer of nutraceutical and marine ingredients. **New Zealand Coastal Seafoods Limited (ASX:NZS)** (the “Company”) is pleased to announce its quarterly activities report and appendix 4C for the three-month period ended 31 December 2024 (the “Quarter” or the “Reporting Period”).

Operational overview:

Cody Star has completed its explorational fishing trips into the CSF with excellent results.

Confirmation of large quantities of fish stocks (including sought-after Coral Trout, Bar Cod and Flame-Tail Snapper) in the CSF has been determined and areas mapped.

These exploration trips cover only a very small proportion of the vast CSF which spans 989,836 sq. km. Further exploration needs to be conducted to realise the full potential of the CSF.

Breach of Listing Rule 10.1.

On 20 September 2024, the Company announced that it has breached Listing Rule 10.1.

From around June 2023 to June 2024, the Company was under tremendous stress due to changes to the Board and senior management. This, together with the looming threat of closing of the Company’s New Zealand business, caused the Company to overlook some announcements that it should have made.

The Company sincerely apologises for these mistakes. And reviewed its internal processes and has implemented appropriate controls to ensure such a breach of Listing Rule 10.1 will not happen in future.

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The Company has identified a potential acquisition

The Company is in advanced discussions with Luke McKenzie to acquire the vessel *Invader II*, that is complimentary to the commercialisation of the Company's valuable CSF permits. If successful, this will be a script only acquisition.

Proposed purchase of a 387-ton fishing vessel.

This 34.5m vessel will have the capacity to fish over 70 tons of products per fishing trip. This vessel is expected to land over 600 tons of products annually.

The target vessels have the potential to produce annual revenue and ebitda of around \$800k and \$150k respectively.

Activities post quarter-end:

The Company will discuss with NAB to utilise its revolving asset finance facility for the proposed purchase of the 387-ton fishing vessel.

The Company plans to raise up to \$750,000 of new funds via convertible note subscriptions.

The Company is in advance discussions to secure a well-known Australian Family Office to be our cornerstone investor.

With new funding, increased income and growing businesses, NZS will also seek to have its shares unsuspended and resume normal trading on the Australian Stock Exchange (ASX) in May 2025 subject to ASX guidelines/ASX Listing Rule 12.

New Zealand Coastal Seafoods Limited (ASX: NZS) is a processor, distributor and exporter of premium seafood products. And secondary producer of nutraceutical and marine ingredients.

The Australian-based operations of NZS, Nine Ocean Fishery Pty Ltd ("NOF"), is a premium seafood provider focused on responsible sourcing of seafood products from the Torres Strait and the Coral Sea. The group also operates purpose-built export standard processing facility in Queensland, Australia. Through sustainable management practices, the group processes, sells and distributes high-end seafood products, including tropical rock lobster and sea cucumber. The products are wild caught, traceable and caught under a series of unique fishing licenses. Its fishery has been assessed and verified for sustainability, ensuring minimal impact on the wild fish population and the broader coastal ecosystem in which it operates. NOF is also a direct supplier of premium and frozen seafood products to a wide customer base in Australia and International markets.
