

APPENDIX 4C – 30 JUNE 2017 QUARTERLY CASHFLOW REPORT

PERTH, AUSTRALIA; 31ST JULY 2017: Hazer Group Ltd ("Hazer" or "the Company") (ASX:HZR, HZRO) lodges the attached Appendix 4C Quarterly Cashflow Report for the 12 month period ended 30 June 2017.

The Company had cash reserves of \$8.14m as at 30 June2017, increasing by \$0.89m during the quarter.

Operating cash outflows for the quarter were \$1.21m as the Company continued its core research and development activities to commercialise the Hazer Process and settled parts and engineering services relating to the recently commissioned pre pilot plant.

As announced on 6th July 2017, the pre-pilot plant was successfully commissioned and will now be used to illustrate the impact of scale-up on process performance and graphite product quality, and demonstrate the de-risking design and optimisation requirements of the technology.

Cash reserves were bolstered during the quarter with \$2.15m raised via a Share Purchase Plan ("Plan") and option exercises. Under the Plan, eligible shareholders could apply for up to \$15,000 of shares at \$0.60 each.

The Company was also pleased to secure prominent Australian mining expert and industry thought-leader, Tim Goldsmith as Chairman during the quarter. Tim was previously a partner at global professional services firm PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) for over 20 years and comes with decades of leadership experience in the mining sector. As Hazer progresses its technology from the laboratory towards commercial production, Tim will play a key role in prioritising and converting any potential commercial opportunities, and work towards Hazer's penetration across both the graphite and hydrogen verticals.
