



## Release from Escrow

**Tuesday 7 November 2017** - Australian robotic technology company **Fastbrick Robotics Limited (ASX:FBR)** ('Fastbrick' or 'the Company') confirms that in accordance with ASX listing rule 3.10A, that the following securities will be released from escrow on 18 November 2017:

1. 148,562,757 ordinary shares – of which 106 million shares are owned and controlled by the Fastbrick founders and current executive directors Mark & Mike Pivac, with the majority of the balance owned by the original seed investors in Goldwing Nominees Pty Ltd (Goldwing was acquired via reverse takeover by the listed company now named Fastbrick Robotics Ltd in November 2015).
2. 53,412,945 unlisted 2 cent options expiring 12 November 2019.

The company will separately announce to the ASX on or about 18 November 2017, when the above securities have been released from their escrow lock.
