CropLogic is in a unique position to leverage its innovation in agricultural technology to be part of the transformation of how food is produced in the 21st century. Being a New Zealand company, there are inherent opportunities for the Company to begin operations within Asia. New Zealand is renowned for its agricultural innovation and quality produce, in 2013 alone New Zealand exported \$1.2 billion worth of agritech to Asia, from genetics to pumping and irrigation systems.

While agritech in Asia is still a developing field, CropLogic is looking to expand its sphere of influence with new Asian partners and companies to tackle global agricultural problems. With a broader world view, food security in China and other parts of Asia is a growing problem. As a New Zealand company, CropLogic is interested in partnerships that can provide solutions on feeding cities that can't currently rely on existing agricultural systems.

The Company is optimistic of the opportunities that are available within Asia, noting the recent proliferation of start-ups across Singapore, the Philippines, Malaysia and China, spanning self-sustaining food suppliers to automated irrigation systems, to organic rooftop farms, and a focus on precision farming.

The agricultural industry is about to be disrupted and is transforming into a high-tech industry. As a consequence of disruption drivers such as growing populations, increasing urbanization, climate change and globalised trade, the agricultural ecosystem faces new challenges from which CropLogic presents a unique opportunity for potential investors and partners in Asia.

The world population, of which 10% remain undernourished, is rapidly growing, thereby creating severe urgency to increase crop yields. With a vision to become the leading provider of end-to-end agronomy services for large scale crop growers around the world, CropLogic's technology aims to improve crop yields by combining advanced research and technology with an in-field agronomy support team to provide accurate advice to growers. Included in the company's competitive advantage is the added benefit of over 30 years of New Zealand publicly-funded research in scientific crop models by The New Zealand Institute of Plant and Food Research, an internationally-recognised Crown Research Institute.

This new engagement with Darway Pty Ltd represents a significant step for CropLogic to realise its growth opportunity within the Asian market from 2018 and beyond.

The CropLogic system has been developed with the benefit of over 500 field trials throughout Australia, China, New Zealand, and the United States of America. In 2017 the system was commercially launched into Washington State, USA.
