ACTIVITIES DURING THE QUARTER

<u>Highlights</u>

- The company announced the strategic acquisition of leading Canberra IT service provider Correct Communications. The transaction completed in late November and creates a market leading full service Canberra IT solutions and managed services innovator. The combined business provides greater scale, services and expertise to the client base.
- Cirrus announced the placement of fully paid ordinary shares was significantly oversubscribed. The placement was at an issue price of \$0.018 per share to raise approximately \$787,000. Funds raised were applied to partly pay for the cash component of the Correct Communications acquisition.
- Cirrus announced that Data#3 (ASX:DTL) WA State Manager Glenn McAtee would join the Cirrus executive team as WA State Manager. Glenn has over 30 years industry experience and a proven track record in driving sustainable growth through innovative solutions. During his six years at DTL Glenn delivered exceptional results and will be a valuable member of the Cirrus team.
- In providing an update to the market, Cirrus announced consolidated revenue continued to grow in the first half of FY18. The company expects H1 revenue to be in excess of \$30 million (FY17 H1 \$18.7 million) including \$19.5 million in the second quarter (Q2) of H1. Both the Victorian and Canberra acquisitions are showing promising signs particularly in the services focused opportunities. Pleasingly Q2 delivered an underlying profit after an underlying loss in Q1.

8.3 The Company entered into a Multi Option Facility with Bankwest which forms part of the cash management for general business purposes. This Bankwest Multi Option Facility includes the following facilities drawn down at the Company's discretion across any or all of the facilities and totalling \$1,000,000. The facility options are:

- Commercial Advance Facility with interest payable at the rate of BBSY plus a Margin of 2.20% per annum
- Bank Guarantee Contingent Instrument Facility
- Business Corporate Transaction Account Facility with interest payable at the rate of the variable Bankwest Business Variable Overdraft Reference Rate.

8.4 The Company also entered into a separate Commercial Advance Facility with Bankwest specifically for Acquisition Funding. Interest is payable at BBSY plus a margin of 3.00% per annum. Loan is repayable over 3 years.
