Notes Attached to this Report

As previously announced, the board accepted an offer to recapitalise the Company. The Company received an initial injection of funds resulting in all outstanding debts being repaid with sufficient cash being available to support the Company's near-term business objectives.

The Directors and shareholders voted in favour of the Company's proposed Recapitalisation at the meeting of shareholders 29 November 2017. The Company, post 30 November 2017, commenced the recapitalisation by paying down outstanding debts and then on 15 December 2017, announced a non-renounceable entitlement issue of one (1) Share for every three (3) Shares held by registered eligible shareholders at an issue price of \$0.001 per Share. The non-renounceable entitlement issue will raise capital sufficient for the Company to re-commence and accelerate its activities within the industry in which it currently operates.

In the past, the Company had for some time suffered from a lack of sufficient capital to increase the number of projects in any one year, due in part to the negative sentiment in the WA building and development industry. The nature of the industry in which the Company operates is subject to lengthy periods of inactivity due to extended periods of council and other regulatory approvals that are outside of the Company's control, as has been set out in the Company's recent market announcements. However, the availability of projects that fit the profile of the Company's knowledge and experience has improved. These available projects continue to be assessed for suitability although to date none of these have fit the Company's criteria.

As noted in previous Monthly Reports, Energy Capital Partners introduced a proposed joint venture between the Company, Indigenous Cement Australia Pty Ltd and HSS NT Pty Ltd. This proposed joint venture is a socially responsible project which would involve providing product, materials and building expertise incorporating steel framing to Indigenous groups to fulfil part of the demand created by Federal Government funding in the Indigenous housing and other sectors. Indigenous Cement Australia Pty Ltd and HSS NT Pty Ltd have worked extensively throughout the Northern Territory and Northern Western Australia. The joint venture discussions have progressed however negotiations continue to be prolonged. The Company will continue to keep the shareholders informed as progress of the proposed joint venture moves along.
