### Suspension from trading

As announced on 8 July 2019, the Federal Court of Australia (**Court**) has made orders approving the following schemes of arrangement (together, **Schemes**):

- the scheme of arrangement under which Angang Group Hong Kong (Holdings) Limited has agreed to acquire all of the remaining issued ordinary shares in Gindalbie Metals Limited (**Gindalbie**) that it does not already own; and
- the scheme of arrangement under which Coda Minerals Limited will be demerged from Gindalbie via a capital reduction.

Following the lodgement of a copy of the Court's orders with the Australian Securities and Investments Commission earlier today, and as announced to ASX today, the Schemes are now legally effective.

As a consequence of the above, Gindalbie hereby requests that trading in Gindalbie shares be suspended with effect from the close of trading today, 9 July 2019.

It is expected that the Scheme will be implemented on 23 July 2019 and that Gindalbie will request that ASX ends the quotation of Gindalbie shares and removes Gindalbie from the official list, in both cases with effect from the close of trading on 24 July 2019, at which point in time the suspension will necessarily end.

Gindalbie is not aware of any reasons why its shares should not be suspended.
