

Thursday's Gossan Porphyry Copper-Gold Project - Diamond Drilling Update

Latest Drill Assays Confirm Southerly Plunge of Copper-Gold Mineralised North-South Structure

New results from diamond hole SMD045W2 demonstrate consistency of the high-grade copper-gold mineralisation hosted within the North-South Structure, confirming the southerly plunge and providing a vector to the causative copper-gold porphyry at depth

Highlights

- ▶ Diamond drill hole SMD045W2, drilled to target the North-South Structure (NSS) below the intercept of 16m at 1.30% Cu and 0.15g/t Au from 1,077m in SMD045, returned the following intercepts:
 - 74m @ 0.31% Cu from 531m down-hole including:
 - 28m @ 0.42% Cu from 558m down-hole;
 - 3m @ 1.12% Cu, 0.26g/t Au and 11g/t Ag from 859m down-hole;
 - 12m @ 0.51% Cu, 0.10g/t Au and 2g/t Ag from 1,129m down-hole in the NSS, including:
 - 4m @ 0.91% Cu, 0.12g/t Au and 2g/t Ag from 1,133m;
 - 2m @ 0.94% Cu, 0.1g/t Au and 3g/t Ag from 1,147m down-hole in the NSS.
- The copper-gold-silver mineralisation is associated with sericite-chlorite 'phyllic' altered host-rocks, interpreted to be located above the source porphyry.
- In conjunction with previous intercepts, these results are interpreted to reflect a steep south-plunging conduit for the mineralising fluids.
- ➤ This provides a clear vector to the causative copper-gold porphyry at depth. Deep drill-hole SMD049 is currently in-progress at ~1,100m drill depth to test the position beneath these intercepts.




Figure 1. Stavely Project location map.




Figure 2. Thursday's Gossan drill collar location plan.






Figure 3. Aeromagnetic image with drill collars and the surface projection of the North-South Structure and the Copper Lode Splay.

Stavely Minerals Limited (ASX Code: **SVY** – "Stavely Minerals") is pleased to report further assays from recently completed diamond drilling at the **Thursday's Gossan prospect**, part of its 100%-owned Stavely Copper-Gold Project in western Victoria (Figures 1, 2 and 3), where recent drilling continues to provide the Company with confirmation of a strong vector to the target porphyry at depth.

The latest results, from wedge hole SMD045W2, provide further evidence of the consistency of higher grade mineralisation hosted within the North-South Structure (NSS) and confirm the strong southerly plunge of this zone, providing a clear vector to the targeted causative porphyry at depth.

Diamond drill hole wedge SMD045W2, drilled to target the (North-South Structure) NSS below the intercept reported in SMD045, has returned a broad zone of moderate grade copper and several higher-grade copper-gold intercepts:

- 74m @ 0.31% copper from 531m down-hole including:
 - 23m @ 0.28% copper, 0.13g/t gold and 4g/t silver from 531m down-hole; and
 - o 28m @ 0.42% copper from 558m down-hole
- 3m @ 1.12% copper, 0.26g/t gold and 11g/t silver from 859m down-hole (Photo 1)

In the NSS:

- 12m @ 0.51% copper, 0.1g/t gold and 2g/t silver from 1,129m down-hole, including:
 - o 4m @ 0.91% copper, 0.12g/t gold and 2g/t silver from 1,133m (Photo 2)



- 6m of late mineral dacite from 1,141m down-hole
- 2m @ 0.94% copper, 0.1g/t gold and 3g/t silver from 1,147m down-hole (Photo 3)

As previously reported (see ASX announcement 18 June 2019) diamond drill hole SMD045 has returned high-grade copper-gold mineralisation on the NSS, with assay results including:

- 307m at 0. 22% copper from 15m down-hole, including:
 - 23m at 0.53% copper, 0.43g/t gold and 3.5g/t silver from 51m down-hole, including:
 - 3m at 2.38% copper, 2.12g/t gold and 12.2g/t silver from 51m, including:
 - 1m at 5.05% copper, 6.06g/t gold and 20.9g/t silver from 52m



- o 92m at 0.30% copper from 215m drill depth, including:
 - 8m at 0.93% copper, 0.26g/t gold and 8.8g/t silver from 218m
- 17m at 0.29% copper, 0.15g/t gold and 4.6g/t silver from 531m, including:
 - o 2m at 0.42% copper, 0.57g/t gold and 12.1g/t silver from 546m
- 27m at 0.53g/t gold from 567m, including:
 - o 3m at 1.99g/t gold from 578m

In the NSS:

- 2m at 0.55% copper, 0.14g/t gold from 1,063m down-hole
- 12m of late mineral dacite from 1,065m
- 16m at 1.30% copper, 0.15g/t gold and 2.8g/t silver from 1,077m, including
 - o 2m at 2.90% copper, 0.27g/t gold and 3.9g/t silver from 1,091m
- 10m of late mineral dacite from 1,093m
- 11m at 0.39% copper from 1,103m

SMD045W1, (see ASX announcement 18 June 2019) drilled to target the NSS 170m vertically above the intercept in SMD045, also returned significant assay results including:

- 30m at 0.23% copper from 465m down-hole, including
 - o 5m at 0.22% copper, 0.71g/t gold and 5.5g/t silver from 474m
- 25m at 0.23% copper, 0.14g/t gold and 2.5g/t silver from 528m
- 9m at 0.28% copper, 0.21g/t gold and 4.9g/t silver from 719m

In the NSS – not well-mineralised with 3m at 0.30% copper from 942m

• 3m at 0.49% copper, 0.16g/t gold and 2.4g/t silver from 1,053m

The high-grade intercepts in mineralised structures in recent drill holes SMD045, SMD045W1 and SMD045W2, together with previous drill holes, in particular SMD044 and SMD044W1, have provided a vector to the causative copper-gold porphyry at depth.

Drill hole SMD044 intersected multiple zones of high-grade copper-gold mineralisation (see ASX announcement 12 March 2019) including:

- 10m at 2.43% copper and 0.30g/t gold from the Copper Lode Splay (CLS) structure,
 and
- 38.3m at 1.59% copper and 0.27g/t gold from the NSS, including
 - o 6m at 2.75% copper, 0.25g/t gold and 7g/t silver
 - o 12.3m at 2.59% copper, 0.44g/t gold and 18g/t silver, including
 - 6.3m at 3.93% copper, 0.67g/t gold and 27g/t silver

In drill hole SMD044W1, the highest-grade intercepts over meaningful widths to date were intersected (see ASX announcement 23 April 2019) with:

- 18m at 3.62% copper, 0.28g/t gold and 15g/t silver including
 - o **2m at 15.7% copper, 1.07g/t gold and 65g/t silver** on the NSS.

When modelling in the plane of the NSS, these intercepts appear to reflect a steep southerly plunge to the well-developed high-grade copper-gold-silver mineralisation.



This trend also appears to be reflected in a number of different data sets including sulphur abundance, potassium and strontium geochemistry, vanadium over scandium ratios (reflecting an evolved porphyry fluid source) short-wavelength white mica infra-red absorption features (as reflecting proximity to a source porphyry), light sulphur isotopes (also reflecting proximity to an oxidised magmatic source) and other alteration mineralogy, copper sulphide species, the distribution of disseminated and vein-hosted sulphate minerals and vein characteristics.




Figure 4. SMD045 drill section.

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Deep drill hole SMD049 (a re-drill of SMD048 which failed at 61m due to a collar wash-out) is planned to a depth of 1,500m, and is being drilled at -70 degrees to 196 degrees azimuth to drill directly down the plunge of the interpreted structural 'conduit' for fluids emanating from the porphyry at depth.

This drill hole is currently in progress (~1,100m drill depth), is being drilled parallel to the NSS, and is not expected to intercept it. The primary target is the causative copper-gold porphyry at depth. Post-completion wedges may be undertaken to intercept the NSS at various depths.
