MARCH 2020 QUARTERLY REPORT

ACTIVITY AND PORTFOLIO REVIEW

High Peak Royalties is pleased to announce the March Quarter Statement of Activity and Cash Flows.

During the quarter, cash receipts from royalties across the portfolio were \$209,427, compared to \$121,497 in the December 2019 quarter. This is largely the result of USA royalty payment timing, as some Planet Gas royalties from December quarter were received in this period as well as the March quarter payments.

HPR received \$1,312,908 from the previously reported sale of Royalco shares.

Whilst the recent reduction in oil price is anticipated to affect royalty revenues in the short term, it is also resulting in acquisition opportunities, and HPR continues to actively review assets for sale.

During the quarter, \$55,000 was paid to directors of the Company in director fees, as noted in Item 6.1 of the 4C.

HPR has a portfolio of royalties in Australia and USA as detailed on the final page of the Activities Report.

REVIEW OF PORTFOLIO ASSETS

<u>USA</u>

HPR is continuing to receive steady revenue from multiple royalties in the USA. Revenue on a cash basis across USA based fields was ~\$161,650 which supported the financing and interest costs of ~\$51,000 related to the Planet Gas royalty acquisition partly funded by the Macquarie Bank Financing Facility.



Queensland (QLD)

Royalties received on a cash basis were \$44,178 for the March quarter, compared to \$33,000 in the December 2019 quarter, mainly due to higher commodity prices. HPR continues to monitor Origin Energy Limited's (ASX: ORG) announcements for indication of results from the South Burunga-2 well testing the deeper Bowen Basin formations, and progress on the announced extension of the shallow coal seam gas project using horizontal wells.

Northern Territory (NT)

As announced in the December 2019 Quarterly Report, the Company continues to monitor activity on areas where HPR has royalties, including the Dukas-1 well drilled by the progress of Santos Limited (ASX: STO).

Western Australia (WA)

HPR expects that in due course there will be more drilling on permits where HPR has royalties.
