# DIRECTORS' REPORT

Your Directors submit the Financial Report of the Group for the half-year ended 31 December 2014.

## Review of operations

### Exploration and Evaluation

During the reporting period, the Company continued to support the efforts of its Joint Venture partner Vango Mining Limited ("Vango") in the development and commercialisation of the Plutonic Dome Gold Project ("Project") whilst also reviewing a number of new stand-alone opportunities across a broad spectrum of mineral commodities.

Vango is earning up to a 75% interest in the Project by sole funding a minimum of \$6 million in project based expenditure. As at 31 December 2014, Vango had earned a 30% interest (by expending \$2 million) and had elected to sole fund a further \$1 million to earn an additional 15% interest in the Project.

Exploration work to date has evaluated seven priority targets and has identified an estimated resource base of 8.3 million tonnes at a grade of 3.1g/t for a total of 820,000 oz of gold.

### Share Placement

On 20 October 2014, the Company placed 16,567,247 ordinary fully paid shares at an issue price of \$0.026 per share to raise \$430,747 (before costs) in working capital.

## Financial Result

The loss after tax for the half-year ended 31 December 2014 was \$839,477 (2013: loss of \$866,652).

## Events Subsequent to Reporting Date

On 18 February 2015, the Company announced that Vango Mining Limited ("Vango") had completed its sole funding expenditure obligation under the second stage of the Farm-in Joint Venture Agreement. Completion of this second stage funding entitles Vango to a further 15% interest in the Plutonic Dome Gold Project tenements. Vango has now earned a 45% equity interest in the Project.

On 18 February 2015, Vango advised the Company that it had elected to commit to the third stage of sole funding expenditure obligations. In so doing, Vango has elected to commit to the next \$1m of expenditure which, on completion in a period of not more than 5 months, will entitle Vango to an additional 15% equity interest in the Project. This would then bring Vango's direct equity interest in the Project to 60%.

No other matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the half year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Group, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Group in future financial periods.



# CONDENSED NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the half year ended 31 December 2014

## 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

### (a) Basis of Preparation

These general purpose interim financial statements for the half-year reporting period ended 31 December 2014 have been prepared in accordance with requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001* and Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134: *Interim Financial Reporting*. The Group is a for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

This interim financial report is intended to provide users with an update on the latest annual financial statements of Dampier Gold Limited and its controlled entities (referred to as the "Consolidated Entity" or "Group"). As such, it does not contain information that represents relatively insignificant changes occurring during the half-year within the Group. It is therefore recommended that this financial report be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements of the Group for the year ended 30 June 2014, together with any public announcements made during the following half-year.

The half year report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs.

#### **Going Concern**

The financial report has been prepared on a going concern basis.

The Directors believe there are sufficient grounds to believe that the Group will be able to continue to pay its debts as and when they fall due. This is based on future cash forecasts, existing cash reserves and the ability to significantly reduce activity to preserve cash if necessary. In addition, Vango Mining Limited are continuing to sole fund the Plutonic Dome Gold Project pursuant to the Farm-in Joint Venture Agreement which significantly reduces the Group's project holding costs and is expected to further reduce the closure rehabilitation liability of \$1.68 million.

### (b) Accounting Policies

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of the half year financial report are consistent with those adopted and disclosed in the Company's 2014 annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2014, except for the impact of the Standards and Interpretations described below. These accounting policies are consistent with Australian Accounting Standards and with International Financial Reporting Standards.

The Group has adopted all of the new and revised Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (the AASB) that are relevant to their operations and effective for the current half-year.

### (c) Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements incorporate all of the assets, liabilities and results of the parent (Dampier Gold Limited) and all of the subsidiaries. Subsidiaries are entities the parent controls. The parent controls an entity when it is exposed to, or has rights to, variable returns from its involvement with the entity and has the ability to affect those returns through its power over the entity. A list of the subsidiaries is provided in note 7.

The assets, liabilities and results of all subsidiaries are fully consolidated into the financial statements of the Group from the date on which control is obtained by the Group. The consolidation of a subsidiary is discontinued from the date that control ceases. Intercompany transactions, balances and unrealised gains or losses on transactions between Group entities are fully eliminated on consolidation. Accounting policies of subsidiaries have been changed and adjustments made where necessary to ensure uniformity of the accounting policies adopted by the Group.

Equity interests in a subsidiary not attributable, directly or indirectly, to the Group are presented as "non-controlling interests". The Group initially recognises non-controlling interests that are present ownership interests in subsidiaries and are entitled to a proportionate share of the subsidiary's net assets on liquidation at either fair value or at the non-controlling interests' proportionate share of the subsidiary's net assets. Subsequent to initial recognition, non-controlling interests are attributed their share of profit or loss and each component of other comprehensive income. Non-controlling interests are shown separately within the equity section of the statement of financial position and statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

## (d) Exploration and evaluation costs

Exploration and evaluation costs are written off in the year they are incurred apart from acquisition costs which are carried forward where right of tenure of the area of interest is current and they are expected to be recouped through sale or successful development and exploitation of the area of interest or, where exploration and evaluation activities in the area of interest have not reached a stage that permits reasonable assessment of the existence of economically recoverable reserves.

Where an area of interest is abandoned or the Directors decide that it is not commercial, any accumulated acquisition costs in respect of that area are written off in the financial period the decision is made. Each area of interest is also reviewed at the end of each accounting period and accumulated costs are written off to the extent that they will not be recoverable in the future.

**Report on the Half-Year Financial Report**

We have reviewed the accompanying half-year financial report of Dampier Gold Limited, which comprises the consolidated condensed statement of financial position as at 31 December 2014, the consolidated condensed statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, consolidated condensed statement of changes in equity, and consolidated condensed statement of cash flows for the half-year ended on that date, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the directors' declaration for Dampier Gold Limited (the consolidated entity). The consolidated entity comprises both Dampier Gold Limited (the Company) and the entities it controlled during the half year.
