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DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors of Hazelwood Resources Ltd submit herewith the financial report of Hazelwood Resources Ltd and its subsidiaries ('the Consolidated Entity') for the half-year ended 31 December 2014. In order to comply with the provisions of the *Corporations Act 2001* the directors report as follows:

Directors

The names of the directors of the company during or since the end of the half year are:

Mr M Warren – appointed 8 September 2014 Mr P Burke – appointed 8 September 2014 Mr J Chegwidden Mr T Butler-Blaxell – resigned 29 October 2014 Mr F Ashe – resigned 26 November 2014

Unless otherwise stated, all directors were in office for the period under review, and up to the date of this report.

Review of Operations

Ferrotungsten production and concentrate purchasing was suspended during the 2nd quarter in order to destock current inventories, preserve cash and avoid purchasing concentrates at elevated prices to predicted future market price. This strategy, consistent with Hazelwood's new approach of maximizing ATC profitability appears to have been successful with the opportunity to purchase and negotiate on lower concentrate prices emerging in the 2015 calendar year.

During the half year a total of 274 tonnes of Ferrotungsten metal was produced from 458 tonnes of tungsten concentrate. The average product grade was 78.0%.

A Gross Loss of \$781,678 (31 December 2013 \$846,975 Profit) is reported in the consolidated statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the six month period ended 31 December 2014 on sales Revenue of \$11,340,389 (31 December 2013 \$7,187,507) for the same period.

The consolidated loss for the six month period ended 31 December 2014 is \$7,790,681 (31 December 2013 loss \$2,306,686). As at 31 December 2014 Hazelwood Resources Ltd ("Hazelwood" or "the Company") had 1,215,971,816 shares on issue all of which are quoted.

Exploration and Evaluation activities were undertaken on the Company's Western Australian projects which included:

- Fixed loop electro-magnetic surveys and down-hole electromagnetic surveys at Copper Gorge and Malachite Flats in September 2014; and
- The release on 5 November 2014 of a further resource update representing a 9% increase on the previously announced Resource for the Mulgine Trench.

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DIRECTORS' REPORT

Events Post 31 December 2014

On 22 January 2015, the Company announced that it had received firm commitments for a Placement to raise up to \$1.1 million. 57,346,667 shares to the value of \$860,200 were allotted under Tranche 1 of the Placement.

On 13 February 2015, 7,500,000 shares to the value of \$112,500 were allotted under Tranche 2 of the Placement and a further 2,000,000 shares were allotted in accordance with Resolution 11 as approved by shareholders at the Annual General Meeting.

On 10 March 2015, 7,000,000 shares to the value of \$105,000 were allotted under Tranche 3 of the Placement, 71,846,667 free options attached to the Placement Shares were issued, and 7,000,000 shares and 7,000,000 free options were issued to a director or his nominee in accordance with Resolution 4 as approved by shareholders at the General Meeting held on 24 February 2015.

On 5 June 2015, the Company provided a financing update which included details of recapitalisation of the Company and the grant by Siderian of a forbearance for repayment of the Siderian Debt Facility to 25 September 2015.

On 16 June 2015, the Company announced a further \$1,650,000 was received by way of sophisticated investor and shareholder loans which are to be converted into convertible notes with attaching options, once shareholder approval is gained.

On 1 July 2015, a Notice of Extraordinary General Meeting to be held on 31 July 2015, and Proxy Form was lodged with the ASX.

Results of the Annual General Meeting

The Company held its Annual General Meeting on 26 November 2014, all resolutions were carried on a show of hands.

1. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant Accounting Policies

a) Statement of Compliance

The half year financial report is a general purpose financial report prepared in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* and Australian Accounting Standards including AASB 134 *Interim Financial Reporting*. Compliance with Australian Accounting Standards ensures that the financial statements and notes comply with International Financial Reporting Standards. The half-year financial report does not include notes of the type normally included in an annual financial report and should be read in conjunction with the 2014 annual financial report.

b) Basis of Preparation

The consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the basis of historical cost, except for the revaluation of certain non-current assets and financial instruments. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise noted.

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of the half-year financial report are consistent with those adopted and disclosed in the company's 2014 annual financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2014, except for the impact of the Standards and Interpretations described below. These accounting policies are consistent with Australian Accounting Standards and with International Financial Reporting Standards.

The Group has adopted all of the new and revised Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) that are relevant to their operations and effective for the current half year.

The adoption of the above standards have not had a material impact on this half year financial report.

c) Comparatives

Where necessary comparatives have been amended in order to be consistent with the presentation in the current period. These amendments are to presentation only.

d) Going concern

The half year financial report has been prepared on a going concern basis, which contemplates the continuity of normal business activities and the realisation of assets and the settlement of liabilities in the ordinary course of business.

The Consolidated Entity incurred a loss for the half year of \$7,790,681 (2013: \$2,306,686) and net cash outflows from operating activities of \$2,474,038 (2013: \$3,246,069)

No capital raisings were undertaken during the period. Subsequent to the half year end, the Company raised \$1,077,700 by way of a placement of shares to sophisticated investors and a further \$1,650,000 by way of sophisticated investor and shareholder loans which are to be converted into convertible notes once shareholder approval is gained which is expected to take place at the EGM to be held on 31 July 2015. This raising completes stage 1 of the recapitalisation of the Company as announced on the ASX on 16 June 2015.

The ability of the Consolidated Entity to continue to pay its debts as and when they fall due is principally dependent upon the Consolidated Entity settling USD 4 million in bridging finance; raising additional share capital; developing, joint venturing or selling one or more of its non-core assets or other assets; and the successful production and profitable sale of Ferrotungsten. These conditions indicate a material uncertainty that may cast significant doubt about the ability of the Consolidated Entity to continue as a going concern.

The directors have prepared a cash flow forecast, which indicates that the Consolidated Entity will have sufficient cash flows to meet all commitments and working capital requirements for the 12 month period from the date of signing this financial report. The Directors believe it is appropriate to prepare these accounts on a going concern basis because:

- Bridging finance has been extended to 25 September 2015;
- Ferrotungsten production is forecast to continue and be profitable through the Vietnam plant;

d) Going concern continued

- The Directors have an appropriate plan to raise additional funds through an Entitlements Offer to raise up to \$11.6 million, subject to a minimum subscription of \$6.5 million as announced on 16 June 2015. In light of the consolidated entity's current exploration projects and status of the Vietnam plant, the Directors believe that the additional capital required can be raised in the market; and
- The Directors have an appropriate plan to contain certain operating and exploration expenditure if appropriate funding is unavailable.

Should the Consolidated Entity not achieve the matters set out above, there is material uncertainty whether it would continue as a going concern and therefore whether it would realise its assets and extinguish its liabilities in the normal course of business and at the amounts stated in the financial statements. The financial statements do not include any adjustment relating to the recoverability or classification of recorded asset amounts or to the amounts or classifications of liabilities that might be necessary should the Consolidated Entity not be able to continue as a going concern.

e) Financial Instruments

The Company's financial instruments consist of those which are measured at amortised cost including trade and other receivables trade and other payables, and other liabilities. The carrying amount of these financial assets and liabilities approximate their fair value.

f) Revenue Recognition

Product is sold under a sales agency agreement with Wogen Resources Ltd and partpayment is received under provisional invoices. Revenue is recognised only when settlement has occurred with the final-end user.
