Metallurgical test work underway

Highlights

- Formal test work underway for Mahenge lodes, Epanko north and Ulanzi for process flowsheet design and graphite concentrate marketing

Black Rock Mining Limited (ASX.BKT) ("Black Rock Mining" or "the Company") is pleased to announce that metallurgical testwork has commenced on the Epanko north and Ulanzi mineralised lodes. Core samples will be comprehensively tested to determine process plant flowsheet design. Rock samples are being processed to generate graphite concentrates.

Extensive test work is being conducted on flake concentrates to obtain a detailed understanding of the characteristics and attributes of graphite flake concentrates from Epanko north and Ulanzi. This work will indicate the expected concentrate purities from conventional flotation.

Additional testwork is planned to determine chemically upgraded purity and the suitability of Mahenge graphite flake for a suite of value-added applications including; expanded graphite, expandable graphite, spherical graphite testwork and other industrial applications.

Managing Director of Black Rock Mining Steven Tambanis commented: "The metallurgical testwork programme is a critical milestone for the Company to confirm a process route, graphite concentrate quality and its suitability for use in conventional and value added graphite markets. We consider it essential to fully understand all of the attributes of our flake graphite assets to optimise our marketing strategy".

Bagamoyo Due Diligence and Exploratory Drilling Update

Following the Company's announcement on 14 October 2015 that it has an option agreement over the Bagamoyo Graphite projects, a composite sample of our Bagamoyo graphitic rock is being prepared for flake characterisation and preliminary flotation test work. Core samples from Bagamoyo are expected in December, when drilling is planned at the central lode.

The metallurgical programme is expected to be completed by late December, about the same time as the expected Mahenge resource statement.

About Black Rock Mining

Black Rock Mining Limited is listed on the Australian Securities Exchange. The Company has graphite tenure in the Mahenge and Bagamoyo regions, Tanzania, a country which hosts world-class graphite mineralisation. Drilling of the Epanko north prospect was completed in August 2015 and drilling of two new graphite discoveries, the Ulanzi and Cascade prospects, is currently underway. The Company plans to announce a Mahenge JORC compliant resource by the end of 2015.

The newly discovered Bagamoyo project in Tanzania hosts very coarse flake graphite and is being mapped and sampled in preparation for a drilling.

The company is building a skill and knowledge base to become an explorer, developer and diversified holder of graphite resources. Shareholder value will be added by:

- identifying and securing graphite projects with economic potential
- focussing on tenure that can be commercialised quickly by converting into JORC compliant resources; and
- taking these resources into production

Our focus is on establishing a JORC resource from three advanced prospects at Mahenge, whilst further adding resource upside through exploration at both Mahenge (Kituti) and Bagamoyo.
