Capital Raising

On 22 December 2015, the Company completed a placement to sophisticated investors via the issue of 335,231,825 fully paid ordinary shares at \$0.0004 each to raise \$134,093.

Exploration

Capital restraints prohibited the commencement of new exploration programs this quarter. The Board commenced a review of the Company's assets and has continued to evaluate potential investment opportunities.
