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**Renaissance Minerals Limited** (ASX: RNS) ('Renaissance') announced on 3 February 2016 that the it had secured a development partner for its Cambodian Gold Projects, in particular the Okvau Gold Deposit, through a Joint Venture with Emerald Resources NL ('Emerald'). Renaissance and Emerald have entered into a legally binding Memorandum of Agreement ('MoA') whereby Emerald may earn up to a 51% interest in Renaissance's Cambodian Gold Projects by funding a Definitive Feasibility Study ('DFS') for the development of Okvau Gold Deposit to a bankable level, an Environmental & Social Impact Assessment ('ESIA') and a 2 year exploration program of US\$3 million (A\$4.3 million). Refer to ASX Announcement dated 3 February 2016 for full details.

As part of the Joint Venture, Renaissance announced it intended to raise gross proceeds of \$3.4 million through an equity placement ("Placement"). Renaissance is pleased to confirm that it has completed the placement with the allotment of 114.8 million shares at 3 cents per share. Emerald has subscribed for 57.4 million shares in Renaissance with the remaining 57.4 million shares being placed to institutional and sophisticated investors.

Attached is an Appendix 3B in relation to the issue of shares under the Placement.

#### Information required under ASX Listing Rule 3.10.5A

Renaissance provides the information as required under ASX Listing Rule 3.10.5A as follows:

a) Dilution to existing shareholders as a result of the issue under Listing Rule 7.1A is 9%, dilution to existing shareholders as a result of the issue under Listing Rule 7.1 is 13% and the total dilution to existing shareholders as a result of the placement is 20%.

Further details of the approximate percentage of the issued capital post the 7.1A placement (45.96 million shares) held by the pre-placement security holders and new security holders are as follows:

- b) Renaissance issued shares to sophisticated and institutional investors as it was considered to be a more efficient mechanism for raising the funds for the current placement. The placement did not expose the Company to market volatility that may have been experienced over a more protracted raising process such as a pro-rata issue;
- c) No underwriting arrangements were in place for the placement; and
- d) Fees payable to the Managers are as follows:
  - 1% management fee on total funds raised; and
  - 5% placement fee on the non-Emerald portion of the placement.
