#### **Directors' Report**

The Directors of Overland Resources Limited ("Overland" or "the Company") submit their report for the half-year ended 31 December 2015.

#### **Directors**

#### **Results of Operations**

The Group's net loss after taxation attributable to the members of Overland Resources Limited for the half-year ended 31 December 2015 was \$172,408 (2014: \$299,727).

#### **Review of Operations**

During the half-year to 31 December 2015, Overland Resources Limited ("Overland" and the "Company") undertook an infill soil sampling program at the Junction Project area to follow-up on strong zinc-in-soils anomalism that was delineated in first-pass, broad-spaced sampling in late 2014. The Junction Project is approximately 30 kilometres west of the Company's Andrew, Darcy and Darin Deposits at the Yukon Base Metal Project, which host Measured, Indicated and Inferred Resources totalling 12.6 Mt at 5.3% zinc and 0.9% lead.

In 2014 soil sampling had been undertaken at Junction on just three lines spaced approximately 2,000 metres apart, with samples collected on 100 metre centres, over an area that had never previously been explored. Areas anomalous in zinc (>400 ppm) were delineated in the northern portion of all three lines, including highly anomalous assay results up to 3,990 ppm Zn.

During June and July 2015, 697 new infill soil samples were collected, on a nominal spacing of 400 metres by 100 metres. Assay results were received, confirming that extensive zinc anomalism is present, with highly elevated assays up to 4,580 ppm (0.46%) zinc and 6.1 ppm (g/T) silver returned. Four coherent zinc-in-soil anomalies were delineated, all of which extend over more than 2,000 metres of strike. The most laterally extensive of these extends over more than 4,000 metres of strike. These results compare very favourably with the size and tenor of the soil anomalies that were delineated in the early stages of exploration at the Andrew, Darcy and Darin Zinc Deposits.

Follow-up geological mapping and rock-chip sampling at these four strong zinc-in-soils anomalies was subsequently undertaken. Only minimal outcrop was evident. Some sulphidic sediments were identified and sampled. Analytical results have been returned, with only slightly elevated base metal levels evident in the samples collected. This in no way detracts from the exploration potential of these four targets. Rather this additional information, particularly that there is very limited outcrop in the area hence a strong likelihood that the primary source of the soil anomalism lies beneath shallow cover, will assist planning a suitable drilling program to further evaluate these high-priority targets.

#### 1. Corporate Information

The financial report of Overland Resources Limited ("Overland" or "the Company") for the half-year ended 31 December 2015 was authorised for issue in accordance with a resolution of the directors on 15 March 2016.

Overland Resources Limited is a public Company limited by shares incorporated and domiciled in Australia whose shares are publicly traded on the Australian Securities Exchange.

During the half year ended 31 December 2015, the principal activity was mineral exploration. The Group currently holds a base metals project in Canada.

#### 2. Basis of Preparation and Accounting Policies

#### **Basis of Preparation**

This general purpose condensed financial report for the half-year ended 31 December 2015 has been prepared in accordance with AASB 134 *Interim Financial Reporting* and the *Corporations Act 2001*. The Company is a for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

The half-year financial report does not include all notes of the type normally included within the annual financial report and therefore cannot be expected to provide as full an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of the consolidated entity as the full financial report.

It is recommended that the half-year financial report be read in conjunction with the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2015 and considered together with any public announcements made by Overland Resources Limited during the half-year ended 31 December 2015 in accordance with the continuous disclosure obligations of the ASX listing rules.

#### **Going Concern**

This report has been prepared on the going concern basis, which contemplates the continuity of normal business activity and the realisation of assets and settlement of liabilities in the normal course of business.

The Group incurred a net loss after tax for the half-year ended 31 December 2015 of \$172,408 (2014: \$299,727) and experienced net cash outflows of \$251,990 (2014: \$414,843). At 31 December 2015, the Group had net current assets of \$187,166 (June 2015: \$395,307).

The Directors have reviewed the Group's financial position and are of the opinion that the use of the going concern basis of accounting is appropriate given the Company's market capitalisation and on the basis that the Group has been successful to date in securing required funding and the Directors are of the opinion that it will continue to do so through a combination of debt and equity. The Directors are currently assessing options for additional funding.

Should the Group not be able to secure additional funds, there is significant uncertainty whether the Group will continue as a going concern and therefore whether it will realise its assets and extinguish its liabilities in the normal course of business and at the amounts stated in the financial report.

The financial report does not contain any adjustments relating to the recoverability and classification of recorded assets or to the amounts or classification of liabilities that might be necessary should the Group not be able to continue as a going concern.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year and corresponding interim reporting period.

#### **Accounting Policies**

The same accounting policies and methods of computation have been followed in this interim financial report as were applied in the most recent annual financial statements. The Group has considered the implications of new and amended Accounting Standards but determined that their application to the financial statements is either not relevant or not material.

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# INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REVIEW REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF OVERLAND RESOURCES LIMITED

#### Report on the Half-Year Financial Report

We have reviewed the accompanying half-year financial report of Overland Resources Limited, which comprises the consolidated statement of financial position as at 31 December 2015, the consolidated statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, consolidated statement of changes in equity, and consolidated statement of cash flows for the half-year ended on that date, condensed notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the directors' declaration for Overland Resources Limited (the consolidated entity). The consolidated entity comprises both Overland Resources Limited (the Company) and the entities it controlled during the half year.

#### Directors' Responsibility for the Half-Year Financial Report

The directors of Overland Resources Limited are responsible for the preparation of the half-year financial report that gives a true and fair view in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (including the Australian Accounting Interpretations) and the *Corporations Act 2001* and for such internal control as the directors determine is necessary to enable the preparation of the half-year financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

#### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the half-year financial report based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2410 Review of a Financial Report Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, we have become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the half year financial report is not in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001 including: giving a true and fair view of the consolidated entity's financial position as at 31 December 2015 and its performance for the half-year ended on that date; and complying with Accounting Standard AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting and the Corporations Regulations 2001. As the auditor of Overland Resources Limited, ASRE 2410 requires that we comply with the ethical requirements relevant to the audit of the annual financial report.

A review of a half-year financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Whilst we considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our review was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls.

Our review did not involve an analysis of the prudence of business decisions made by the directors or management.

#### Independence

#### Conclusion

Based on our review, which is not an audit, we have not become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the half-year financial report of Overland Resources Limited is not in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* including:

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the consolidated entity's financial position as at 31 December 2015 and of its performance for the half-year ended on that date; and
- (b) complying with Accounting Standard AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting and Corporations Regulations 2001.

Material Uncertainty Regarding Going Concern

Without qualification to the conclusion expressed above, attention is drawn to the following matters:

As referred to in note 2 to the half year financial report, the financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis. As at 31 December 2015, the consolidated entity had cash and cash equivalents of \$233,379 and had incurred a loss after tax of \$172,408 for the half year then ended.

The ability of the Group to continue as a going concern and meet its administration and exploration commitments is dependent upon the Group raising further working capital or commencing profitable operations. In the event that the consolidated entity is unable to raise additional funding as described in note 2 to the financial report, and based on the current commitments and planned expenditure, there is a material uncertainty whether the consolidated entity will continue as a going concern, and therefore whether it will realise its assets and extinguish its liabilities in the normal course of business and at the amounts stated in the financial report.

The financial report does not include any adjustments relating to recoverability and classification of recorded assets amounts, or to the amounts and classification of liabilities, that might be necessary should the consolidated entity not continue as a going concern.
