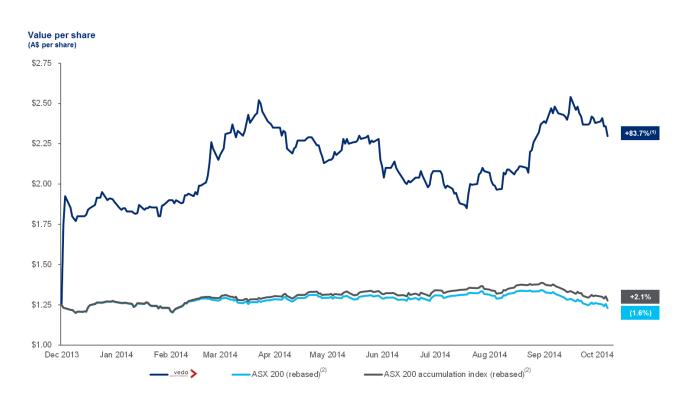

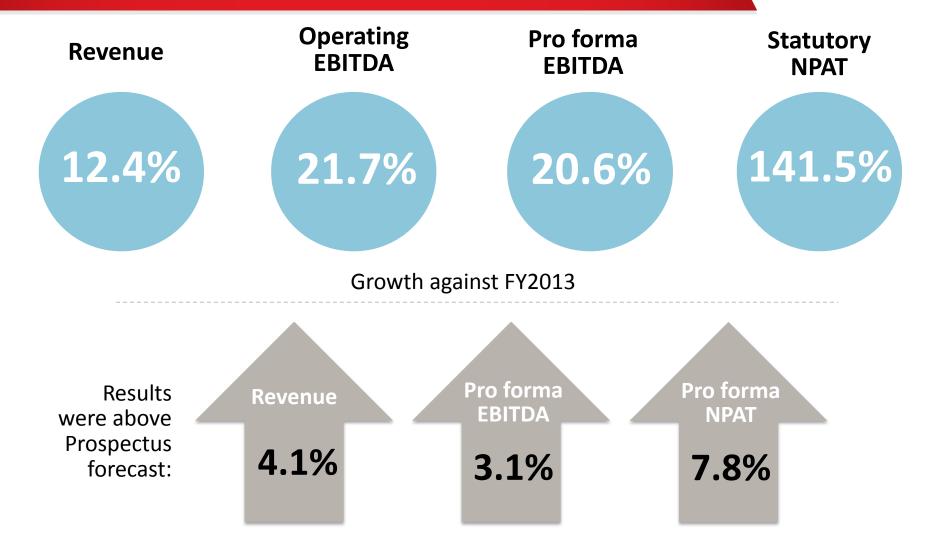

Dividend

- Expected that dividends will be unfranked until at least FY2016
- Cash flow generation expected to remain strong, allowing:
 - selective acquisitions
 - dividend payout ratio between 50 and 70 percent of statutory NPAT
- Future growth expectations not impacted by higher dividend payout ratio
- No existing dividend reinvestment plan and no current proposal to implement such a plan.

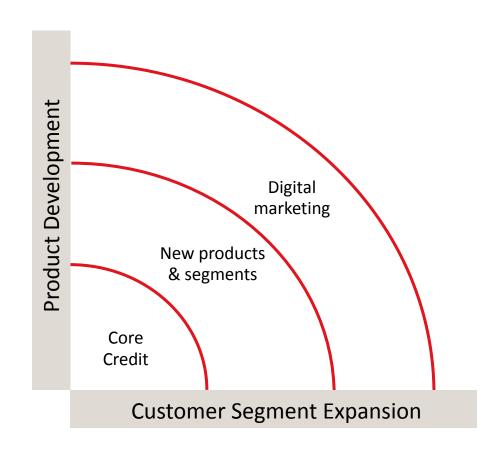

FY2014 remuneration approach served Veda well during emergence from private equity ownership

- **Fixed remuneration**: set by reference to market benchmark
- **STI payments**: focused on driving operational performance
 - SLT: based on Group performance with at target performance set above Prospectus forecast
 - 70%: based on increasing revenue 10% and EBITDA 17% over prior year
 - 30%: based on increasing net cash flow from operating activities less capex
 - Acceleration of up to 200 per cent possible for significant outperformance
 - Actual achievement: revenue 12.4% and EBITDA 20.6%
- Senior staff rewarded with management performance shares and options for driving performance culminating in IPO. Small number of staff awarded cash bonus for significant contribution to delivering the IPO

Remuneration outcomes aligned staff and shareholders' interests during this transition year



Going forward (FY 2015) a revised approach aligns staff and shareholder interests in a listed company environment and fulfils Prospectus commitment

- Fixed remuneration: benchmarked to market median
- Revised short term incentive scheme for Senior Leadership Team
 - At Target performance set as a % of fixed remuneration
 - Performance determined by revenue; EBITDA; NPAT; and cash flow from operations and investment
 - At Target performance disclosed retrospectively
 - 30% in Deferred Share Rights (DSR) vesting over 3 years, 70% in cash
 - Acceleration of up to 175% of cash component possible for above At Target performance
- Long term incentive scheme aligns interests of eligible staff and shareholders over the long haul
 - Options as a per cent of fixed remuneration, allocated based on performance and potential
 - Vest if hurdle based on TSR performance relative to the ASX200 met or exceeded
 - No re-testing of hurdle; options exercisable in equal tranches at 3 and 4 years
- Early vesting of DSRs and options possible only in limited circumstances
- Cannot be hedged; clawback provisions exist

Agenda Item 4 - Approval of potential termination benefits to Relevant Executives



Resolution seeks shareholder approval for the provision of certain benefits on termination of employment to current or future Relevant Executives

- The legislation is complex and, at times, unclear
- The Corporations Act restricts benefits which can be given to Relevant Executives on ceasing to hold a managerial or executive office
- Under the Act, above one times base salary, a Company may only give a Relevant Executive a benefit in connection with their cessation of managerial or executive office if it is approved by shareholders or an exception applies

Agenda Item 4 - Approval of potential termination benefits to Relevant Executives



Framework of approval:

- Approval does not guarantee that Relevant Executives will receive termination benefits
- Allows Board and its Committees discretion to determine the most appropriate termination package in accordance with a relevant employment agreement, within the confines of this approval.

If shareholder approval is obtained:

- The Board intends that the only termination benefits which will be provided to a Relevant Executive in connection with their ceasing to hold a managerial or executive office, will be statutory benefits such as accrued annual leave and long service leave and those termination benefits which are covered by this approval.
- By giving their approval, shareholders will provide Veda with the ability to ensure its compliance with the Act and to meet expectations in relation to best practice corporate governance.

Agenda Item 4 - Approval of potential termination benefits to Relevant Executives



To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following as an ordinary resolution of the Company:

That approval be given for all purposes, including sections 200B and 200E of the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth), for the giving of all benefits to current or future Key Management Personnel (KMP) of the Company or persons who hold a managerial or executive office in the Company or a related body corporate, in connection with the person ceasing to hold an office or position of employment in the Company or a related body corporate, as set out in the Explanatory Memorandum which forms part of the Notice of Meeting
