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Under the conditions of Freelancer's listing on the ASX in November 2013, Freelancer is required to provide quarterly cash flow reports to the ASX. This unaudited cash flow report is for the quarter ended 31 March 2015.

At 31 March 2015, Freelancer had cash balances of \$22.1 million. Net cash inflows for the quarter were \$0.8 million, comprising:

- net operating cash inflows of \$1 million;
- net investing cash outflows of \$0.2 million; and
- net financing cash inflows of \$0.03 million resulting from the repayment of Employee Share Plan (ESP) loans provided by the Company to finance the original purchase of vested ESP shares.

ESP shares are therefore not considered issued to participants until the corresponding loans are repaid, at which time the Company recognises an increase in the issued capital and increase in cash.
