FURTHER ENVIROSUITE 2.0 CONTRACT WINS

Pacific Environment Limited ("The Company") is pleased to provide a market update on recent contract wins for its technology, EnviroSuite 2.0.

The applicability of EnviroSuite modules continues to relate to multiple industry sectors. Recent newly contracted clients include:

- Ports Authority of NSW – Monitoring module
- Yancoal – Regulatory Reporting module
- Royal Darwin Hospital – Monitoring module
- Centennial Coal – Monitoring, Modelling, Complaints Management modules

These new client contracts are for an initial period of up to one year with the option to extend. The total size of these first year contracts is approximately \$120,000.

In addition, the following clients have re-signed for EnviroSuite for a period of between one and three years:

- BHP Billiton Iron Ore – Monitoring, Modelling, and Complaints Management modules
- Pacific Aluminium – Modelling module
- Queensland Alumina Limited – Forecast, Modelling, Regulatory Reporting, and Complaints Management modules

The total size of these re-signings is over \$500,000. These signings confirm the strength of the Company's relationship with major multi-nationals. It also confirms the value that EnviroSuite is providing to these clients. The Company notes that the average contract size of \$60,000 to \$80,000 per annum for the bigger client sites taking three or more modules is continuing.

Furthermore, the Company is pleased to advise that all remaining EnviroSuite 2.0 modules are being finalised for commercial release by July 2015 and the company will then enter a new growth phase as a global Environmental Technology business. With these developments the Company is now applying increasing focus on the export market and is currently working on new business opportunities in Indonesia, Thailand, Malaysia, Columbia and the USA.
