### JUNE QUARTER 2015 APPENDIX 4C

**31 July 2015, Adelaide**: LBT Innovations Ltd (ASX: LBT) announces its fourth quarter cash flow report for the year ending 30 June 2015.

#### Highlights:

- Cash at the end of June 2015 \$1.82 million (a increase of \$0.55 million on the balance at the end of March 2015).
- Receipt of \$71,500 from BioSA for the early stage development of LBT's pioneering wound management technology Woundvue.
- Receipt of royalty income under the agreement with bioMérieux. The receipt of \$US150,000 represents the first quarter of the minimum royalty payments in the 2015 calendar year.
- Receipt of unsecured loan proceeds from Directors and Officers of LBT, amounting to \$1m, repayable upon receipt
  of the expected 2015 R&D claim refund.

Other cash flows for the quarter related to normal operating activities.

LBT is engaged in ongoing disengagement discussions with bioMérieux. While no conclusion has yet been reached those discussions are at an advanced stage.

LBT also has a third product in development, Woundvue™, a proposed automation solution to assist in the management of chronic wounds.

Based on LBT's innovative intelligent image interpretative platform, APAS specifically addresses the automated imaging, analysis and interpretation of culture plates following incubation. LBT has entered into a Joint Venture with Hettich AG Switzerland to drive the commercial development and global distribution of APAS instrumentation and software products.
