Chairman's Key Points

Half Year - Profit, net assets and franking credit levels enhanced

The six months saw three major events taking place. In the first place our profits were boosted by the enhancement of our future tax benefit. Secondly, this arose because our long term investment portfolio recorded one of its best performances for years - with a gain of some \$2.6 million in market value surplus. This was helped by a major valuation gain in our 5.1% **Fiducian Group Limited** of some \$1.5 million. Also our 2% shareholding in **Coffey International Limited** becoming the subject of a takeover offer. Thirdly we can report that **franking credit levels** have been maintained and London City has the ability to pay fully franked dividends at the current rate for at least the next three years.

Comfortable Operating Results

This latest six months produced a comfortable profit after tax of \$525,000 (\$86,000 in 2014). The recognition of future tax benefit was a key feature of this operating result.

Board Change

On 9 February Mr Rob Chenery retired as a Director of the group. His place was taken by Mr David G Butel who we knew closely as Managing Director of CCI Holdings Limited. David is presently a Vice President of Bureau Veritas Minerals. His executive skills and resources experience will be particularly positive to the group. We welcome Mr Butel to the Board.

Net Assets – 30.2 cents at December – now 28.4 cents.

London City's net assets stood at \$6.5 million at balance date, a major increase on the June figures of \$4.4 million, despite the payment of a One cent fully franked dividend in October.

Other

Furthermore, through associated company Imperial Pacific Fund Managers Pty Limited London City is participating in a group of parties seeking to take action to recover funds from the demise of Penrice Soda. London City is not keen to expend more funds on Penrice. Imperial Pacific Fund Managers has acquired for a nominal sum a series of Penrice debts amounting to \$5 million, some unsecured and some secured. Imperial Pacific Fund Managers intends to work in with others, including London City to expedite matters, with no cost to London City. As our group involvement has been elevated to the status of a creditor, rather than a shareholder, the Liquidator, McGrath Nicol, might now tell us what is happening.

Outlook

Directors have noticed the current plunging stock-market. While our long term investments are experiencing some of this downturn the Board is comfortable that London City is sitting on \$2.2 million of cash funds – 10 cents a share. These will protect some downside but more importantly be available for increasing the share portfolio at attractive price levels.

Statutory Directors' Report For the Half Year ended 31 December 2015

The Directors of London City Equities Limited submit their report together with the consolidated financial report for the above period.

Directors

The names of Directors who held office at any time during the half year and up to the date of this report are Mr Peter E.J. Murray, Mr Rob Chenery and Mr David A. Sutherland. Since the end of the period Mr Chenery retired on 9 February 2016 and the Board appointed Mr David G Butel a Director on the sane date..

Review of Operations - Overview

The share portfolio rose in value significantly through the six months. The 5% shareholding in financial services house Fiducian Group Limited rose some \$1.5 million. Our 2% shareholding in Coffey International was subjected to a takeover from a US group and this enhanced the portfolio by \$1.0 million. Again time was spent on options available regarding Penrice and on specific potential investments. Following the receipt of the Coffey takeover proceeds London City's cash on deposit with its bankers has risen to \$2.2 million, or 10 Cents a share.

Review of Operations - Results

London City recorded a profit of \$525,000, of which a tax credit of \$500,000 was a key component. This was justified by the re-shaped positive investment portfolios arising from the company's cautious investment policy.

Review of Operations – Dividend

London City paid a One Cent fully franked dividend to shareholders in October. The Dividend Reinvestment Plan has been suspended and did not apply to this payout. London City does not pay interim dividends.

Events occurring after Balance Date

No material event has taken place since balance date, other than the receipt of the proceeds arising out of the takeover of 2% owned Coffey International Limited, namely \$1.9 million.

Auditor's Independence Declaration

The auditors, Cutcher & Neale, have provided us with the enclosed declaration of independence.

Note 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Preparation

This general purpose half-year condensed financial report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standard AASB 134 Interim Financial Reporting and the Corporations Act 2001 an other applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements

This interim financial report does not include all the notes of the type normally included in an annufinancial report. It is recommended that this report should be read in conjunction with the 2015 Annua Report and public announcements made by the company during the half year, in accordance with the continuous disclosure obligations arising out of the Corporations Act 2001

This half-year financial report also has been prepared in accordance with AIFRS (Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards).

The financial statements are prepared using the valuation methods described below for holdings of securities. All other items have been treated in accordance with the historical cost convention

The accounting policies adopted have been consistently applied by the company and are consistent wi those applied in the 30 June 2015 Annual Report. On 17 June and on 25 July 2011 London City Equities Limited was granted judgment in its favour by the Federal Court of Australia to access certain records and documents of Penrice Soda Holdings Limited ("Penrice"). This followed legal action by London City to assess the conduct of the directors of Penrice and the provision of information at the time London City made investments in Penrice. Th investigatory process may ultimately lead to legal action being taken against the directors of Penrice or that company itself, for the recovery of substantial investment losses. There is insufficien information at the date of this report to estimate any future benefit that may arise. Directors note that Penrice has since been placed into liquidation

Independent Review Report to the Members of London City Equities Limited

Scope

The financial report and director's responsibility

We have reviewed the financial report of London City Equities Limited for the half year ended 31 December 2015 as set out on pages 3 to 10. The financial report comprises the statement of financial position, income statement, cash flow statement, statement of changes in equity, accompanying note to the financial statements, and the directors' declaration for London City Equities Limited for the half year ended 31 December 2015.

The company's directors are responsible for preparing a financial report that gives a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the company, and that complies with Accounting Standards AASB 134 "Interim Financial Reporting", in accordance with the corporations Act 2001. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Review Approach

We conducted and independent review of the financial report in order to make a statement about it to the members of the company and in order for the company to lodge the financial report with the Australian Stock Exchange and the Australian Securities and Investments Commission.

Our Review was conducted in accordance with Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2410: "Review of an Interim Financial Report Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity", in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, anything has come to our attention that would indicate that the financial report is not presented fairly in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001, Accounting Standard AASB 134: "Interim Financial Reporting" and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia, so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the company's financial position, and of its performance as measured by the results of its operations and its cash flows. In addition, ASRE 2410 requires compliance with the ethical requirements relevant to the audit of the annual financial report.
