Directors' Report

The Directors of Techniche Limited ("the Company") submit herewith the financial report for the half-year ended 31 December 2015 of the Consolidated Entity, being the Company and its controlled entities.

In order to comply with the provisions of the Corporations Act 2001, the Directors report as follows:

Directors

The names of the Directors of Techniche Limited who held office at any time during or since the end of the half year are:

Karl Phillip Jacoby (Chairman) Bruce Ronald Scott Andrew Campbell

Principal Activities

The principal activity of the Consolidated Entity during the half year was investing in and managing technology companies.

There has been no change in the business activities of investing in, providing funding to, and providing management assistance to wholly owned entities.

Review of Operations

Consolidated Entity

The Board of Techniche Limited is pleased to report a consolidated Net Profit After Tax (NPAT) from continuing operations of \$787,641, compared to a NPAT of \$1,504,862 for the corresponding period last year. The net profit after tax from operations (excluding foreign exchange gains) was \$677,674 [2014: 1,231,479].

Consolidated revenue from ordinary activities for the period was \$4,607,919 [2014: \$4,503,669]. Net assets have decreased to \$16,244,057 from \$16,447,472 at the end of the last annual reporting period (30 June 2015) reflecting NPAT for the period and the payment of a dividend of \$1,095,603 [2014: \$491,903].

The Company retained cash reserves of \$3,432,082 at 31 December 2015 [30 June 2014: \$4,313,931]. This is after the payment of the annual dividend on 30 September 2015. Cash generation was limited by the continued unwinding of unearned income that was recorded at 30 June 2015 as projects associated with the rebuild of eMaintenance in Urgent are concluded.

This is a reasonable outcome with strong results from ERST and Statseeker being offset by a lower result from Urgent The Company continues to remind shareholders that its revenue and profits are impacted by the size and timing of some orders and major currency fluctuations.

The Techniche Strategy

Techniche is a global technology investment company whose purpose is to provide long term growth in earnings per share and dividends to shareholders in order to attract more capital to invest in and grow profitable businesses.

We employ an active management approach by working with and incentivising management to successfully grow the businesses organically and via strategic acquisitions.

Our target businesses are profitable, provide business to business solutions, with business critical applications, a high level of recurring revenue, which have reached a ceiling in their business cycle, and require possibly new management, capital and/or new strategies to grow.

European Retail Systems Technology GmbH ("ERST")

ERST is managed by Thomas Huben, the CEO, and a small management team and provides managed services to clients such as BP. ERST Technology develops specific applications and provides ongoing managed services for the transfer of business critical data. Global businesses use our services to transfer large amounts of transactional and time sensitive data from over 10,000 sites across Europe. https://www.erst-technology.com/

Directors' Report

ERST's revenue in Euros was up by approx. 10% and the profit contribution was up by approx. 18% on the prior year. This is a result of an improvement in the trading environment although it is expected that the second half will be slightly weaker.

The Board and the new CEO of Techniche are working with the ERST CEO on business development activities and to look for complementary bolt-on acquisitions.

Urgent Technology Limited group ("Urgent")

Urgent Technology Ltd provides a highly configurable Facilities Management infrastructure and field service management software to over 30,000 sites worldwide. These sites are typically managed and maintained by over 1 million third party contractors, with the software providing tight financial and regulatory control, while improving performance and encouraging behavior through industry best practice. http://www.urgtech.com/

The Urgent Group is managed by Jesse Klebba, who was recently appointed as Urgent's CEO, with operations in the UK, USA and Australia. In local currencies, the UK has seen a decrease in both revenues and profit contribution when compared with the prior year. This is primarily due to the completion of the funded element of the redevelopment of eMaintenance Plus, the timing of some contracts, substantial one off costs relating to the management restructure and further product development costs relating to the continued development of eMaintenance Plus. In the US and Australia profits were down, albeit from a small base.

Following a recent restructure of the organisation, Jesse Klebba was appointed as CEO and two new sales staff were appointed in the UK and USA. With the rebuild of eMaintenance having been successfully rolled out to a number of existing customers with very positive feedback, the enhanced focus on sales activities is expected to result in improvements to these businesses in the next financial year.

The Board are continuing to look at a number of complementary bolt-on businesses.

Statseeker

Statseeker was founded in 1996, incorporated in 1998, and is a privately held company with corporate offices in Brisbane, Australia and San Diego, California. Statseeker is a global provider delivering innovative network monitoring solutions for the IT enterprise and OT industrial market space. With active deployments in over 22 countries and many Fortune 100 firms, Statseeker monitors millions of interfaces in real-time. These companies trust Statseeker to deliver big data, make decisions and take action. Statseeker allows them to identify critical issues, isolate what needs work with confidence and fix problems instantly. Further information on Statseeker can be read at www.statseeker.com.

While Statseeker's comparative half year revenues was up 15%, revenues from new business sales were up approx. 46%. This reflects the increased success of the new sales team and a growing depth of recurring revenues. Although Statseeker had a relatively benign December, new business revenues stand at 83% of the total new business recorded for the prior full financial year to 30 June 2015. Operating costs for the period were carefully managed and increased by less than 2%, reflecting the improving trading performance of the business.

Techniche's share of Statseeker's profit contribution (Refer 3 (a)) was \$213,483, which was a significant improvement result to the same period last year [\$35,835]. The overall contribution to the company, including the recovery of Techniche management costs and interest charges (Refer Note 2(b)) was \$310,983, which compares favorably with the prior year result of \$127,086.

Statseeker remains an exciting opportunity with substantial prospects. The restructure of the management team and the appointment of experienced sales people in the US and Australia, as well as the development of a value added reseller program, has resulted in favorable sales growth. Statseeker will continue to build their sales and distribution capability and this is expected to reflect in an increase to their pipeline of prospects and ultimately increases in new business sales and profits.

Group Management and Administration

Techniche has appointed David Nelson to the position of Chief Executive Officer with effect from 1 February 2016. David joins the company after previous roles as Managing Director of Divergent Capital Proprietary Limited, a seed-stage venture capital investor, and CEO of Inovia Holdings. Furthermore, after the appointment of Graham Haeusler of Milestone Capital, to assist with Mergers & Acquisitions, there has been a significant improvement in potential deal flow for the company.

Head office recorded a small improvement in after tax profit due to interest saved from internal loans from ERST that were repaid in full as at June 2015. Management and licence fee revenues from group investments were steady as were operating costs incurred in the Head Office.

Techniche Limited is a public company incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The interim financial statements were authorised for issue on 29 February 2016 by the directors of the Company.

Note 1. Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of preparation

These general purpose interim financial statements for half-year reporting period ended 31 December 2015 have been prepared in accordance with requirements of the Corporations Act 2001 and Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134: Interim Financial Reporting. The Group is a for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

This interim financial report is intended to provide users with an update on the latest annual financial statements of Techniche Limited and its controlled entities (referred to as the "consolidated group" or "group"). As such, it does not contain information that represents relatively insignificant changes occurring during the half-year within the Group. It is therefore recommended that this financial report be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements of the Group for the year ended 30 June 2015, together with any public announcements made during the following half-year.

Report on the Half-Year Financial Report

We have reviewed the accompanying half-year financial report of Techiche Limited ('the Company') and its controlled entities ('the Consolidated Entity') which comprises the consolidated statement of financial position as at 31 December 2015, the consolidated statement of comprehensive income, consolidated statement of changes in equity, consolidated statement of cash flows for the half-year ended on that date, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information and the directors' declaration. We conducted our review in accordance with Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2410: Review of an Interim Financial Report Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, we have become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the financial report is not in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001 including giving a true and fair view of consolidated entity's financial position as at 31 December 2015 and its performance for the half-year ended on that date, and complying with Accounting Standard AASB 134: Interim Financial Reporting and the Corporations Regulations 2001. A review of a half-year financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and review procedures. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.
