Notes Attached to this Report

Market conditions during the June quarter remained challenging with buyer enthusiasm continuing to stagnate during the period. The Board recognised recent global and domestic events with the potential to affect economic outcomes, such as The Brexit and the Federal Election would have likely contributed to the continued weakness in buyer enthusiasm. While the board remained committed to its strategy regarding the joint venture project, a review is necessary in light of these events and ongoing adverse market conditions.

The Board continues to pursue its preferred strategy of multiple dwelling developments incorporating steel framing construction with third parties including large developers amenable to a joint venture approach. The market will be advised if any progress is made and after discussions with the ASX. The board retains a favourable stance toward a capital raise where necessary to alleviate the operational constraints faced by the company due to its financial position and to pursue warranted opportunities that meet the Board's prime agenda of creating shareholder value.

In the meantime while the company continues to operate with support from its major shareholders and financiers to assist in the deployment of its current strategy being smaller sized ventures incorporating steel framing construction, shareholders can be reassured the Board is working tirelessly to identify an opportunity worth pursuing and fits within the ASX listing rules, adheres to the Company's reward to risk ratio requirements and doesn't result in the steep dilution of shareholder value that has become commonplace among ASX listed companies operating under financial constraint.

Importantly, JV Global Ltd continues to be one of the least expensive run companies on the ASX, with minimal directors' fees, totalling some combined \$73,000 per annum. This austerity will continue until the Directors and Management are able to be adequately rewarded for their time, and for the ever increasing liabilities, and responsibilities, attached to being directors of a public company imposed by Politicians, ASX and the ASIC.

In the meantime, the Company has sufficient liquid and current assets to convert to cash, and access to funds if required, to meet its commitments, as and when required for the next 2 quarters.
