Quarterly Activities Statement – March 2016

Summary

- The Company held \$ 806,000 cash at the end of the quarter.
- New projects are being actively pursued that will lead to enhance shareholder value.

Review of Operations

Quarterly exploration and evaluation costs amounted to \$21,000 relating to our Spanish and Paralana projects. There were minimal exploration activities undertaken on the Company's sole Tasmanian oil & gas tenement. The Company had ongoing administration costs of \$67,000 primarily relating to reporting & compliance, due diligence review and office costs during the quarter. The Company held \$806,000 cash at the end of the quarter.

In December 2015, the Company announced a share placement and a fully underwritten rights issue, at a price of \$0.003 per share, to be undertaken by Taylor Collison to raise a total sum of \$773,633 before costs. The rights issue was successfully completed in January 2016. The monies raised will be applied to working capital and new projects and/or joint ventures.

The Company is continuing to explore ways of containing costs whilst reviewing new projects that will be accretive to shareholder value.
