# Youth Foundation 3081 and Parkville College.

Our youth philanthropy program, Youth Foundation, continues to thrive both in West Heidelberg and Parkville College. Our facilitator Lis has had the joy of working with some inspiring students who have come up with projects to improve their local community. A snapshot of these projects includes:

- Olympic Village Primary School Girls Group for young girls to receive homework support, make connections and have fun. Run by a local mum the group has been meeting on a weekly basis.
- The Himilo group have received a grant to run a regular futsal training over the winter months for young Somali boys.
- Students from Olympic Village Primary School have completed a series of student-designed totem poles for the new school sand pit with interactive playful elements embedded within. This was developed over eight morning sessions with an artist, and the project is awaiting installation by the school.

Fairfield Primary School celebrated it's year of their Art4All Festival, and we were there to join the festivities. The weekend-long fundraiser features a gala night to celebrate local artists followed by family day with loads of craft activities to keep the kids entertained for hours.
