### Review of Results and Operations

#### Operational Review

As outlined in our last Annual Report, the Australian Telco market and environment remains challenging. However, given our strong connection with our loyal customer base and throughout the individual markets we have remained committed to, we believe we still have opportunities to generate strong revenues and produce value for all our committed stakeholder base. We remain convinced we can add value technically and strategically for both our customers and the communities we serve, and therefore effectively employ our shareholder capital.

Over the last 12 months, the Group has been able to successfully implement our new Strategy and Operating Model to effectively operate in this new changed Telco environment. We are continuing to produce solid value for our shareholders and while we still envisage some further loss of revenues and margin from a number of our traditional lines of business, we expect to progressively replace these revenues given we continue to attract new business and support from key organisations across all of our markets.

The Group has positioned itself to be more agile and better able to respond to the industry changes we are facing, by remaining committed to our new structure, our priorities, and to focus on our strengths of delivering strategic advantages to our customer base.

Moving forward, the Group will continue to execute on its forward strategy, focusing on the following key priorities:

- Product development in the strategic areas of Cloud, Security and Networking.
- Refocusing on the communities the Group serves, increasing our participation in and contribution to these communities.
- Lead additional strategic conversations with partners to deliver strong outcomes for the Groups regions.
- Continue the reinvigoration of the Groups processes and internal business systems to address the needs of our customers and to deliver a great customer experience.
- Continue to deliver improvements in business productivity and efficiency.
- Management and control over the Groups cost base.
- Leveraging technology investment to deliver innovative and relevant product capabilities to the market.

By focusing on the above the Group will be able to capitalise on our strengths and competitive advantage and achieve long term success in our chosen markets.

## **Business Half Year Results**

The Group generated a net profit before tax of \$926,422 and a net profit after tax of \$625,258 for the half year ended 31 December 2019. This compares to a net loss before tax of \$1,660,242 and a net loss after tax of \$1,841,224 in the prior year. The prior year results included one-off, non-cash impairment charges of \$2,352,967 made against goodwill and other non-current assets.

Earnings before interest, tax depreciation and amortisation ("EBITDA") for the period was \$2,325,164, representing an increase of \$536,178 (30%) compared to the prior year (2018: \$1,788,986). The prior year EBITDA results include the write back of one-off, non-cash impairment charges of \$2,352,967.

The EBITDA for the half year ended 31 December 2019 includes the impact from the adoption of AASB 16 – Leases which has positively impacted EBITDA by \$249,299. The Group has elected to adopt AASB 16 retrospectively with the cumulative effect of applying AASB 16 recognised at 1 July 2019 and as such the prior year comparative numbers have not been restated.

Total Group's revenue decreased by 10.8% over the corresponding prior period to \$16,880,914 (2018: \$18,929,059). This decrease is substantially due to the loss of traditional fixed voice, traditional data and mobile revenues. Some of the loss in revenue has been offset with gains in cloud-based and other business service revenue.

At the end of the period, the net assets of the Group were \$8,118,650 (30 June 2019: \$8,050,801). The Group continued to generate strong cash flows from operating activities and maintained a sound working capital with current assets exceeding current liabilities by \$727,839 (30 June 2019: \$848,358).

## NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL REPORT

### Note 1: Summary of significant accounting policies

#### Basis of Preparation

These general purpose interim financial statements for the half-year reporting period ended 31 December 2019 have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001* and Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134: Interim Financial Reporting. The Group is a for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

This interim financial report is intended to provide users with an update of the latest annual financial statements of Bendigo Telco Limited. As such, it does not contain information that represents relatively insignificant changes during the half-year within the Group. It is therefore recommended that this financial report be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2019, together with any public announcements made during the following half-year.

These interim financial statements were authorised for issue on 26 February 2020.

#### Accounting Policies

The same accounting policies and methods of computation have been followed in this interim financial report as were applied in the most recent annual financial statements except for those as described in New and Amended Standards Adopted by the Group.

#### New and Amended Standards Adopted by the Group

The Group has considered the implications of new or amended Accounting Standards which have become applicable for the current financial reporting period. The Group had to change its accounting policies and make adjustments as a result of adopting the following Standard:

#### AASB 16: Leases

##### The Group as lessee.

At inception of a contract, the Group assesses if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability are recognised by the Group where the Group is a lessee. However, all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (ie a lease with a remaining lease term of 12 months or less) and leases of low-value assets are recognised as an operating expenses on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

Initially the lease liability is measured at the present value of the lease payments still to be paid at the commencement date. The lease payments are discounted at the interest rate implicit in the lease. If this rate cannot be readily determined, the Group uses the incremental borrowing rate.

Lease payments included in the measurement of the lease liability are as follows:

- fixed lease payments less any lease incentives;
- variable lease payments that depend on an index or rate, initially measured using only the most current known index or rate;
- lease payments under extension options, if the lessee is reasonably certain to exercise the options.

**AASB 16: Leases (continued)**

The Group is exposed to potential future increases in variable lease payments based on an index or rate, which are not included in the lease liability until they take effect. When adjustments to lease payments, based on an index or rate take effect, the lease liability is remeasured and adjusted against the right of use asset.

The right-of-use assets comprise the initial measurement of the corresponding lease liability, any lease payments made at or before the commencement date and any initial direct costs. The subsequent measurement of the right-of-use assets is at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Right-of-use assets are depreciated over the lease term or useful life of the underlying asset, whichever is the shortest.

Where a lease transfers ownership of the underlying asset or the cost of the right-of-use asset reflects that the Group anticipates to exercise a purchase option, the specific asset is depreciated over the useful life of the underlying asset.

## Initial Application of AASB 16: Leases

The Group has adopted AASB 16: Leases retrospectively with the cumulative effect of initially applying AASB 16 recognised at 1 July 2019. In accordance with AASB 16 the comparatives for the 2018 reporting period have not been restated.

The Group has recognised a lease liability and right-of-use asset for all leases (with the exception of short-term and low-value leases) recognised as operating leases under AASB 117: Leases where the Group is the lessee.

Lease liabilities are measured at the present value of the remaining lease payments. The Group's incremental borrowing rate as at 1 July 2019 was used to discount the lease payments.

The right-of-use assets have been measured and recognised in the Statement of Financial Position as at 1 July 2019 by taking into consideration the lease liability and the prepaid and accrued lease payments previously recognised as at 1 July 2019 (that are related to the lease).

*The following practical expedients have been used by the Group in applying AASB 16 for the first time:*

- for a portfolio of leases that have reasonably similar characteristics, a single discount rate has been applied.
- leases that have a remaining lease term of less than 12 months as at 1 July 2019 have been accounted for in the same way as short-term leases.
- the use of hindsight to determine lease terms on contracts that have options to extend or terminate.
- applying AASB 16 to leases previously identified as leases under AASB 117: Leases and Interpretation 4: Determining whether an arrangement contains a lease without reassessing whether they are, or contain, a lease at the date of initial application.
- not applying AASB 16 to leases previously not identified as containing a lease under AASB 117 and Interpretation 4.

#### **Note 4: Operating Segments**

The Group has adopted AASB 8 Operating Segments from 1 July 2009 whereby segment information is presented using a 'management approach'; that is, segment information is provided on the same basis as information used for internal reporting purposes by the chief operating decision maker (the board that makes strategic decisions).

Bendigo Telco Limited operates under one segment, however, the breakdown of revenue has been disclosed by product set. Goodwill has been reallocated accordingly to cash generating units which cannot be greater than a segment as defined in AASB 8 Operating Segments. On reallocation, no additional goodwill impairment was required.

#### **Major customers**

During the half year ended 31 December 2019 approximately 34.2% (2018: 31.8%) of Bendigo Telco's external revenue was derived from sales to one customer (2018: one customer).

This dividend will be recognised in shareholders' equity in the next interim financial statements.

## Note 7: Leases

The Group's lease portfolio includes buildings, equipment and vehicles. Building leases have an average of 9 years as their lease term, while equipment and vehicles have an average of 4 years.

The options to extend are contained in several of the property leases of the Group. These clauses provide the Group opportunities to manage leases in order to align with its strategies. All of the extension options are only exercisable by the Group. The extension options which management were reasonably certain to be exercised have been included in the calculation of the lease liability.

### Report on the Half-Year Financial Report

We conducted our review in accordance with Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2410: *Review of a Financial Report Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity*, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, we have become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the half-year financial report is not in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* including: giving a true and fair view of Bendigo Telco Ltd's financial position as at 31 December 2019 and its performance for the half-year ended on that date; and complying with Accounting Standard AASB 134: *Interim Financial Reporting* and the *Corporations Regulations 2001*. As the auditor of Bendigo Telco Ltd, ASRE 2410 requires that we comply with the ethical requirements relevant to the audit of the annual financial report.

A review of a half-year financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and review procedures.
