The impairment was recorded in "Impairment losses" within the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. The impairment relates to the consumer and small business market segment portion of the customer list. Diminished revenues, lower margins, and higher cost-to-serve has led to a change in strategy for this market segment from growth to protect. It is projected that the revenues and margins from this market segment will continue to decrease into the future.

Impairment of Intangible – Bendigo Bank Telco Customer List

Bendigo Bank Telco was purchased March 2018. As at 30 June 2020, the carrying value of our assets in the Bendigo Bank Telco CGUs was assessed for impairment. The recoverable amount of these CGUs were determined using a 'value in use' calculation and it was lower than their carrying value. As a result a \$417,620 impairment loss was recognised in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income, writing down the intangible to \$70,083. The impairment was recorded in "Impairment losses" within the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. The impairment relates to the consumer and small business market segment portion of the customer list. Diminished revenues, lower margins, and higher cost-to-serve has led to a change in strategy for this market segment from growth to protect. It is projected that the revenues and margins from this market segment will continue to decrease into the future.

- 1. For announcement to the market The percentage changes referred to in this section are the percentage changes calculated by comparing the current period's figures with those for the previous corresponding period. Do not show percentage changes if the change is from profit to loss or loss to profit, but still show the amount of the change up or down. If changes in accounting policies or procedures have had a material effect on reported figures, do not show either directional or percentage changes in profits.
