- 3) Inflation Customers are unwilling to spend.
- 4) Climate change floods and continuous rain in Malaysia have caused difficulties in fertilization, etc. resulting in low yield and customers not able to afford
- 5) Labour shortage which has caused many problems to the agriculture sector.

The Directors of the Group will continue to closely monitor the situation and respond proactively to mitigate its impact.
