This fund update was first made publicly available on 25 October 2019.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Smartshares Australian Top 20 ETF has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Smartshares Australian Top 20 ETF invests in financial products listed on the Australian Securities Exchange and is designed to track the return on the S&P/ASX 20 Index.

Total value of the fund: \$137,013,949

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Smartshares Australian Top 20 ETF¹



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

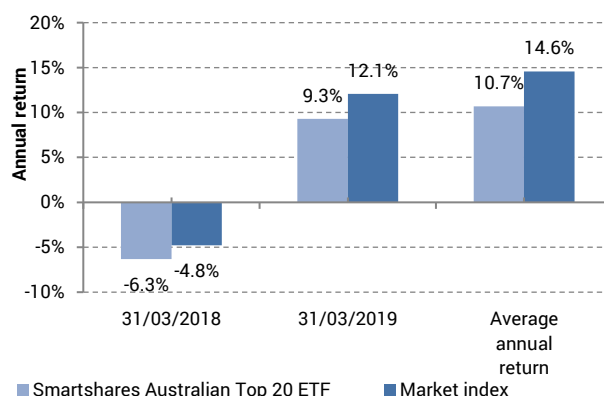

How has the fund performed?

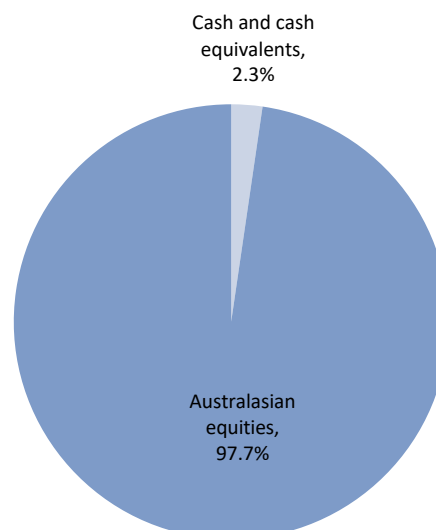
Example of how this applies to an investor

Tara had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Tara received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$939 (that is 9.39% of her initial \$10,000). This gives Tara a total return after tax of \$939 for the year.
